

TECHNICAL INFORMATION HEATER CONTROL VALVE REBUILDING BY JIM GEARY

Stop that leak into the passenger compartment. Check your valve before sending it for repair. Close the valve and blow through one of the hose pipes on the valve. If there is a lot of air, the valve is not rebuildable. With the valve closed there should be no, or very little, air passing through. The external seal for the plunger is replaced and made to look new again. These valves are no longer available from any source. If you have any extra valves, Jim will do some rebuiding and trading to get cores.


