TECH TIP OFFERED BY RUTH CUSHING, EDITOR

INSTALLING FORD DISC BRAKES ON STUDEBAKERS

Over the years, numerous Stude owners have installed Brand X disc brakes with (apparently) a minimum of trouble. While they are not exactly a bolt-on in the true sense of the word modifications are (or seem to be) minor. This conversion was mentioned several times in the material I received from New Zealand — usually concerning late sixties Australian Ford products. No problems mentioned.

Ed Werrick made a conversion of this nature on his '51 some time back and made the following comments on the subject:

Installing 1968 Mustang disc brakes is almost a bolt-on except for the caliper brackets. The Mustange rotors take the same bearings as the Stude and the Stude seal will fit the Mustang rotor. The only major difference was the length of the spindle. The Stude spindle is about 1/2 inch longer and I adjusted that by using a sleeve and extending the dust cap. Once I had the rotors mounted, I used the spindle as a fixture by clamping the caliper to the rotor. I cut a disc out of 1/2 inch plate which bolted to the spindle and cleared the rotor by about an eighth inch.

I then made a set of mountain ears and bolted them to the calipers and then welded them to the mounting disc. When this was done, I took the caliper bracket off, put in some gussets and welded everything solid. When I mounted the brakes on the car, the only problem I encountered was that I had to trim the rear corners of the lower control arms to clear the caliper brackets. I did make one mistake on this operation — I mounted the calipers upside down. This means that to bleed the brakes, I have to remove the calipers and shim between the pads. As these disc brakes require a minimum of service, this is no big deal.


