John Ebstein, the last surviving member and the leader of the design team that brought the Avanti to life, passed away on February 18th in Palm Beach Gardens, FL. He was 92 years old.

The team was assembled by Raymond Loewy and included Ebstein, Tom Kellogg and Robert Andrews. Loewy rented a small bungalow near his home in Palm Springs, CA for the designers to work with him. In two weeks they had produced a scale model of the Avanti. Ebstein later called it "the final crowning of my design life".

A memorial service was held in Connecticut on February 25th.

DON'T JUDGE A BOOK BY ITS COVER BY RUTH CUSHING, EDITOR

One place I would feel was least likely to find anything interesting about Studebakers, a car that has been out of production for nearly 40 years would be *Hemmings Muscle Machine The Ultimate All-American Performance Car Magazine.*

We are complete car nuts, doesn't much matter what kind they are, and can appreciate all manner of automobiles. We have grown up in the Muscle Car Era and had the chance to drive a lot of well-powered vehicles.

Imagine our surprise when our April 2005 issue of the afore mentioned magazine arrived when in the midst of all the other articles there was one titled SOUTH BEND SOUTHERN SOJOURN. I do wish the pictures were better so that we could reproduce them in this publication, but suffice it to say they were marvelous. The article included a narrative by Jim Donnelly with photography from the collection of Bob Coolidge.

Names like Frank Mundy who was driving a 1951 Studebaker Starlight coupe on June 16, 1951 at Columbia Speedway in Columbia, SC. Mundy won his first pole of the season at this race and would go on to get his first win ever in NASCAR on this day. Not only that, the race was also historic in that this 100miler was the first NASCAR Strictly Stock race ever run under the lights; the race started in afternoon daylight but finished in darkness. Mundy said the Studebaker handled pretty well and really had plenty of get-up-and-go. The car was provided by W. Perry Smith Motors in Columbia. Studebaker had just introduced its first post-war V-8 for 1951, an OHV engine with solid lifters, a Stromberg two-barrel carburetor and 120hp. The car was light, so it was pretty responsive and a good race car.

The second Southern 500 at Darlington, on September 3, 1951, with Frank Mundy again on the pole. They started 82 cars in that race. The Hudson next to him was driven by Herb Thomas, who passed Mundy on the first lap and went on to win the race. Unfortunately, Mundy had the oil pump shear on the 12th lap and finished dead last. The author talked to him not long ago, and he said the Starlight coupe with the V-8 handled really well and had a good power-to-weight ratio, which is probably why he won the pole. Mundy got his start in motorcycles, then became a stunt rider, and was eventually a two-time AAA or WSAC stock car champion. He apparently didn't drive after the late fifties.

Merritt Brown of Daytona Beach, who died about three years ago, ran a Commander Coupe at the 1953 southern 500. The Commander got a bigger engine that year; up to 259 cubic inches with 162 hp. Merritt did a lot of racing at the beach and at Darlington. In this race Joe Eubanks and Tim Flock were driving Hudsons. The Loewy-style Commander ran very sparingly in the Grand National Division, but it was very popular as a Modified, where guys like Lee Roy Yarborough and Donnie Allison would put all kinds of huge engines in them and race them on the big tracks.

The article goes on for four pages with pictures and short stories about the GOOD OLE DAYS when stock car races were run with real "stock" cars. It has special interest to us as we have in our "collection" a 51 and a 53. The 51 is in the process of being "modified" and the 53 will be very close to stock when finished.

If you get a chance you might want to pick up a copy of *HEMMINGS MUSCLE MACHINE* or even subscribe to it. You may run into something else surprising.

1- Check tire pressure at least once a month

2-Always check tire pressure cold

3-It's better to be a few psi over than a few under

4-Always put new tires on the rear

5-VERY IMPORTANT-If you ever hear a tire go Bang (blowout), Hit the gas pedal first. This will allow you to regain control of the vehicle giving you a chance to look for a safe place to slow down and pull over to the side of the road to stop.


