# A GOOD FRIEND REMEMBERED

On December 13, 2006, the Studebaker Drivers Club and the Grand Canyon State Chapter lost someone very special when Hezzy Kappus died of pnuemonia while recovering from back surgery. At 83, Hezzy was still very active in a number of military, classic car and musical organizations as well as civic clubs in Wisconsin. I had the privilege of attending the services for Hezzy at his birth-place, Eau Claire, Wisconsin. I guess I shouldn't have been surprised at the more than two hundred that overflowed the viewing parlor at Evergreen Mortuary, as well as the huge array of flowers and photographs. Every ante room was also filled with mourners. The packed worship center at Saint Olaf's Catholic Church was a testament to this very special man who had lived in the community all his life and made many friends. Hezzy and Ruth spent recent winters in Arizona and became a part of our Studebaker Family here in the Phoenix area. They touched some of us more than others. Chris and Chuck had known Hezzy for over three decades having rented from him in the early years of their marriage. Deanna, Larry Vahe and Larry Swanson played with him in the Studebaker band. My association was pri-



marily about Studebakers. It seemed we were always building something similar at the same time and trading parts and me receiving guidance. First a 1960 Lark, then a 1938 Coupe Express and at the time he passed, we were each building a late thirties, two ton cabover Studebaker truck. I will always cherish the memory of visits to their home, filled with love, on the beach in Altoona. It was at their home in Sun City, where I was first asked to consider being vice president of the Studebaker Drivers Club.

At a very cold, windy, military, graveside service, attended by several hundred, at Forest Hill Cemetery, Father Brian Konopa quipped to Hezzy for the last time. "Here you are Hezzy, about eight feet from the street where you can see the cars go by." A twenty one gun salute shattered the silence in the old Eau Claire neighborhood and the bugle sang taps as the procession of Studebakers and other classics drove back to St. Olaf's where a rousing polka band, less tuba, entertained those who gathered for a meal in the church hall. Hezzy is survived by his wife Ruth, eight children, twenty two grand children, twenty one great grandchildren and many friends.



# **Ted Harbit to be Honored**

T ed Harbit of Chicken Hawk fame will be honored along with six others by the National Hot Rod Association at the fifth annual National Hot Rod Reunion in Hebron, Ohio, outside of Columbus. The event is June 15, 16 and 17.

The Chicken Hawk, a Commander Starlight Coupe, was found by Ted in a field near Anderson, Ind. in 1961. He paid \$30.00 for the car. Since then, Harbit and the Chicken Hawk have won 11 stock-car National Hot Rod Association drag-racing championships and he has been racing for about 50 years in cars he's restored himself. Harbit, a retired teacher, said, "I feel very honored to be selected as an honoree knowing there are literally hundreds of worthy racers out there."

# Something under the tree for the desert dwellers

We find some good news to start off the new year. The Arizona Republic reports that on December 13, the EPA approved a collector-car exemption bill that was signed by Governor Janet Napolitano in April 2005, then submitted to the EPA for hearings and study.

Starting on March 1, "collectible cars and trucks" in Maricopa and Pima counties will be excused from emissions testing, providing they're "bona fide show cars or hobbyist items that carry collector-car insurance, which limits annual mileage and restricts use." The specifics of those policies vary, but usually allow between 1,000 and 2,000 miles a year of driving.

Local collectors and clubs originally proposed the regulation, and we think Arizona's definition of an old car under this rule is the most generous in the nation, with a 15-year rolling limit. Anyone importing a car under 25 years old into the U.S. from abroad will still have to comply with federal emissions regulations.

According to *The Republic*, the EPA submitted a proposed rule to the Federal Register for 30 days of public comment; as of this writing, we were unable to find it on the FR Web site.

## STUDEBAKER IN PRINT

ne of the best Studebaker books available that quotes extensively from Board Meeting minutes from the mid 1950s on is Donald Critchlow's excellent Studebaker: The Life and Death of an American Corporation. (Indiana University Press, 1996). This book is a fascinating "must read" for anyone interested in the history of the corporation. Styling, model year sales information etc. is lacking in this book but on purpose. Mr. Critchlow focused more on the corporate side of things. The book really reads like an exciting novel and I would recommend it to anyone interested in the corporate side of Studebaker. It discusses in detail why Studebaker did what it did, and examines, like the Board did, various avenues that could have been taken by the Corporation at the many crossroads Studebaker found itself approaching during the postwar period. In all too many instances the Board, to borrow a phrase from Yogi Berra, "came to the fork in the road and took it."

