
Editorially Speaking

1 can (14-1/2 ounces) diced tomatoes, undrained

2 envelopes sloppy joe mix

1 C uncooked elbow macaroni

Call for Nominations for the Harry Barnes Award

The Founder of SDC, Harry Barnes, established the Minnie Barnes Award in memory of his mother Minnie. Harry first awarded it to the Colorado Chapter in 1970. It was then presented each summer at the International Meet to the Chapter which had performed the most charitable acts and humanitarian public service over the past year. Any member could nominate any Chapter by sending a written nomination to Harry, who would make the choice. If no nominations were received, Harry did not make an award for that particular year. The Minnie Barnes Award continued during Harry's lifetime, but has not been awarded since 1995.

To honor Harry, and to continue his original award in memory of his mother, the Board voted to accept nominations again in 2006. During Harry's lifetime the award took on two different aspects - some years it was awarded to a Chapter, and other years it was awarded to one or two members who had done something outstanding and deserving of recognition. Therefore, we are now accepting nominations in two separate categories, the Minnie Barnes Award will honor a Chapter, as originally intended, and the Harry Barnes Award will honor an individual member as outstanding Studebaker Driver of the year. However, in any one year, there might be two awards given, one award, or no award if there are no qualified chapters or persons nominated.

SDC Regional Manager for Europe, Mike Sandy, is in charge of accepting your nominations for the award. Even though this will be an international address, it is very easy to do via the Internet. Since our International Meet is in June, he can accept your nominations through May 15th (it must reach him by May 15th, so if you use postal mail do allow plenty of time for international delivery).

Any SDC member may nominate one chapter and/or one member deserving of the award. You may definitely nominate your own chapter if you think it deserves the award. Include a short statement of what the nominee did to deserve the nomination. Send your nominations to Mike Sandy. HOST CHAPTER RESPONSIBILITES AND COSTS FOR AND REVENUE FROM AN SDC INTERNATIONAL MEET

t is the Studebaker Drivers Club's policy that the host chapter will:

- ♦ Work with the International Meet Committee (IMC) in selecting a meet hotel. Final approval will rest with the International Meet Committee and the hotel.
- Design meet logo to used on all meet advertising.
- Submit a tentative budge to the IMC one year prior to the meet and another six months prior to the meet.
- Provide the IMC Chairman with minutes of committee meetings.
- Submit material for a pre-meet booklet with registration form to the IMC in a timely manner so that it will be available at the International Meet immediately preceding the meet planned. SDC will print and pay for 1,000 copies of this booklet. Additional copies will be the responsibility of the host.
- Have representatives at the preceding International Meet to pass out literature, answer questions and promote the meet.
- Provide all local advertising.
- Provide information on camping and recreational vehicle facilities that are available near the meet site.
- Work with the SDC Chief Judge to map out concours and display parking areas.
- Assist SDC in providing security for all display and concours vehicles, swap meet areas, memorabilia room as well as off-site trailer parking.
- Provide memorabilia items for resale such as shirts, hats, mugs, etc.
- A meet handbook is optional and if chosen SDC will contribute \$250.00 towards the cost of printing. The host is responsible for soliciting ads from local and Studebaker related businesses and ad revenue will be applied to printing costs. The host is responsible for production and printing of the handbook. If the host opt not to have a handbook, SDC will contribute \$250.00 toward the cost of printing and distribution of a master meet schedule.
- Solicit local related businesses and other SDC Chapters for trophy sponsorships.
- Work with a local tour company to provide tours that meet participants will find both interesting and affordable and will assist in the loading of passengers.
- Set rates for tours, fun and memorabilia items.
- Collect materials for goodie bags, stuff bags with these materials and the meet handbook, dash plaque, pocket agenda, etc. These bags will be given to the registration company to distribute.
- Set up, staff and maintain memorabilia room (optional).
- Provide a bulletin board for announcements, buy/sell notices, etc.
- Arrange with a rental company for swap meet tables. Set up, staff and maintain swap meet areas. The IMC will set vendor registration fees.
- Provide at least four interesting Studebaker related seminars as well as other seminars specifically planned of interest to ladies and oversee speaker needs.
- Provide all necessary signage for tours, registration, swap meet, evening programs, concours, etc.
- ◆ Have an information counter that will be staffed from 8:00 am to 5:00 pm Sunday through Friday the week of the meet which will be located in the registration area. If possible, have a representative from the Chamber of Commerce or Visitor's Bureau to answer questions.
- Provide volunteers as needed, for Welcome Night, the SDC auction, the Concours and the Awards banquet.
- Provide and staff hospitality room (optional).
- Plan and staff Fun Night.
- Assist SDC in procuring items for SDC National Auction from local members and merchants.

It is the SDC policy that costs for the host chapter include but are not limited to the following:

- The cost related to the design of the meet logo and appropriate art work that can be used in advertising.
- The cost related to room or space rental for all activities that are the responsibility of the host chapter and not provided by the meet hotel.
- The cost related to the securing of materials for the goodie bags with the exception of the dash plaque, meet handbook and pocket agenda.
- The cost of the map to be placed in the registration area.
- The cost of tables for the swap meet.

wife does, she "discovered" eBay on the web. Ka-ching!



- An agreement with the host hotel for a rebate on room nights (optional). This may be a part of the hotel agreement with the SDC and must be approved by the IMC.
- Will receive all meet handbook ad revenue.
- The sale of memorabilia such as shirts, hats, mugs, etc.
- An agreement with the tour company for a rebate on tours (optional). This must be a part of the tour company agreement with the SDC and must be approved by the IMC.
- All indoor and outdoor swap meet and table rental profits.
- All Fun Night profits.
- Donations from the hospitality suite (optional).

If the above listed areas do not generate \$5,000.00 profit for the chapter, the SDC will pay the difference to the host chapter thus guaranteeing that the profit for hosting the International Meet will be at least \$5,000.00. This is with the understanding that these policies are followed as well as directives from the IMC. Memorabilia purchases and sales are not included in this guarantee.
