HAWK TALK By Jack Smith

In the Studebaker-Packard post merger era, I, Jack Smith, was the Staff Engineer responsible for programming engineering activities and between the various sections of the Engineering Department at Studebaker.

When Studebaker and Packard merged, both companies were in financial trouble. The decision was made to cap the forthcoming Hawk line up with a special luxury model, one with the image of a family sports car with an engine by Packard. Neither division was very enthusiastic. Packard was reluctant to implant their engine in a "lesser car" and Studebaker thought their engines were "just fine". Regardless of the arguments, the 1956 Golden Hawk was born with luxury touches, nice styling and a performance badge of 275 horsepower.

Midstream of the '56 model run, disaster struck! Without warning, Packard closed its doors and the engine was unavailable for the '57 Hawk! Should we use a smaller Studebaker engine? Should we attempt something heroic to regain the 275 H.P.?

A McCulloch engineer from California appeared on the scene with a sample supercharger. We were to determine if the Hawk 289 under hood layout could be adapted to accept the McCulloch blower. The answer was....YES!

This is how it unfolded that day....we went to work on a 289 Hawk, lifting the hood to survey the problem of getting a 40 pound blower into a space that was already occupied by the radiator upper housing and the thermostat housing. We drained the coolant and removed the hose and 'stat. Now the blower could be held above the open thermostat hole in the engine's front coolant manifold. A flash of inspiration and the whole plan became apparent! Instead of considering mounting brackets we would cradle the blower in a casting which would mount on top of the coolant manifold exactly where the thermostat housing had been removed. By designing the casting with an internal duct, the coolant could be channeled through the cradle to a new thermostat location on the left side and from there, via a new rubber hose, back to the radiator upper tank. An elegant solution and as a bonus we could also include a boss on the casting to locate the pivot point for the idler arm and pulley needed to control blower drive belt tension.

Some other problems still needed to be addressed, especially the need to deliver the blower air to the engine intake without getting involved with a time consuming program to balance carburetor internal/external pressures. We decided to bypass the problem by enclosing the carburetor in a cast chamber into which the blower air could be directed, hopefully giving the carburetor a natural internal/external balance. Smaller problems like a drive pulley, throttle linkage, fuel lines, manifold-vacuum connections and air cleaner location would be easy and could be postponed.

Just one guestion remained.....what about hood

clearance? There wasn't any, we could not close the hood! We cut a hold in the hood, let the blower stick through and called Styling to solve the problem. We were done with our challenge. By September 12, 1956 Styling had completed their assignment and the 1957 Golden Hawk prototype was ready for introduction to 250 media people who attended the 1957 Studebaker Press Preview at the Proving Grounds.

I was given the job of writing the speech touting the '57 Hawk at the preview. I still have copies of the speech. A quote from page 6 of the 9 page speech: "As before, the Hawk line will be paced by the Golden Hawk, which for 1957 will be powered by a supercharged version of the President V8 engine. An engineering gem, the new Golden Hawk engine will produce the same horsepower as its large displacement un-supercharged predecessor and will sport a flexibility which will delight the sportsminded motorist."

Also, at the preview, the press was invited to test drive the Golden Hawk prototype and I was fortunate to be the Ride/Drive host with the car.

Technical Information

Q I need a heater fan motor and switch for my 1960 Hawk.

The correct motor for the 1960 Hawk would be 1540090 or 1540742 (Canada). These are getting hard to find and I would replace it with a 1962 Hawk motor 1554985 which is a two speed motor. Studebaker had one speed motors and used a resistor to obtain low speed for the blower motor. In 1962 they finally realized that just adding a third wire to the blower motor would be better. It is a true two speed motor and the blower switch does not have a resistor anymore. If you get the 1554985 (bolt in replacement) motor you should replace the 1544277 switch (with resistor) with a 1554978 (no resistor two way switch). This will apply to all twelve volt Studebaker cars that have the heater motor under the passenger side front fender. For some of the older cars you would have to bypass the resistor and for all cars you would have to run a second wire from the switch to the low speed circuit of the 1962 Hawk motor or you can leave everything like it is and only use the high speed circuit of the motor (tape up the extra lead) and use you old switch with the resistor if it still functions.

These switches were a pain. On 1963-'64 Hawks the whole system is different since they did away with the under the passenger seat heater core. For real cold climates Studebaker offered a second heater under the drivers side front seat. There was even a gas heater available for some models for our friends in the north.
