Hobby News

New Arizona Law

Steve Fein sent the following information about a new law that takes effect Jan 1, 2009.

License Plate Holder Law - State law* requires that the state name at the top of Arizona license plates must be visible. Any license plate holder or cover that prevents the license plate from being clearly legible is in violation of this new law. * A.R.S. 28-2354(B.)

Please understand you can have a license plate frame holder as long as it doesn't cover the name Arizona on the top your license plate. If the license plate frame holder covers the name Arizona you'll receive a \$130.00 ticket! This is your responsibility as Arizona drivers to know new motor vehicle laws, the state doesn't send out mailings. So if you have a frame holder that covers the name Arizona on your license plate, remove it before Jan 1, 2009, and replace it with one that doesn't cover the name Arizona.

TECHNICAL INFORMATION

The rubber boot around most steering columns get brittle and pieces of the gasket break off. The best way to repair the problem is to purchase an NOS or reproduction boot if you can find one. However, not all boots are being reproduced today and most NOS boots have already been used up. Here is a simple and inexpensive repair and your don't even need to remove the column from the car unless you want to.

Go to the store where they sell plumbing supplies. Stores such as Ace, Lowes and Home Depot will have the part you need. Go to the plumbing section and purchase a flexible roof gasket for a vent pipe that goes through the roof of a building. Measure the hole size of the gasket to make sure you purchase the correct size as the diameter of the steering column in your car. You should buy the one that gives as tight a seal as possible. Next, cut only the hole part of the gasket out leaving at least 2 to 4" of gasket around the hole. Split the gasket into the hold and slide it around the steering column. Take a pliers stapler and staple the gasket back together. Paint the gasket black and slide the gasket down the steering column on top of your old boot. Trim as needed.
