The Hall of Flame (largest fire protection museum in the US and possibly the world) hosted a truck show on a beautiful Saturday afternoon, November 5th. There were 7 Studebaker trucks in attendance. What a refreshing scene.



Most Studes were in a single line. John Amoroso's original condition M5 got the pole position at the entrance and Toto was near the back in a deep stall near the very large trucks ('57 Kenworth & early 60's or late 50's Peterbuilt). Dennis Roeper's Tow Mater was a big hit with the kids. Many of them with their folks posed in front of the smiling Studebaker! The only other make with more trucks was Chevy with 9 as I recall. Not too bad for a recent addition to the Orphan class of trucks.

One of the more interesting trucks for me was a '54 Dodge Power Wagon in original condition. It was possibly the only "small truck" there that may get poorer mileage than Toto (10.5). Dodge owners didn't show up in droves for this show; there were 2 Dodges in the show.

The Museum provided a place for lunch and sold hotdogs and hamburgers for \$1. Everyone in attendance had a good time. The museum is not on what one could consider a busy street so advertisement is important. I trust that the local clubs will help in advertising the event to a greater extent next year to increase the public attendance. A few signs on Washington might have helped as well. I had a very good time looking at the trucks and not having to walk around a bunch of cars to see them! The best time was visiting with friends and seeing the museum again. It is well worth the trip, especially if you have not been there. It is not just fire trucks but the trucks are many and very well maintained. TECHNICAL INFORMATION

Using Liquid Electrical Tape By Terry Chase



A nyone who has worked under a dashboard knows how hard it is to splice wires and/or repair frayed wires using traditional electrical tape. The tight confines make it nearly impossible to make secure repairs. I recommend liquid electrical tape, which easily can be applied with a brush. This product comes in tubes, cans or bottles and can be found at automotive parts retailers or hardware stores.

For splicing, I recommend first using shrink tube wrap around the splice, followed by several coatings of liquid tape. The combination creates a strong bond that is waterproof and much more attractive than the usually used electrical tape. Liquid electrical tape also can be directly applied to the splice or frayed area.


