

I would also like to add that we want to encourage as many as possible to have their cars judged. Some think the cars must be perfect. That definitely is not the case. The main reason for having your car judged is to find what's authentic and to have its condition assessed. Lastly, most will win an award.

There is a possibility that TW could be poly-bagged to avoid this kind of damage but it will be more expensive.

Personalized Watches

n my collection of South Bend watches I have three watches with private labels. One is inscribed with H D Wenrich on the dial, one has Geo L Palmer on the dial and one has J H Hasonritter on the dial. The movements are all marked, 'South Bend Watch Company'. Today these watches are simply referred to has Private or Personalized Label Watches.

Cooksey Shugart, in his book *Complete Price Guide To Watches*, states that, "It was common practice for watch manufacturers to personalize watches for whole-salers, jobbers, jewelry firms, and individuals." Private label watches on full plate movements would have required a month's advanced notice and the cost would be about 80 cents. Private labels were placed on full plates of movements, on dials, or on both. Having your name placed on just the dial would have been somewhat cheaper. The Hamilton and Illinois Watch companies catered to these requests more often than any other companies. However, most watch manufacturing companies would do it.

Perhaps the most frequent private labels found were for larger companies such as Sears, Roebuck and Montgomery Wards who sold the private labels with their names on them from their own catalogs and company stores. Larger jewelry stores from large cities or who enjoyed national exposure also had private label watches made. Local jewelry stores who catered to prestigious neighborhoods would often have watches made with their stores name on it. Stores would also have personalized watches made for influential customers or specialized groups who wanted the distinction of having a watch with their name on it.

No one knows for sure how many private label pocket watches were made. They remain extremely rare but they do keep turning up. I believe that private label dials are more frequent than are private labeled movements. Finding a double private labeled watch, i.e. both dial and movement is extremely rare. The practice of individualizing dials increased as wristwatches became more popular. Today it is quite common to get a wristwatch with a special photo or name on the dial. Finding an antique pocket watch with a private label on either the dial or the movement is rare.

Technical Tip



HIGH COUNTRY RUNNING

A ltitude has a direct effect on the operation of any carburetor. The higher you go up, the thinner the air becomes and the richer the carburetor runs.

Since all Carter carburetors are calibrated at almost sea level, here is a "rule of thumb". Anytime you are above 4000 feet you need to lean the carburetor one thousand for every 1000 feet of altitude you go up. An example, if you are driving at 7000 feet, you need to reduce the primary jet size three thousands.


