

In Memory of Paul Grainger

My dad died Saturday, December 4th. He was 94. He had been at the Arbor Rose Hospice for only a few days. In the weeks prior to him going to the hospice we talked about life, family, what he had done and what he was responsible for (me, my sister and all of his four



grandkids and eight great grandkids). He was near by and I made it a habit to drive Toto to where he was at the time, either the hospital, nursing home or his apartment. He enjoyed riding in Toto and

we did that as often as he was able. The picture that I have attached is of him in Toto on our way to the Barber shop, one of our favorite monthly jaunts in the Stude-baker. He enjoyed attending the Chapter meetings and being with everyone.

Survivor Division

There has been discussion among Board Members about establishing a "Survivor Division" at a National Meet. The cars would be qualified as a "Survivor Car" by the National Judge. They would receive a certificate but would not be judged. It will start at the National Meet in Missouri this summer. I don't know how this will work for a Zone Meet. That can be determined later. The purpose is to encourage members to display their cars.

Please note the proposal below. The final vote was 8 in favor, 4 no votes, 2 abstentions and one Director did not vote.

The proposal as made by Carl Thomason:

The Survivor Division is to recognize preservation, not restoration. The ideal "Survivor" is one that is totally original. It has never been painted. It still retains its original upholstery, the engine is all original and runs, the chrome is original and all its parts are original. The ideal would be represented by a car that has been garaged all its life, driven minimally, maintained and still looks like it came from the factory. Each car will be evaluated in 4 different categories:

Exterior: This category is worth 30 points. A car that has never been repainted, has original chrome, original glass, original wipers, etc would receive the full 30 points. To the extent it has been repainted or touched up, has been re-chromed, new glass or any other parts replaced, it would receive fewer points. A five point deduction for each variance would be deducted.

Interior: A 30 point car would have original interior, as from factory. To the extent some parts have been replaced, upholstery has been replaced, new carpets, modern radio added, etc it would lose points.

Engine: The 30 point car would be completely original, with no replacement parts. The only replaced parts that won't earn a point deduction are tires, lights, hoses, belts, air and oil filter. Those should be replaced with original type parts. If other parts have been replaced, rebuilt, wiring redone or modifications made, it would lose points.

Condition: This category is worth 10 points. A top car would be in excellent condition overall. This category allows for a distinction to be made between the beautifully maintained original vehicle and one that has deteriorated. While the deteriorated one may still qualify as a "Survivor", it shouldn't get as many points as one that is in much better condition.

If a car gets at least 75 point it gets a decal indicating it is original enough to qualify as a "Survivor". The owner will get a decal and a certificate indicating it has been certified.

The committee felt the best way to handle this new category is to hold a demonstration/seminar in Springfield using a sample Survivor car and then double check afterwards to see how things went. The formal beginning would then be at the South Bend meet (in 2012).

Bleeding brakes doesn't have to be hard..... By Leonard Brewer

recently purchased a product I am impressed with called Speed Bleeder. It re-

places the bleeder screw on the wheel cylinder. These bleed screws have a built in check valve that allows fluid to come



out but no fluid or air is allowed to return. This allows one person to bleed brakes and works very well.

There are other brands available but they don't seem to work as well. I ordered mine directly from Speed Bleeder, at a cost of \$7.00 each.

A STUDEBAKER'S WORK IS NEVER DONE

While Scott Grainger was restoring Toto, a 1946 M16 truck, Harold was working on his 1953 Ford NAA Golden Jubilee tractor. Why a tractor, you ask? Well, you can take the boy off of the farm, but you can't take the farm out of the boy and Harold is a farm boy. He grew up on the Locust Knoll Dairy farm in Pennsylvania and operated tractors for years as part of farm life. The tractors included Ford and Allis Chalmers and he never lost his love of the Ford. The one Ford he always wanted was the Jubilee, but it took until 1998 to acquire one. His brother found it at a farm sale in Pennsylvania and even though we were working on the Speedster at the time we decided to buy the tractor and restore it when the Speedster was finished.

It took a year to finally have the Ford delivered to Arizona and it arrived on a transport filled with Mercedes and BMW cars on their way to California. When the truck arrived you could hardly see the little Ford on the bottom level of the transport and Harold had to drive it off and into the back yard. Since all of the garage and shop space was full the rusty Jubilee was relegated to a space outside under a tarp which was replaced each year for 6 long years. During that time the little Ford did do some work even though it's tires were worn and the right rear rim was rusting through. The work consisted mainly of pushing the Speedster rolling chassis up on ramps to be restored and then bringing it off of the ramps when necessary. If only the Speedster knew that it was being pushed around by a rusty tractor and a Ford at that!

Well, the Speedster was finally completed in 2004 and we took a break from hours of restoration while the Jubilee waited patiently. In 2005, it was time to begin the restoration and after practicing on the Speedster we felt ready. This Ford is special because it was the vehicle Henry Ford chose to commemorate the Ford Motor Company's 50th Anniversary. Many new parts had been purchased in advance and the tractor was completely disassembled, then many hours of sandblasting, cleaning, repair, bodywork, painting and reassembly went into the project. Harold re-built the engine, transmission and brakes, installed a new PTO shaft and went through every mechanical aspect of the tractor. As his assistant I cleaned many greasy parts including the gears in the rear end and in general helped him complete this labor of love.

Our goal then became to complete the Ford by the spring of 2010 so it could be entered in the March tractor pull for the Arizona Early Days Gas Engine and Tractor Association. Nearing that goal we realized we needed a way to take

the tractor to the Apache Junction Rodeo Grounds since you can't drive a tractor that far on city streets. Enter Scott, our neighbor and his newly restored M16. Could he possibly transport the Ford to the show on Toto, why of course. So the tractor was loaded on a Friday and taken to a scale for weighing, then on



to the show. What a pair they made, the new Ford Jubilee perched on the bed of Toto. Since that day Toto has been in parades, shows and even movies. Not bad for a work truck, right.? The Ford was well received at the show and even pulled 178% of it's weight in the tractor pull. Then Toto came back on Sunday and the two made the trip home.

You see, no matter how old a Studebaker gets it's work is never done even if that means transporting a brand x. Thanks, Scott and Toto, for the ride. Happy Trails.
