Larry makes an interesting observation in his message about driving our old vehicles on today's roads. A new requirement by the International Meet Committee that the host chapter sponsor two driving tours during an International Meet will hopefully help to get people behind the wheel of their Studes for even a short time and allow us to be true to our name as a Drivers Club. Don't forget our caravan to Payson and the tour around town on the 14th hosted by Ken Michael. We can put smiles on the faces of the Payson residents just as was done in South Bend as the Studebakers paraded through the streets after the concours.

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President's Message

y now the 43rd International Meet is in the history books and a good time was had by all of us that attended. Our thanks go out to the committee members who helped put on this great event and to the staff of the Studebaker National Museum; I know they worked very hard and are to be commended for doing such a good job! Like many of you, I spent a lot of time at the new Studebaker museum. I looked at the cars displayed on all three levels and went through the Club Room located on the second floor. While I did not see anyone looking over the few remaining buildings that comprised the old plant I did stop by and looked at the administration building and five story assembly building. There was plenty of activity at SASCO located in the old engineering building on Sample Street and many of us spent time looking at the inventory located on the upper floors. Jon Carter found enough NOS interior parts to complete a 1963 Lark but by and large the majority of the NOS interior panels have succumbed to 43 years of the elements.

While this meet will be covered by other gifted writers in the news letter I'll just mention one more item and that was the drive around Studebaker's old test track. While I did not count the number of Studebaker's going around the track I would guess it was around 100. The first lap went rather sedately at 30 mph but each lap saw some people leaving the track. As the field thinned I got my '64 Avanti up to 50 mph for a short time on the second lap and on the third lap my top speed was 60 mph. This was not a sustained speed but until the field closed up it was fun while it lasted!

I believe John Kroulik and I were the only two members who drove back to South Bend in our respective Studebakers. John and I ended up taking different routes but I put some 4,200 miles on my '64 Avanti. In the 'For What It's Worth' category I noted a couple of things from driving my Studebaker that many miles. One thing becomes noticeable and that is the Interstate Highways are a harsh environment for older cars. My speed was around 75 to 80 mph and while that's a good speed for keeping up I was still passed by numerous trucks going, I'm guessing, close to 90 mph. If you're not the lead Husky then the view never changes and I found myself following many trucks going around 80 mph. I also expected to see some Studebakers on the road. Going to the meet I did not see one Studebaker until I got to South Bend. On the way home I passed a '53 so the sum total of Studebakers I saw in 4,200 miles was one. And the point of all of this is? I know we are supposed to be the Studebaker Drivers Club but with each passing year it becomes harder to drive the interstates. I would guess that within, say, five years or less the vast majority of the cars going to meets outside of your normal commuting area will be trailered as driving just becomes to abusive on the cars and the speeds more daunting. In addition to hitting a gazillion bugs I drove in a lot in the rain. From South Bend to Oklahoma City it either drizzled or I was

driving through torrential downpours.

On the upside of driving I found that when I stopped for gas (a frequent experience in a '64 Avanti) people either absolutely knew about Studebakers or didn't have a clue. The age cutoff for this was about 45: those over knew about Studebakers and those under were clueless. Some of the younger set did clear up a nagging issue for me and that was Studebakers were made in Youngstown, Ohio. This being the case, I wondered what I was doing in South Bend and why the SNM was not located in Youngstown! This, to me, just drives home the point that unless you actually drive your cars and talk with other people then fewer and fewer people will know about Studebakers. The conundrum is, of course, driving becomes more difficult so fewer of us drive and more people will think Youngstown is the home of Studebaker! I guess I should leave the editorial part to the editor but this problem becomes crystal clear when you drive long distance in a Studebaker.

Okay, stepping down from my soap box, the next event scheduled for our chapter is July 14 at the Mazatzal Casino in lovely Payson. This is another fine opportunity for you to get your Studebaker out and on the road especially for those of us who live in the great northern reaches of Arizona. More information is located in this news letter so I hope to see many of you at this chapter event. This will be our last chapter function until the 22nd of September when we get to visit Scott Cawley's collection. Thanks again to all of you who attended the international meet and to Chris who continues to publish a fine news letter.




Valley members meet at the Wendy's in Fountain Hills at 17218 E. Shea Blvd. just west of the Bee Line

43rd International SDC Meet

The meet was by most accounts one of the best because we were back "home" in South Bend, Ind. The Studebaker National Museum was the host of the 43rd annual meet and they did a great job of organizing and planning a very full and busy week for the members of the Studebaker Drivers Club, the Antique Studebaker Club and the Avanti Owners Association. The Packard Club also met during the week and participated in the concours at the St. Joseph County Fairgrounds.

