President's Message

The quartermaster was suddenly wide awake. Nearby he heard the clanking of swords and sound of boots on the ground and a little further away the soft whinny of horses and creak of leather harness' along with the curses of the teamsters as they wrestled teams into their traces. In the far distance he knew what had really awakened him: the line drummer's cadence and bugle's call forming up the men in battle lines. The quartermaster was dead tired having marched most of the night with Major General Wm. (Old Rosy) Rosecrans' Army of the Cumberland. They had force marched 15 miles from Ringgold and were now bivouacked on the high banks of the West Chickamauga River near Lafayette, GA.

To get a better view of the forested terrain he went to the edge of the bluff and trained his field binoculars to the south on Gen. Braxton Bragg's Army of the Tennessee. Listening to the drummer's cadence and bugle commands the butternut clad Confederate soldiers wheeled into line, the sun glinting off the bayonets and barrels of their Enfield rifles. Looking down he saw the Union Army forming up with an advanced line of skirmishers pushing slowly toward the oncoming Confederate ranks through the dense forest. He looked again across the river and saw his troops faced Gen. Stonewall Jackson's crack division. His hands trembled just a bit as he pulled the Hamilton watch out of his blouse and saw it was 9 am on Saturday, September 19, 1863; the Battle of Chickamauga was about to start. He knew what he had to do and that was to assemble the Studebaker wagons in support of the advancing army. Being from South Bend he knew of the quality that went into Studebaker wagons since the Studebakers first started in business in February of 1852.

From the first Conestoga wagon John Studebaker built in 1835 the wagon business had flourished. In 1861 Studebaker built President Lincoln's carriage and now they were building sturdy Thimble Skein Wagons that featured the Sloped Shouldered Spoke which eliminated wedges traditionally used to make spoke wheels. Studebaker was also employing the Grant's Shifting Rail, which made field repairs relatively easy. In 1862 they began building the 'Rocker' Ambulance, which the guartermaster knew all to well would be needed later on that day and featured special 'rockers' to help give the ambulance a smooth ride. The quartermaster knew he needed to supply the 5th Indiana Light Artillery with caissons and made sure they had the ones built by Studebaker that featured the all steel axle, which made them especially tough considering the terrain they had to traverse. With his Studebaker wagons at the ready to deliver supplies the guartermaster knew it would be a long day. The battle actually lasted two days ending with the Army of the Cumberland retreating 20 miles north in their Studebaker wagons to Chattanooga, TN.

The two days of fighting saw some 34,562 soldiers either killed, wounded or missing, the second highest casualty rate of the Civil War, second only to the 37,000 casualties suffered in the three days of fighting at Gettysburg. Gen. Rosecrans' Chief of Staff, one John A. Garfield would become president of the United States some 25 years later only to be killed shortly after taking office on July 2, 1881. While the Civil War did not make the Studebaker brothers rich it did set the stage for them to form the Studebaker Bros. Manufacturing Co. in 1868 with sales of around \$350,000. The rest is history.

Some 114 years, one month and 25 days later the GCSDC will meet at the Grainger's on November 13. Your club board plans on holding a meeting on November 7 so if the spirit so moves you, you can drop by and see your club officers in action. Since it's at the Deer Valley Airport Coffee Shop most of the action will involve eating lots of grilled cheese sandwiches and drinking gallons of black coffee but it's true that your board, like an army, marches on it's stomach. Please be sure to read about past events in this month's *ECHO* and we hope to see you down the road in a Studebaker. -30-

We decided that this year we would come back home for the November gathering. This year plan to bring your other than Studebaker hobby stuff for some hobby show & tell and awards.

12:30 PM Greetings, salutations, kick the tires, preparation for the slow drags and set up your hobby stuff in the shop. Park you trucks & cars in the back, down Studebaker Ave. to the grass. Brand X's park in the front along the drag strip. If you plan to race in the drags, park your Stude on the circle drive in front.

1:00 PM Slow drags out front. If you have never done this before, come prepared with a suitable screw driver with which to adjust your engine idle down as low as it will go and still run and make your Stude move. The idea is to see who takes the longest to reach the end of the 300' course. The drag strip is level, pretty much. There will be 4 classes. 2:00 PM Hobby show and truck & car show. Be prepared to bring an award for something to do with Studebakers using your hobby. For instance - sew a patch, paint a picture, take a photo, scrimshaw a chunk of bone or tie a

special fly or some different idea of your own. Then during the meeting, before the general meeting, pick a Stude amongst the ones on display that you think deserves your special award. You can base your award on anything you want for example: cleanest steering wheel, largest tires, prettiest semaphore, nicest looking knee action shock, nicest interior or just because you like it. Tell our awards person, Barbara Grainger, that you have an award, what it is, what it is for and what / who you want to award it to. During the meeting you will have an opportunity to tell the assembled masses who the lucky winner is.

TECHNICAL INFORMATION



Jump Starting a 6 Volt Battery By Harold Mueller

f you are in a bind with a 6 volt battery and you have to boost it with 12 volts I don't recommend going 12 to 6. It is dangerous, hard on the ignition system and gauges. The best way to handle it is to turn on the ignition (JUST ignition, not start). Take the booster cables, put one cable right to the starter or the cable that goes to the starter at the solenoid. Take the other cable and find a good ground and jab the cable to the ground fast and hold it tight. You will get a brief spark. You now have control of the starter only. The 12 volts are only going to the starter and not the rest of the system. I am assuming you had the booster cables hooked to the booster battery or to some other source before you hooked it up to the dead vehicle. Don't forget to check the polarity.

Run to the Pines


