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President's Message

he 2010 Monsoon started as a low pressure system swirling in the Gulf of Alaska. It slowly worked its way down the Pacific Coast coming on shore just north of Santa Barbara. Vestiges of the wind blew in from the sea tossing restlessly across the treetops. A few people were stirred in their sleep by the rustling percussion of dry palm fronds and broken tree limbs in the gathering wind against the ink washed sky. It moved leisurely over the nettle, pyracantha and coastal sage scrub of the bare coastal range of the Los Padres National Forest until it reached the vast rocky spaces of western Arizona. Here the low pressure system met up with the warm moist high pressure system circulating up from northern Mexico. In the early afternoon the pressure gradient slowly built until the winds began to pick up even more over the little central town of Prescott.

The air at first felt close then suddenly cooler, as the barometric pressure dropped and I tried to decide if I should roll up my window and drive in the humid air or leave it down and become drenched in the impending downpour. Looking out the tinted front windshield of my Packard Hawk I could see the white clouds begin to build and pass by like large ships against an azure sky. By the time I steered my Hawk safely home through the impending storm the pine and Honey Ash trees in my yard seemed to shake with a sudden white-green light as the wind blew out of the southwest. Safe in the garage I looked out over the Prescott National Forest and noticed the trees were loud with birds and the wind smelled of pine needles, pitch and shaggy juniper. In the middle distance I could hear someone's car alarm no doubt set off by the loud crashing of the thunder. In the far distance toward the New Horizon Mountains to the east dry lighting crackled to the point that one could almost smell the ozone.

As I stood transfixed watching Mother Nature's awesome display I could not help but be reminded that the next club function we might all consider will be at Malcolm Stinson's Studebaker Ranch in the high country of Show Low. One, of course, will know the weather will be sunny and cool so you are all encouraged to call Malcolm and make arrangements to attend on August 20-22.

As the Monsoon of 2010 fades away with the approach of fall we will begin to hold regular meetings starting with the September 4 'Drive Your Studebaker Day' (DYSD). As great as the last year's July 4th event was, Ed has promised an even finer event this year so watch for details in an upcoming ECHO.

Toward evening I walked out on my deck and listened to the water dripping off the tree limbs and the crickets began their chirping as the forest fell into its nightly routine. The sky in the west was turning a translu-

cent bone color and a few remaining dark clouds scudded by hull down on the western horizon. As the sun slipped beneath the earth's rim and with the 46th International Meet still fresh in my mind I would again like to take the opportunity to thank one and all for making this such a joyous meet and look forward to the October 3 meeting in which we will be able to personally thank each and every one of you. As our calendars tend to fill up quickly you might wish to mark down June 2110 as your club has volunteered to host the 146th International Meet so let's start getting ready! -30-



SDC Board Meeting

The Board meeting was held on Monday May 31, 2010. We started off with the usual committee reports. Cornerstone gave a membership report and noted that the new membership kept pace with the ones we lost. Bob Shaw is our current webmaster. He is stepping down so the position is open. It is a paid position. As many of you know Diane Glew is now in charge of the International Meet Committee. This is a very important position with all the expenses involved and the supervision of the facilities and numerous activities sponsored by the National organization and the chapter involved in the meet. Stepping into this meet in mid stream created a number of challenges which she handled extremely well.

The Chief Judge talked about a certification program for Judges that he plans to implement in the near future. In fact, I thought there were plans to start the program at our Zone Meet in Ontario.

As you know Dick Quinn is in possession of the Studebaker photo collection which covers the 1920's and 1930's. With the problem of old negatives there was talk of beginning a program to digitize the collection to preserve them from disintegration.

We are also looking for a new person to handle the Template collection. This project has been handled by David Mottle for many years.

Peter Crisitello came up with a program to salute all the recently deceased members in SDC. He had a wonderful display in the vendor hall honoring those recently departed. This was a fitting tribute. This will be an annual event.

The Studebaker Museum in South Bend gave a brief update on activities and pointed out that they still have a number of cars in the Museum that can be singled out under the Adopt-a-Car program. By adopting a car you can help sponsor the maintenance and upkeep of a particular vehicle.