I believe I purchased my copy from the Studebaker National Museum and have re-read it several times.

# STUDEBAKER: OUR MARQUE - OUR RESPONSIBILITY

Total Studebaker passenger car production in the 37 years from 1930-1966 was just 3.4 million vehicles with 1950 being the biggest production year at 343,000 cars. Compare these numbers to the statistics below:

- Chevrolet built 4.8 million cars in the three years of 1955, 1956 and 1957. The rarest of these was the Nomad wagon of which 22,375 were built. Studebaker built just 14,789 GT Hawks in three model years and the Nomad is rare???
- ♦ Ford built 1.7 million Model As in 1930 and 1931.
- 1.8 million Mustangs were built in 1965 and 1966.
- ♦ Between 1959 and 1966, Rambler built 2.9 million vehicles. In the same years Studebaker produced 556,00 Larks and Cruisers.

The point? Our cars are rare and as time progresses we begin to stand out from the crowd of other classic American models, many of which are more popular today to collectors. To own a Mustang or '55-'57 Chev 20 years ago in New Zealand was unusual and these cars had a real "wow" factor. Today any gathering of American iron has so many of these models that they begin to lose their point of difference.

We now have that "wow" factor in our cars. What is it? Who made it? Is it a Ford engine? The Studes sound different and certainly the style has stood the test of time creating more and more discussion as time moves on. Perhaps the most popular Studebaker in New Zealand is the 1963 Lark 4 door sedan. Only 40,113 of these cars were built and based on 1961 and 1962 numbers, it can be assumed that less than half of these cars were built with a V8 engine. That is less cars than the "rare" Nomad!! Just 28 Studes were registered in NZ in 1963 up until June, and 93 Lark CKD units came in around the middle of the year which were assembled and sold as '63 and '64 models. By comparison Ford was assembling 336 compact Fairlanes per year during this period!

We have a responsibility to show our cars off at every available opportunity. The more interest we garner the more people will begin to want to own a Stude and the future of the brand will be assured.

Do you currently have an enthusiastic "next" owner for your car/s? Do you know what will happen to your car/s when you are no longer here?

Please don't just leave your cars in a will that makes them just a part of your estate. Determine in advance the people you want to continue the heritage of the marque and be specific. There are a lot of young people who would love to own and cherish a Studebaker, but the cars are beyond their financial reach given the ease with which a modern car can be purchased on low deposit.

The Nationals is a great occasion to get the cars on the roads of New Zealand - as is every organized meet. The Top Of The South Spring run has become another wonderful opportunity to travel, as is the Tauranga

meeting. We do, however, need something on a regular basis in the lower part of the South Island - the most beautiful part of the country - and maybe the Autumn season provides an opportunity for an annual meeting (taking Easter into account). This Easter in Masterton is a great opportunity to get your car out on the road - have you registered yet?

The cost of fuel increases does make a difference to how far we may be prepared to travel, but when put into perspective the cost of taking the Studebaker anywhere is probably only 25-30% more than a modern brand X and this is a part of the cost of the responsibility we have undertaken. Our cars must be kept fully roadworthy. We need to take them on the roads on a regular basis, not just special occasions. An outing once a week or fortnight needs to be on our agenda to maintain the exposure and public interest.

No one sees or knows about them when they are parked up in a garage or waiting to trailered to an event. Give thought to having an information sheet to sit on a seat which can be read through the window. This could even have the club's e-mail address on it for people who want to take their interest a little further.

We have bought the cars we love for many different reasons - family history, loved them as a youngster, they look different, they are unique, no one else has one, stands out from the crowd. Whatever the reason of ownership we ensure that the same enthusiasm and interest passes on to another generation and then another generation. The low build numbers mean that the supply of roadworthy or restorable cars is not infinite.

By using our cars we also use the parts required to maintain them. This in turn helps keep the businesses of those people who have committed themselves to the on-going supply of parts for us in a viable financial position. If we don't use the cars, we don't buy the parts, so the suppliers will vanish and then parts will become expensive and very difficult to source.

Our cars are still appreciating in value. We are supported by an excellent supply of parts which are relatively cheap, so compared to any modern brand X which is suffering depreciation of around 25% per year, the cost of owning a Studebaker is very low.

We cannot be selfish, we must accept the responsibility we have undertaken by making the purchase of our Studebaker - keep it fully roadworthy, use it, expose it and help build enthusiasm for the brand especially amongst those people who have never even heard the name before.


