



n February 21st, we will have a preview of a driving tour I have planned for the 2010 International Meet. We will drive to Wickenburg, visit the beautiful Desert Caballeros Western Museum on a guided tour and then stop at the Country Kitchen restaurant for lunch and our meeting. The admission to the Museum is \$5.00 (normally \$7.50) and lunch is very reasonably priced and very good at the Country Kitchen.

Wickenburg is only a 44 mile drive from Glendale on flat divided highway and very easy to do. We will meet on US 60 several blocks north of Bell road, across the street from Sun City West and Del Webb Hospital. There is a light there at Reems road and a Wachovia Bank. Turn left and you top off your gas tank at the Valero gas station for the economy run portion of our tour. We will stop at the first gas station in Wickenburg, fill up our tanks and calculate the results, and then continue on to the Museum at 21 N. Frontier St. You go to the only traffic light in town, turn left, go 1 block to Apache Drive, go 1 block to Frontier and turn left again. The museum is at the end of the block. After the Tour of the museum, we will drive back to the Country Kitchen, which is located on US 60 at the entrance to town on the West side of the road and have lunch and our meeting and award the coveted Gas Hog Award. I'll let someone else be the proud holder of this beautiful perpetual trophy. It's unique, It's beautiful, I just don't have room for it any more.

The Reason for This Book

The Arizona Sheriff by Major Grover F. Sexton, the Deputy from Yavapai, is a book published by the Studebaker Corporation in 1925 to showcase the use of the Studebaker cars by the sheriffs of twelve Arizona counties.

In the upcoming months, as we approach the 2010 "Best in the West" SDC International Meet, your editor will excerpt some of the stories Major Sexton wrote for this book commissioned by Studebaker. Because of its use by the Arizona sheriffs, Studebaker named the 5-passenger Big 6 Duplex-Phaeton "The Sheriff". The car was chosen to be incorporated into the meet logo by the 2010 meet committee as a symbol of the Arizona's Old West history. Below is reprinted the Studebaker Corporation's reason for publishing the book.

The following stories of sheriff-ing in Arizona are not fiction. They are picturesque or thrilling incidents in the daily lives of the men who make life and property more safe in the remote mountains and deserts of the "Copper State" than in the streets of some great cities where thousands of police walk short beats night and day.

In achieving this result the Arizona sheriff finds a swift, sturdy automobile absolutely essential.

Twelve of the fourteen counties of Arizona furnish the sheriff's office with an automobile. Every one of these twelve has bought a Studebaker.

When this story came to South Bend, we commissioned Major Grover F. Sexton to visit each of these

twelve sheriffs and see just what service Studebaker cars were rendering to the people of Arizona. Over fine roads leading through majestic scenery - a veritable tourist paradise - he visited rich mines, vast ranches, fertile, irrigated farms, picturesque pueblos.

In each county Major Sexton gathered stories of adventure. During his stay at Prescott he was commissioned a deputy and assisted in the capture of a moonshiner who had killed a bootlegger. At Yuma he accompanied the sheriff in a swift chase of robbers who had looted a bank and killed the cashier.

He found that both good roads and bad roads gave the sheriff's Studebaker a severe test. Across the mesas stretched broad, smooth highways devoid of intersections where the throttle was thrown wide open and left open. There were wagon trails up into remote mountain valleys where the car was driven relentlessly in the teeth of ruts, rocks and steep grades. There were stretches of desert where no trace of trail existed but over which criminals must be pursued by a car crashing though brush and cactus stumps in the night. He found that Arizona sheriffs and their deputies insist on driving Studebakers because they stand up under this hard service.

Every sheriff-driver there has tried other makes of motor cars. At least two sheriffs have preferred to keep old Studebakers to receiving new cars of other makes offered them.

Stories of Arizona sheriffs - their courage, their humor, their keen intelligence - as collected by Major Grover F. Sexton, Deputy Sheriff of Yavapai County, are published in the following pages. They tell how these soft spoken, hard driving men with nimble guns keep the highways and byways of Arizona safe by swift and certain capture of wrongdoers.

Detailing Tips by Steve Montgomery

Now that you have acquired that 40 or 50 year old Studebaker you may notice the windshield has a dullnes to it not apparent in your new car. That isn't something you have to live with. Aside from sand pitting what you are looking at is most likely lime buildup. You can get your windshield and all other glass looking bright as your new car by mixing up a solution of CLR cleaner and water. I use about 1/4 to one mix and a sponge with a gentle abrasive side. Because you aren't trying to scratch the glass itself, don't use those with a hard scratch pad. Wipe the solution on the glass, let it sit for a couple of minutes and rub and wash it off. Your glass should look much different than when you tried looking through it.

Do you have a small amounts of paint over spray or other hard to remove residue on your glass or chrome? Try Bon Ami powdered cleanser. This stuff isn't as hard as other powdered cleaners and won't scratch your chrome or glass. Regular Ajax and Comet cleanser in the round cans, on the other hand, will. They aren't the same. I use Bon Ami to clean badly stained china like coffee cups and they come out looking flawless. While I'm on this subject, Bon Ami is an environmental and health friendly non-toxic cleaning compound. Unlike other powdered cleansers, it contains no bleach.

I don't recommend using SOS pads on chrome or stainless surfaces but you can get away with using those steel soap impregnated pads for cleaning off tough rust or other junk that has built up on metal or other hard surfaces. One strong word of caution is to not overuse the pad. The soap compound in the pad also provides lubricant to keep the pad from gouging or scratching the metal surface. Once the soap is gone that pad will start to mar the surface you are trying to clean.

