TECH TIP-SOLVING STUDEBAKER OVERDRIVE PROBLEMS CONTRIBUTED BY LARRY CUSHING

One problem that exists in Studebaker land is the number of cars with workable overdrives that do not operate because the owners do not know how to wire them correctly. There is a way to educate yourself to wire Studebakers as well as all other brands. It is called the "hardware approach".

There are five main pieces of hardware required and four of these may be done away with and still have a working system with a few differences. The fie pieces of hardware are: 1) The Kickdown Switch; 2) The Overdrive Relay; 3) The Solenoid (The important one); 4) The Rail Lockout Switch; 5) The Governor

- (1) The KICKDOWN SWITCH: This is found on all types of overdrives and is basically a switch with four contacts of which one pair is normally closed and transmits power to the solenoid or provides a ground for the overdrive relay (Through the governor on cars with a relay. When a kickdown is used, the normally closed set opens and opens the overdrive circuit and the normally open set closes and shorts the ignition until the solenoid disengages the overdrive pawl and the transmission shifts to direct.
- (2) The OVERDRIVE RELAY: This is a device which uses a small current to switch a large current. The current for an overdrive solenoid is heavy and would require heavy wiring in a car. There are two types of relays and they are referred to as three terminal relays and four terminal relays. The three terminal relay is to be avoided if it draws its current from the ignition switch. The power supply and the control supply are taken from a common terminal which can be connected to the ignition switch or to the starter solenoid (especially good on cars with a rail lockout switch).

The four terminal relay is the deluxe type and its control power comes from the ignition switch and its load power comes via a separate terminal from the starter solenoid. Both three and four terminal relays operate the same way,. When the governor points close, it energizes the relay solenoid coil and the contacts close and transfer power from the battery to the overdrive solenoid. (Heavy current initially and a lighter current for the hold in windings). Overdrive relays are very costly but a three terminal relay can be replaced by a GM horn relay of the mid-fifties (They don't seem to overheat). 1955 Chevy overdrives used a relay similar to the horn relays. The four terminal relay can be replaced with a relay for driving lamps that has four terminals. The terminal that is normally attached to the ground can be attached to the governor. (\$6 vs \$30.)

- (3) The SOLENOID: This is the important piece of the o.d. control and is very expensive. It has pull in the windings (Heavy current for a short period) and hold in winding light current continuously when the governor is closed. There are two types of solenoids and they have either two or three terminals. The most common is the two terminal kind. One terminal is for its power input and the other terminal provides a ground for the kickdown circuit when overdrive is engaged. The three terminal solenoid was around from'58 to '63 and differs from the two terminal relay only in the fact that the solenoid coils are ordinarily grounded in the solenoid on two terminal solenoids. On the three terminal relays, the solenoid coils receive their ground through the governor. The system with three terminals do not have a relay in the stock form. If you burn out your three terminal solenoid you could easily add a relay and use a two terminal solenoid. A three terminal solenoid can replace a two terminal solenoid if you ground the extra terminal.
- (4) The RAIL LOCKOUT SWITCH: This was a device where the current between the governor and the relay was interrupted when the overdrive was locked out by the dash control. It saved energy because no power was used by the solenoid when it was not needed. After it was eliminated in 1957 or 58, all cars use power above the cut-in speed of the overdrive even if the overdrive is locked out. The factory seems to say that no-one would do without the overdrive and threw away the switch.
- (5) The GOVERNOR: This device has points which close when the cut-in speed is reached and open about 3 mph below this speed. There are two types of governors doing three kinds of work. Until 1964 there was only one type of governor doing two kinds of work. This governor had one terminal and it provided a ground for a relay (light duty work) or it provided a ground for a system using a three terminal solenoid and this was heavy duty work (More current) But it is probably that a governor before '58 would not burn its contacts if used on a '58-63.

The other type of governor has two terminals and was used from'64-66 and it is a switch since it switches power to the solenoid through two insulated terminals. If a two terminal governor goes bad it can be replaced with a one terminal governor if you ground one terminal.


