THE USS ARIZONA

You say, "why is this ship in the *ECHO*?' For two very good reasons, the first is the important role Studebaker played in providing military equipment during WWII and the second the fact that two of our Studebaker friends recently restored this beautiful model of the USS Arizona in preparation for the Veteran's Day celebrations.


The model ship originally built in 1985 by Pat and Cecil Gates sat in the Arizona heat and became so dilapi-



dated the Gates' decided it was time for a restoration. However, due to health issues they were unable to do the work. Club members Bill Schonemann and Dennis Roeper offered to do the work. In their spare time these craftsmen took three years to bring the ship into the condition it is today.

The USS Arizona started its existence as a ship in the 1970 movie *Tora-Tora-Tora*. Cecil Gates, an industrial arts teacher, had little difficulty completing the ship that was powered by two sailboat engines in 1985. In 1991, the Gates' took the ship to Pearl Harbor for the 50th Anniversary of the attack that started WWII in the Pacific. Now that the restoration is completed, it is again a masterpiece, but without any means of powering it. The hull is made of fiberglass and the superstructure is mostly aluminum. It is 35 feet long and weighs 5400 pounds. It is so large that a six wheel trailer is required to transport it around the Valley.

The current owners, Wanda and Perry Sartain, are making the USS Arizona available to anyone hosting a veteran's celebration. On Saturday November 6th the ship was displayed in the Anthem Parade and on November 10th it was on display at Larry Swanson's Veterans Day eve concert in Sun City. The ship was also in the Veteran's Day Parade in Phoenix on November 11th.



Big thanks goes out to Wanda and her husband for making memories come alive for WWII veterans. And big thanks goes out to Bill and Dennis for doing such a great job on the ship's restoration.

Chapter Dues

My wife wisely opted out, she sometimes has a sixth sense about things. But I was determined to go, so she baked me some brownies, printed off a map with no freeways (my pickup will only go 50mph), and off I went.

It was a fantastic drive. The weather was perfect! When I arrived at the meeting we had a great meal and I enjoyed talking "Studebaker" with several nice people. When I started home I thought I would go down University to Scottsdale and have a nice leisurely drive home through the fancy part of town.

I was just beginning to think that my wife was really missing out when I stepped down on the clutch and SNAP! it went clear down to the floorboard and staved there, and the truck died. 