Were the last folks to drive your car smokers? Smoking in the car, like smoking anywhere else, leaves a buildup of nicotine on surfaces and saturates fabric. One cleaner that cuts nicotine residue from non-porous plastic or vinyl surfaces is Simple Green. Mix 50 percent with water and spray or wipe it on. Watch the nasty brownish greenish nicotine residue melt away leaving your plastic looking like it did when it was new.

ZDDP and Motor Oil

Malcolm Stinson recommends that members read or re-read Bob Palma's comments about ZDDP and motor oil in the December, 2008 *Turning Wheels* Co-Operator column (pages 7 and 8 or if you are reading the newsletter on line, see page 13). ZDDP is an additive in oil and is also available as a separate product. He feels it is important for us with our old cars that use flat-tappet camshafts to know the benefits of ZDDP.

Malcolm sells an additive, ZDDPlus, for \$10.00 a can which is also available from Studebaker International and Myers Studebaker Parts.

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Motor Oil - Again

This topic seems to have finally settled down a bit. Most hobbyists understand the contemporary oils marketed for contemporary engines don't contain enough ZDDP (zinc dialkyldithiophospate, if you can pronounce it) to adequately protect flat-tappet camshafts found in all Studebakers.

ZDDP is nothing new or a miracle snake oil; it's been in oil for years to cushion the tremendous scraping (shear) load of cam lobes pushing up on flat-tappet lifters. In fact, it's still in contemporary oil....but at maybe one-fourth the concentration our engines need. The concentration "we" need would damage catalytic converters on new vehicles, and since they have roller-tappet cams with far less friction, they don't need much ZDDP. Reputable refiners and marketers are aware of the SDDP deficiency for older vehicles in current oil and are addressing it. We are not alone; this market is too large and well defined to ignore.

Our reason for keeping this in front of SDCers is to protect engines, not to sell product. The results of using the wrong oil might be years forthcoming, when a car or truck has changed hands. Most of us don't want future Studebaker enthusiasts to be discouraged by having major engine problems (specifically, worn-flat camshaft lobes and galled lifters) soon after they enter the hobby.

There are now two major options for providing proper ZDDP levels for older engines. One is to use current motor oil specifically marketed for older cars and stated to have the proper amount of ZDDP in it. The perfectly-acceptable alternative is to add the ZDDP yourself to a contemporary motor oil of your choice, synthetic or otherwise. (For those of you who have been following this scenario, contemporary diesel-rated motor oil containing enough ZDDP, oil without an API CJ rating, has virtually disappeared from store shelves over the last year. So that third option, available even last year, has pretty much been taken off the table.)

Enthusiast Dennis Kirban of Kirban Performance Products was at the SDC Lancaster International Meet and there conducted a seminar on ZDDP concerns. The previous day, he was kind enough to sit in on Lancaster's Co-Operator Tech session and explain the benefits of the product he markets: ZDDPlus. It is available through vendors Myers Studebaker Parts & Service and Studebaker International in Studebaker-land., and possibly others by the time you read this. You can add a pint of ZDDPlus to contemporary oil of your choosing and restore the ZDDP level you Studebaker (or other flat-tappet-camshaft engine) needs. Doing this would allow you to buy the right oil for your late-model driver if you change your own oil, yet be able to use that same oil in your Studebaker....providing you add the ZDDPlus to your Studebaker. [Yes, we are dreaming of the day when Dennis invents something he might cal 260 PLUS, an elixir added to contemporary gasoline that magically infuses it with all the properties of 1964-era, leaded Sunoco 260...]

A second course of action regarding ZDDP is to buy and use of the many oils coming to marked targeted

for older cars with flat-tappet camshafts. Here is information on three of them although I'm sure there will be others.

Castrol no has collector-car oil readily available at most retailers around the country. It is know as Castrol 20-50 Syntec for Classic cars. It already has enough ZDDP in it if you prefer not using a separate additive. But it must not be used in cars newer than 1988, either, so don't buy a case of it and figure you can use it in both your Studebaker and your late-model daily driver.

Brad Penn Racing refines an old specifically for older engines. It may be reviewed on their website: http://www.bradpennracing.com. They claim it is 100% Pennsylvania crude. Now that's something I wouldn't have thought was available.

The D-A Lubricant Company on the west side of Indianapolis manufactures classic car oil that may be reviewed here: http://wwww.classicarmotoroil.com/index.html. D-A has been in business for years. (In fact, I took a sample of original Kendall C-999 Steering gear Lubricant there several years ago and got an audience with one of their chemists to see if they had a product we could use in Studebaker/Ross steering gears. He analyzed my C-999 sample in their lab whiled I watched, an interesting process, and concluded they did not. We then explored the possibility of manufacturing such a product for Studebaker use. The cost and quantity involved were prohibitive, so that's where that project ended.)

Anyway, it looks like D-A has created a Classic Car Oil with both ZDDP and additional ingredients for collector car engines that spend a long time storage, certainly a valid consideration if it applies to you.

As usual, we aren't recommending one product or course of action over another. The important thing is to be diligent in selecting oil and/or a supplement for your Studebaker's engine, because the correct oil for your daily-driven 2002 Ford Ranger is not appropriate for your Studebaker and will ultimately and seriously damage your Studebaker's engine if ZDDP supplement is not added to it
