The 2010 committee members will then take small groups around the property and you will be able to see the ballroom, media center, etc. Afterwards we'll adjourn to a local café for a late lunch and you can then walk around Westgate and if so motivated see Cabela's, which is across Glendale Ave. from the venue.

I hope you'll all agree with me that this is an exciting time for you to belong to the Grand Canyon State Chapter of the SDC. Not only is this an active chapter but not many chapters actually step up and host an international meet. So, get excited, turn out for our chapter functions, drive your Studebaker on July 4th and please plan on attending the September meeting at the Renaissance to see just what a fine venue was selected for the 46th International Meet: The Best in the West!

#9 Avanti

On September 16, the #9 Avanti was the star performer at the Bonneville "GO" show, staged by Andy and Joe Granatelli. The R3 powered golden missile scorched the salt flats in excess of 170 MPH, toppling records as it went. When the assault was over, six new records had been established. Number 9 ran in the Class C Closed Car-Supercharged and also in the American Unlimited Class-Closed Car. Following are some of the records it now holds:

Flying Kilometer	170.78
Flying Mile	170.75
Flying 5 Kilometers	170.63
Flying 5 Miles	170.20
Flying 10 Kilometers	169.96
Flying 10 Miles	166.66

Number 9, while "stock" as far as the engine and drive train were concerned, had added safety features and extra instrumentation. In addition to the stock roll bar, a complete chrome-moly roll cage was built in to protect the driver. While making such things as rolling up the window a little awkward (you have to open the door), the roll cage wouldn't interfere with the everyday operation of the automobile. (In fact, the writer was fortunate enough to get to drive Ray Cash's #8 car, sister to #9, on the streets of Los Angeles and can report a roll cage lends a very comfortable feeling when that big R3 is turned on.)

Aircraft-type seat belt/shoulder harnesses which are attached to the floor and to the roll cage give the driver additional protection. The added instrumentation included the following units: two built-in Carbumeters (mounted on the roll bar) which measures richness/leaness of the exhaust gases at the tailpipe; an extra water temperature gauge; a supercharger oil temperature gauge; a Dixco tachometer mounted on the steering column; a dual pressure gauge and a dual manifold pressure gauge.

Of course, Number 9 wasn't the only Studebaker on the salt flats. A total of 72 USAC records fell to the group of cars brought by the Granatellis.

For instance, an R4 Gran Turisimo Hawk, Flying Kilometer-147.77; an R4 Daytona convertible, Flying Mile-147.17; a Skybolt 6 cylinder Sedan, Flying Mile-120.77. It is interesting to note that a '64 Daytona convertible with the same engine and basic chassis as the #9 Avanti came within 17 MPH of the Avanti's Flying Kilometer time, setting a new record of 153.44.

The twin-blown Due Cento was also very much in evidence at Bonneville. Joe Granatelli blasted across the wet salt for a two-way average of 194.35 for the Kilometer and a one-way run of 196.621. The Due Cento has a full belly pan and curious as to just how much difference a pan might make, the Granatellis made some runs with the pan removed. The loss was only 2-3 MPH, quite a tribute to Raymond Loewy's great design. The salt was so wet that further attempts to break 200 MHP with the experimental Avanti were abandoned.

All in all, September 16, 1963 was guite a day for the great Avantis.

Grandpa's Old Studebaker

Some of my earliest memories are of visiting my Grandpa when I was 6 or 7 years old. He lived 15 miles south of Grand Junction, Colorado under the shadow of the Grand Mesa at the start of Lands End Road on Kannah Creek. It was probably 1962 or 1963. Grandpa was a trapper and he lived alone in an old cabin. There were always fox and bobcat hides stretched out on his front porch. A couple of wooden planks made a walkway from the porch to a dug out garage where he kept his old gray 1953 Studebaker pickup. For a young boy, it was like stepping back in time.

We later moved to Colorado, about 7 miles from where Grandpa lived, and he would visit us in his pickup. Once it had rained and he got stuck in front of our house. He got all 6 grandkids and some of our friends to jump on the back while some pushed. He sprayed us all with mud as he got to the dry road and waved goodbye.

In 1967 Grandpa passed away and my Dad inherited the truck. The title was never found, but since my Dad and I had the same initials as grandpa, we just renewed the registration every year. And so it was still Grandpa's old Studebaker.

One by one my Dad tried to teach my three older sisters how to drive the cantankerous 4 speed stick, but the lessons always ended in frustration for all involved. A few times my friend and I would push the truck down the road out of ear shot, then start it up and go driving down country dirt roads. So, when I became old enough to drive my dad was pleasantly surprised that I mastered the 4 speed right away.

I drove the truck through High School and to my first couple of jobs. In 1975 a rod started knocking real bad, so I quit driving it to work. I didn't have the time or the money to fix the engine so I took it to Dad's and parked it. It remained there for several years until my youngest brother took some interest in it. He had it for several years, but it was not running. He had someone show an interest in buying it for parts. He called my next youngest brother first and he kept Grandpa's old Studebaker.

He put it back together and rebuilt the engine. He sanded and painted it and did some body work. He also located the title. He asked me if I wanted it a few times, but I had moved to Phoenix and did not have the money or the room to keep it. Last year my son asked, "What ever happened to that old truck you used to have?" I told him my brother had it, and he had offered to sell it to me, but I hadn't taken him up on it. He said, "Didn't it used to belong to your Dad?" I told him it used to belong to my Dad's Dad. He said, "You should get it. You could pass it down to my son and that would be 5 generations!" I agreed that if he offered again I would buy it. But I didn't think it would come about.

Then in April 2009, my brother called to say he needed to sell the truck but he wanted to give me the first chance. I said yes, and then talked to my wife. She reluctantly agreed. So with my wife, son, and brother all agreed I knew it was the right time. I quickly rented a trailer and headed for Grand Junction.

On the way back through Utah and Monument Valley I stopped and took pictures of the Studebaker in front of every rock formation along the way. It was a great trip! Now I am restoring it for my descendants. So it will always be Grandpa's old Studebaker!

atrick Foster has a nice 15-page history of the Avanti (all the way up to 2008) in the 1st Quarter 2009 issue of *Automobile Quarterly*. According to the subscription info in the latest issue, individual issues are available for \$25.95 plus shipping. They often have sales of back issues, but not of their most recent issues. Another Detailing Tip

Caring for Wide Whites

By Pat Dilling

or my white walls I use 400+ grit wet sandpaper. I wash them with soap and water first and sometimes use a brush to get the dirt off. Then, if there is a scuff or discoloration, I use the sandpaper. Another alternative would be the green Scotch-Brite.

I do not use the sprays on whitewalls themselves. I spray it on a sponge and apply it to the black part of the tire. That was guidance I got from DiamondBack Tires. Do not use any of the products that have bleach in them, like Bleach-White. That can cause the white walls to develop cracks. Also, make sure you keep proper inflation as low pressure causes the sidewall to flex more and can also cause problems.

I have tried a number of methods and this seems the best. I have had some whitewalls develop cracks and I'm pretty sure I can attribute it to the bleach products.

Follow the advice of the DB Tires folks.




