From the President....

Anna Mary Robertson Moses was seventy-six when she took up painting as a hobby; as Grandma Moses she won international fame and at 100 she was still painting. Frank Lloyd Wright completed New York's Guggenheim Museum at age 89 and he continued teaching until his death.

At 81, Benjamin Franklin effected the compromise that led to the adoption of the U.S. Constitution.

At 85, Coco Chanel was the head of a fashion design firm.

At 89, Albert Schweitzer headed a hospital in Africa.

At 90, Pablo Picasso was producing drawings and engravings.

At 99 years in business, Studebaker introduced their first overhead valve V-8. Initially offered in the '51 Commander, the new engine displaced 232 cubic inches and developed 120 horse power. With the arrival of 1952 Studebaker celebrated its first 100 years of business. The successors to the Studebaker brothers and the citizens of South Bend celebrated the milestone with enthusiasm. Parades, books, and memorabilia of all descriptions was handed out. Studebaker even provided the pace car for the Indianapolis 500.


Ruthie & Willard each enjoyed a banana split.



47th International Meet, Springfield, Missouri, June 20-24th, 2011

A nother wonderful meet is under our belts. Every year I experience new events, different cars and meet new friends. This year was no exception.

I arrived on Saturday June 18, 2011. After a long trip I retired early. Around 12:30 AM I was called by the receptionist in the lobby and was advised that there was a tornado warning. I got dressed and went down to the lobby and gathered with others in an internal meeting room. A half hour later the all clear was given and we returned to our rooms. The weather was right for a tornado; thunder and lightning, 50 mile an hour winds and a heavy dose of rain. The potential tornado was close but never touched down. What an experience if you have never been in this situation. I'll take an earthquake any day. There were other thunder storms but they were in the evening including one the evening of the car show. Thanks for waiting until the show was finished.

The Board meeting took up the bulk of Monday, the 20th. We have taken actions through the mail during the year but this is our one opportunity as a group to go over club business. I will not give a blow by blow report but I do want to cover some of the major issues.

Our Treasurer, Jane Stinson, presented a balanced budget for the new year. As you know we have a large sum held in a money market account. The Investment Committee decided to solicit a recommendation on how to invest these funds on a conservative basis to increase the income in our treasury and then report back to the Board for a final decision.

Bank of America has dropped our affinity card arrangement. The club will be looking for a new bank to take over the affinity card. More will follow in *Turning Wheels*.

The Capital Cost Committee was set up to maintain the building and maintenance of the museum in South Bend. This year they requested and received several thousand for various structural repairs. The Restoration Fund is used to repair and restore cars in the museum collection. No request for funds was made this year. As you will note on the membership renewal form there is a box for an optional donation of \$1.00 to the above funds as well as the Studebaker National foundation.

Tom Curtis is the Chairman of the Membership Recruitment Committee. His new forms has modernized our recruitment efforts including "We Invented Cool". He is considering additional forms to aid in our recruiting new members.

We have a number of contracted positions that were up for renewal this year including *Turning Wheels* Editor, Membership Secretary, Publications Director, Printer and Membership Contact Liaison. We found a better way to pass on membership reports and eliminated the Membership Contact position. The incumbents were all given a new contract. We did have a rival for the Printers contract.

We then spent some time going over several committee reports. The club selected a new Webmaster. Jim Pepper gave a report on how a car would qualify as a "Survivor Car" at a National or Zone Meet. He gave a demonstration on the day of the car show on how a car might qualify as survivor car. A sticker and certificate would be given for those who qualify. The purpose of this category is to acknowledge cars that are mostly original but do not want to be judged at a meet. More information to follow.

No decision was made on what to do with the Club Store. A proposal will be presented to the Board in the near future. Please contact our President if you know of some one who might be interested in the position.

The Museum mentioned a new Capital Campaign to raise several million including 5 year pledges by our members. The primary purpose is to become self sufficient with an endowment fund so they can live off the income and to raise funds to hire a Curator. They also want to get back into the restoration of cars in the collection. They also noted that the 1947 woody wagon will be completed in time for the national meet next year in South Bend.

The Foundation also gave a report on their efforts to raise funds to provide scholarships for SDC members and to restore Studebakers in other car collections. The foundation had a few items that were sold at the auction Wednesday night.

Richard Dormois requested funds to put on our annual exhibit at Hershey this year. The request was approved. Art Unger gave a report on *Turning Wheels*. I don't have to say much here. You all know what a fine publication we have in SDC. All you need to do is compare it to other car club publications to appreciate the efforts of Art and Ann Turner.

Our Vice President, Carl Thomason, gave a report on the elections during the year. He is also responsible for the stationary and advertising. Elections announcements for the coming elections will be printed in *Turning Wheels* later this year.

Diane Glew gave a report on the International Meet Committee. All you need to do is to watch her for a few minutes and you can tell how active she is behind the scenes to help make a meet this size such a success. The meets for the coming years are as follows:

2012 - South Bend

2013 - Colorado Springs

2014 - Dover, Delaware

2015 - St. Louis

46th International Meet continued...

St. Louis was voted on this year. Dover will be our 50th anniversary. It sure would be nice if we could have another one in California again. I think two chapters could co-chair a meet.

There were also minor changes made to the by-laws. They mostly effect Board actions. A revised set of by-laws should be available in the near future.

The last thing for the Board Monday was to elect new National Officers. Mimi decided not to run for a third term. Tom Curtis from Indiana is our new President. The Vice President, Secretary, and Treasurer were all reelected. Ed Reynolds was replaced under the by-laws as Immediate Past President by Mimi Halgren.

The meeting started at 8 AM and was adjourned at 5:45 PM. I hope I did not miss too much. That took up most of the first day (at least for the Board Members). Ice cream was served at Welcome Night that evening.

I want to thank Nita Ketchum – Chairman of the meet and all the members from the Ozark Trails Chapter who worked hard behind the scenes to pull this off in style. Meets like this don't just happen without all the hard work in advance and during the meet. You have earned the opportunity to sit back and enjoy South Bend.

Special kudos to Mimi Halgren for all the sacrifices she has made as our International President for two years. I know of all the efforts that go into the Presidency and Mimi made a yeoman's effort to tackle problems and bring forth positive results. You have also earned a rest.