The swap meet and concours were both held at the fairgrounds. The membership meeting, auction and banquet took place at the downtown Century Center. Registration, the board and other meetings were at the Studebaker National Museum or Center for History. A bit of running around, for sure, but everyone got to know the streets of South Bend very well during the week.

The SDC board met Monday and among the business conducted was election of officers. All the officers were re-elected with no competition for any of the offices. The board approved a new membership option - \$10.00 dues with voting privileges but no *Turning Wheels* for those who want to be a member of a chapter for social reasons.

The swap meet began officially Monday morning and ran all week. Vendors were set up in three buildings and outside at the fairgrounds. Parts, parts, parts everywhere. No one should have gone home empty handed.

Many meetings were held Tuesday beginning with the editors meeting where there was discussion about different ways to distribute and publish chapter newsletters and about copyright laws. Winners of the newsletter competition were announced and Gail Ault editor of the Southern Arizona Chapter's *Copper Starlight* placed third in the senior bi-monthly category. Congratulations to Gail.

The International Meet Committee met next and went over plans for meets through 2011 and discussed potential sites for the 2012 meet.

At the Presidents, Regional Managers and Zone Coordinators meeting, SDC president Ed Reynolds led the group in a discussion of ways to retain membership and how to encourage younger people to become members of the SDC.

Later, at the Foundation board meeting, the board approved assisting a Denver automotive museum with a Studebaker project. Two scholarships were awarded just prior to the meet to students at McPherson College and the Wyoming Technical Institute. The board also decided to sell a Champ pickup donated to the Foundation on eBay.

Wednesday afternoon the Membership Meeting was held, followed in the evening by the National Auction which earned \$8,000 for the Studebaker National Foundation. Between the meeting and the auction, the Studebaker band entertained with a variety of music, all done very well. Five Chapter members participated in the band - Larry Swanson, Bill Cervini, Gary Keating, Deanna Manley and Larry Vahe.

Concours day was a very pleasant day with hundreds of Studebakers on the show field. Because of the number of vehicles, judging ran very late into the afternoon. Friday, at the awards banquet we learned the results of all the hard work. Several Arizona SDC members were winners with firsts earned in their classes by Chester & Nancy Bradfield, 1932 Dictator Roadster; John Agee, 1929 Commander 6 Cabriolet; Dan & Jeri Talbot, 1957 Golden Hawk; Harold & Deanna Manley, 1955 Speedster; Larry Vahe, 1964 Avanti; Dale & Norma Sexton, 1988 Avanti; Ronald Ratz, Avanti. Earning seconds were Dick & Kay LaTorre, 1964 GT Hawk and Bill & Mary Cervini, 1964 R2 Avanti. Dan & Geri Talbot with their 1902 Electric received a third place. Also, at the banquet, we learned Kolton Kroulik received a second place in the model competition. Congratulations to all who received awards.

The Manley's Speedster received an outstanding 399 points but, interestingly, another Speedster got 400 points. (Two vehicles earned 400 points at this meet.) The Manleys were taking their car on to Newton, Iowa where Deanna's dad, George Van Zee, was driving it in Newton's Fourth of July parade.

The week concluded with a car show on Saturday morning followed by a drive to the Bosch Proving Grounds (the former Studebaker test track) with a four lap go around the track. What a wonderful way to end a great week.

If you wish to experience an SDC International Meet before our Chapter hosts one in 2010 you might consider attending the 2008 meet in Lancaster, PA September 14-20 or the 2009 meet in Cedar Rapids, Iowa July 12-18. The meets offer many activities including tours of the area, meetings, swap meet and the concours. Try it, you'll like it.

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AMERICAN TRUCK HISTORICAL SOCIETY NATIONAL MEET

G rand Canyon State Chapter members were immersed in the vintage truck scene as Colorado Springs, Colorado hosted the American Truck Historical Society National Meet at the World Arena. Scott Grainger, Don Robertson, Richard Dormois, Kevin MacFadden and dad enjoyed three days walking the many rows of big rigs dating from the early 1900s to 2008 in varying weather conditions not unusual for June at the base of Pikes Peak. It was eighty Thursday morning and snow fell on the show field Thursday evening.

The boys got their fill of vintage Republics, Hayes, Nash, Oldsmobile, Corbett, International, Autocar, White, Kliber, Packard, Plymouth, Fargo, Dodge, Federal, Peterbilt, Kenworth, Eagle, and many more. It was hard to pick a star of the event, but most attention was gained by Don Robertson's "Other Woman" International tractor and fifty three foot flatbed trailer carrying the International Tractor and vintage gasoline tanker converted into a condominium where Don and friends reside when on the road.

Heavy snow and high winds cancelled the truckers run up Pikes Peak which was very disappointing. The membership meeting at the Doubletree Inn brought two hundred and twenty and Ritchie Brothers held a benefit auction of vintage trucks on Saturday with less than stellar results.
