

PROPOSED CHANGE TO GCSC BY-LAWS

The board is requesting the following changes to Article 3, Section 4: Expenditure of Chapter Funds of \$50.00 \$100.00 or More

Any expenditure of Chapter funds of \$50.00 \$100.00 or more to pay debts or for any other purpose shall be brought up to the membership present at a regularly scheduled business meeting. A majority vote will be required by the membership present before any funds can be expended. If an emergency should arise and an expenditure of \$50.00 \$100.00 or more has to be made before a regularly scheduled business meeting, the Board may make the expenditure. A full disclosure of the expenditure shall be made by the Treasurer in the report given at the next business meeting, and in the report published in the Chapter publication.

As costs keep rising the current \$50.00 limit requires the membership approve most normal operating expenditures. This increase would allow the board to approve payments under \$100.00. Membership approval would still be required for amounts over \$100.00.

The by-law change will be voted on at the Chapter's March meeting.

Rattle Can Maintenance

fter you have tipped your aerosol can up side down to bleed all the paint out of the tube and nozzle, store it upside down. That way when it sits for a long time and you don't shake it good enough, the tube or nozzle is not as quick to plug up. I usually pull off the nozzle and store it in a small jar of lacquer thinner filled almost to the top. When the can is empty, I save most of the nozzles and put them back in the jar. Put the cover back on the jar so it doesn't evaporate.

- 5. No sharp edges or sharp protrusions on the racer.
- Must be gravity powered. Absolutely no other power source allowed.




