REMEMBERING LEE AND SHIRLEY BY CHRIS COLLINS FOLLOWED BY AN ARTICLE PREVIOUSLY CONTRIBUTED BY LEE RICHARDSON

The Grand Canyon Chapter extends condolences to Eric Richardson and his family. Following is a tribute and an article Lee originally wrote. I hope you enjoy it.

Lee and Shirley were active in Chapter activities for several years after they joined in 1995 and attended many car shows over the years in one or the other of their many Studebakers. While reading an announcement in the Arizona Republic's car event section in early March about the annual clothing- optional car show at the Shangra La Nudist Resort I remembered that Lee had written an article about the show he and Shirley attended at the resort. 

JOHN M STUDEBAKER INDUCTED IN AUTOMOTIVE HALL OF FAME CONTRIBUTED BY KEVIN MC FADDEN

The Automotive Hall of Fame has released the names of its 2005 Class of Inductees. They are Mario Andretti, John Dunlop, Sir William Lyons, Jim Moran, Shirley Muldowney, John (Jack) Smith, Jr., John M. Studebaker and Alexander Winton. Formal induction ceremonies will take place October 11, 2005 in Detroit.

Automotive Hall of Fame Announces 2005 Inductees

NEW YORK, March 23 /PRNewswire/ -- The Automotive Hall of Fame has released the names of its 2005 Class of Inductees. They are Mario Andretti, John Dunlop, Sir William Lyons, Jim Moran, Shirley Muldowney, John (Jack) Smith, Jr., John M. Studebaker and Alexander Winton. Formal induction ceremonies will take place October 11, 2005 in Detroit.

Mario Andretti (1940-) is simply one of the world's greatest race drivers, having won championships at Indianapolis, Daytona and Formula One Grand Prix to name a few.

John Dunlop (1840-1921) invented the first successful pneumatic (air-filled) tire. The pneumatic tire was patented in 1888.

Sir William Lyons (1901-1985) founded Jaguar Cars. He began his career by building motorcycle sidecars in 1922 and moved to coach building in 1927.

Jim Moran (1918-) was one of the first auto dealers to advertise on television. He owned a Hudson, then Ford dealerships in Chicago. In 1968, Moran became a Toyota distributor in a five state area in the southeast United States.

Shirley Muldowney (1940-) was the first woman licensed to drive a Top Fuel dragster in 1973. She won the NHRA World Championship three times, and she earned 18 career NHRA victories.

John (Jack) Smith, Jr. (1939-) is the former Chairman and CEO of General Motors and is recognized for building the strength and depth of GM's management team worldwide.

John M. Studebaker (1833-1917) transformed the successful Studebaker Brothers Mfg. Company, which was the largest manufacturer of horse drawn vehicles, into the Studebaker Corporation, becoming the second largest producer of automobiles in 1911.

Alexander Winton (1860-1932) was an American automotive pioneer and built one of the first mass-produced cars in 1898. Winton held over a hundred patents in the United States and Europe for various automotive advances.

The Automotive Hall of Fame, the highest place of honor in the international motor vehicle industry, is located in Dearborn, Michigan.

TECH TIP OFFERED BY LARRY CUSHING

It seems people are always adding "stuff" to our favorite brand car. "stuff" is usually held in place by A.. duct tape or B. screws. Tape removal is self evident. Right?

Screw holes can be bondoed over, but will eventually crack out after painting. The correct and permanent way to repair screw holes is by welding.

The tip is to countersink the hole giving a wider, slanted surface to start the weld bead.