We also agreed to donate \$5,900.00 to the Museum for a project under the Capital Cost campaign. We are now looking for a Chairman for this committee after the untimely demise of Phil Brown.

The National Foundation reported their financial status and noted that they are still helping students with tuition whose major in college is the restoration of automobiles. They also support the restoration of Studebaker vehicles held in other museums. This is another way of keeping the marque in the public eye.

There was also an extensive plan headed by Director Tom Curtis to recruit new members. More details on this to follow.

The big discussion at the Board meeting was a dues increase. After many discussions and suggestions the Board finally decided to increase the regular dues to \$31.00 effective December 31, 2010. They also noted that you can only prepay at the old rate for an additional year and not five years. Since the meet the Board has

approved other changes which will be published in *Turning Wheels*.

I voted against raising the dues. It is not because of the amount held in the reserve account because that has been designated for future projects and not because a dues increase would not be needed some time in the future but because I felt there were other cost cutting measures they could have invoked this year to save expenses and these reductions were not considered by the Board. There is no questions however, that *Turning Wheels* is a bargain even at \$31.00.

Tom Curtis, Jane Stinson and myself have been asked to set up an Investment Committee to keep a watchful eye on the balance in the reserve fund. I want to insure that we maintain a conservative approach to the protection of the funds.

48th in South Bend, Indiana July 29-Aug 4, 2012.

49th in Colorado Springs, Colorado July 1-July 6, 2013. 50th in Dover Downs, Delaware June 30-July 5, 2014.

Elections – all National Officers remain the same except for the position of Vice President. Richard Dormois has retired as Vice President after nine years of service to the club. In his place we elected Carl Thomason of Coarsegold, California.

ome up and join us here at the Studebaker Ranch for a cool weekend. Plan to arrive sometime on Friday evening and at about 6:00 P.M. I will supply my Mom's New England clam chowder plus I will have pizza here for you to enjoy. Stay as long as you like, as long as you can be ready for Saturday's tour starting 08:00 am sharp.

On Saturday we will meet in the D & D Furniture parking lot in the center of Show Low. We will then take a tour to the Painted Desert and the Petrified Forest. DATE-LINE! -- KINGMAN, ARIZONA By Dan Kuhl



Another bit of Studebaker history recently left Arizona for a new home back East. If you are a lover of Studebaker trucks like I am this is big news. The 1963 E15 Diesel pictured here was recently purchased by Ron

Hackenberger of Norwalk, Ohio. He is adding it to his collection of many Studebaker diesel trucks. He plans on constructing a museum around his many vehicles, including some brand-Xs that he has collected over many years of traveling out West. He pulls a four car trailer that he vows will never go back to Ohio empty.

The E15 Diesel is special because the Stude-baker Corporation made so few in the closing years of truck production. In 1962 they did not make any; in 1963 they produced 51, and 1964 manufactured 14. The E15 in the picture is powered by the 3-53, two cycle Detroit Diesel engine that put out 97 horsepower on a good day. It would be interesting to know how it did pulling that huge camper around the mountains of the West. By the way, Ron left that old camper in the desert outside of Kingman if anyone is interested.

Interested readers take note; there have been a number of articles about the Diesels of Studebaker in past issues *of Turning Wheels*. The best was the last, in October 1991.

TECHNICAL INFORMATION

When a horn has a mind of it's own...

One warm day last spring I went out to lock our 1950 Starlight Coupe. Actually, this was at our zone meet last May. When I closed the door the horn gave a little "beep". When I closed the other door, I heard the same little "beep". It was dark, so it was not a good time to investigate the cause. I disconnected the battery. The next day I connected the battery and it didn't need to have a door closed to honk the horn. I removed the horn wire from the horn relay and drove home. There I determined

the horn ring push back (sponge) had lost it's ability to keep the horn's electrical circuit open. It had been 21 years since it was installed. The international meet was in a few weeks, so I bought a reproduction horn sponge, (p/n 520411). Problem solved.



This same horn ring push back system is used on 1947 through 1956 Studebaker cars with a horn bar or ring. I'd recommend that you be aware of how it works, and possibly have a spare available, especially if you are not aware of it ever being replaced on your Studebaker.

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

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
