
Under old business, Deanna Manley presented Bill Cervini an award and belated thanks for serving as signage chairman at the International SDC Meet.

The new Scottsdale International Auto Museum (a 501c3 non-profit) opened during December at the Scottsdale Pavilions (101 & Indian Bend Road). Housed in the 75,000 square foot former Mervyn's Department store, it is located on the south side of Indian Bend Road behind the 5 & Diner restaurant.

This unique family-oriented car museum will showcase around 100 vintage vehicles on a rotating basis and provides lots of spaces for corporate and charitv events, parties, car club meetings, displays and various special events. It also features the world's largest museum gift shop and a themed cafe. The SIA Museum is readjusting its hours after January's car auction crowds passed through and will be opening now at 10am 7-days a week during the spring and will be closing at various times in the evening after business dies down and folks stop coming in.

Be sure to tell your friends to ask for the car club discount to get 1/2 price (\$5.00) museum admission. Active Military and First Responders also get in for 1/2 price, and, if you come here on your birthday, you'll get free admission.

The museum organizers are also busy making plans to host a constant variety of car club and vehicle related events there during the coming year. Here is an excerpt from the article: "During his 31- year career as a jet and industrial turbine repairman, Ken Michael started collecting, driving. and restoring Studebakers as a hobby. Recall that Indiana-based Studebaker sold it's last car in 1966. Studebakers were occasionally competitive- A.J.Foyt raced one in 1953.- and a reputation for durability came from winning the 4000 mile 1961 Trans-Canada Winter Rally. Michael fell hard for the styling of the Raymond Loewydesigned Studebaker Starlight coupe he brought in 1959. as well as the six other Studebakers in his collection. After retiring in 2002, he expected to split his time between fishing and restoring his cars. But people with Studebakers started to call him to fix their cars. The Studebaker needy kept piling up; last summer, Michael hired two technicians to help him with the seven customer cars he is restoring. For each job that he takes, he has to turn down two. We visited his shop in Payson, Arizona to find the secret of his prosperity." Congratulations on the recognition, Ken.

The Discovery Channel series, Desert Car Kings, will feature the restoration of a **1950 Champion** Business Coupe by the crew at Desert Valley Auto Parts on a segment which will first air February 16th. From The Toy Box

This toy review is for the M2 Machines, 1954 Studebaker Tow Truck. It is a 2010 release made by M2 Auto-Thentics a registered trademark for Castline, Inc.

Arcadia, CA and is also known as M2 Machines. The toy was released in two different style of packages. It is available in a plastic bubble wrap carton and



as a box with a hard plastic display case. Both varieties have the hard plastic base with the title 1954 Studebaker 3R Tow Truck.

The toy is die-cast body and bed. The toy has great detail for it's 1/64 scale. It has a single one piece plastic windshield. The doors and hood open and shut. The doors have a Studebaker red-ball decal in the center lower half. The lower rear edge of the hood has a Studebaker emblem. Under the hood is a very nice detailed 6 cylinder engine with silver painted head, black air cleaner, manifold, battery and a red oil filter. The grille is correct for 1954 and is painted white with chrome headlight rings and glass looking headlights. Inside the tow body is a plastic tower for the boom. It has red warning lights mounted on top of the boom tower that are housed in chrome colored housings. The boom has a winch, cable and hook. The back of the bed has red tail taillights. It also sports a chrome trailer hitch. Inside the cab is a nicely detailed interior with tan seats, a black dash and steering wheel. Inside the doors are window cranks, door handles and arm rests. The dash even sports the utility dash/dome light.

The wheels are painted with small chrome hub caps and black tires. The chassis is serviceable but does not have the same quality of detailing displayed in the rest of the toy. Also, the rear cab window appears to be the later wider style adopted by Studebaker in 1955. The emblem on the hood is in block letters instead of the oval emblem introduced in 1954. It would be more correct if this toy was titled as a 1955 Studebaker.

VALVE COVER RACING

ere are the official rules for a Studebaker Valve Cover Racer to race at March Madness, March 19th.

1. Total weight cannot exceed 10 pounds. We will have an official scale.

2. Must be a Studebaker valve cover.

3. Total length must not exceed 10% over stock length of original valve cover.

4. Dimensions may be no larger than 12" high or 12" wide.

5. No sharp edges or sharp protrusions on the racer.6. Must be gravity powered. Absolutely no other power source allowed.

Whitewall Replacements

To have a correct look, Studebaker replacement tires should have a size close to that supplied when new. "Fully correct" means that one would duplicate the bias belt tires all Studebakers were equipped with at the factory.

Vendors such as Coker Tire (and others), are involved in the selection for both bias-ply and radial, and they have whitewalls. The radial replacement for later models would be P205-75R15, and until recently, whitewall have been available from Dunlop and from Kelly, but no longer. Figuring the replacement R-series tire is not too difficult, but does require some Jr. Hi math to get the proper diameter, which will effect not only the look, but the final drive ratios.

The proper size for a Lark radial tire is 205-75R15. 205 is tire width in millimeters (8.07 inches). Multiply width by the 75% aspect ratio, or 6.05 inches, plus the wheel size of 15-inches. This equals a wheel diameter of 27.1 inches. If you like a lower look, or want to match a wheel/tire combination and go with a 70 series, an R-15 tire would be 26.3 diameter.

This gives rise to the rule of 1; for each lower aspect ratio, it is recommended we increase wheel size by 1. Going from 75 to 70 we go up 1 from a 15, to 205-70R16.

What we have here is part mechanical and part style or cosmetics. Some of these low profile tires simply do not look good on older cars. Some of them approach the look of a thick rubber band. While I do like radials for safety reasons, I am aware that our Studebaker suspensions rely on some tire "compliance" to work properly, so extreme aspect ratios such as 70s & lower, do not help overall handling and ride.

Locally available whitewalls in the proper size can

be found in Kumho Solus KR-21. These are also hard to find in the sizes we need,

but some are available in radials. Black wall tires in the 20570R15 size are plentiful since small pickups and vans use them.



So buy the wheels and tires that tickle your fancy for that look you desire. Make sure that the final size does not alter drive ratios and speedometer readings by doing the math.
