



DRIVE YOUR STUDEBAKER DAY



CHAPTER MEETING



TECHNICAL INFORMATION



BRAKES

We tend to take them for granted. You push on the pedal and stop. Or, you might step on the pedal and it feels like you stepped on a ripe plum. Or the worse case is a panic stop and a line breaks. You grab the emergency brake, pull, the cable is frozen from lack of use. Now the Toyota wagon in front of you has the imprint of your bullet nose in his tail gate.

How old are the rubber brake lines? Federal guide lines say don't use a tire that is older than 10 years. The steel lines can rust and break especially where it is clamped to the frame. Check the line at the front where is hooks to the rubber line, on the rear above the differential where the steel line hooks to the rubber hose and across the differential where they are clamped and at the backing plate. Every 2 years, remove all the fluid from the master cylinder. (If you use a turkey baster, be careful not to pull the fluid into the squeeze blub as it will melt.) Use a lint free cleaning towel to the clean the bottom of the master cylinder. Fill with new DOT 3 brake fluid. Bleed the brakes to flush the crud out of the wheel cylinders. Inspect and repair the emergency brake as needed. While under the hood check the rubber hose for the oil pressure gage at the rear of the right cylinder head. Wiggle that hose around and if you hear it cracking, replace it. It can break while driving and pump the oil out burning up your engine. Happy and safe Studebakering.

THE PLAYERS HAVE CHANGED BUT THE STORY IS THE SAME

Recently, I went to South Bend to do research at the Studebaker National Museum Archives. While there, I happened upon a book entitled Studebaker, the Life and Death of an American Corporation by Donald T. Critchlow. I tried to find a copy of this book for sale in South Bend, but with no luck, ended up purchasing a copy on Amazon.

The book, written in 1966, is very entertaining and quite informative about the many changes in the business of operating the Studebaker Company over its relatively long association with the transportation industry. It contains a great deal of company history that I have not seen in my vast library on Studebaker history.

The following is a section taken from Chapter Two that demonstrates that history does repeat itself as is often stated to the youth of America. The repeated part of history is taken from Page 63 of the text, in a chapter that is addressing the many changes that facilitated the company's efforts to move from horse drawn vehicles to automobiles. Soon after J.P. Morgan funneled monies into the company, in support of the changing industry, "The entrance of Goldman Sachs and Lehman into the corporation changed the fundamental nature of Studebaker. No longer would Studebaker be a family business.

New kinds of managers came to the corporation – financial men, accountants, and efficiency experts. In this way Fish (Frederick Fish, son-in-law to J.M. Studebaker and chairman of the executive committee, lead Studebaker into the automobile age) was to be a purveyor of a future not envisioned by the family."

The big New York bankers entered into Stude-baker's business a little over 100 years ago on February 14, 1911, and with their entrance, the last two Studebaker board members resigned and were replaced with banking representatives. By the end of the decade the Studebaker name had become a symbol of the distant past. In this regard, Scott Brown the new corporate counsel for the Studebaker Corporation was told that, "retention of the Studebaker family name by the corporation was for advertising purposes and preservation of good will."

So, where are we today? Again, the same big banks are forcing their will on us, with the blessing of the government that is supposed to regulate their underhanded activities. So in fact, history does repeat itself, but the message is often missed because it is muffled by corporate propaganda. Just think of those great Studebaker advertising films incorporating family values back to the Brother's first horse drawn wagon. And at the same time, don't forget how lucky we are to have all of those great Studebaker cars they manufactured.
