

#### SAN SECURES U.S. SENATE RESOLUTION DESIGNATING JULY 13th AS "COLLECTOR CAR APPRECIATION DAY"

Lawmakers Acknowledge Importance of Collection and Restoration of Collector Cars



The U.S. Senate passed Senate Resolution 452 (S. Res. 452) at the request of the SEMA Action Network (SAN) designating July 13, 2012 as "Collector Car Appreciation Day." The date marks the third commemoration in what has become an annual event to

celebrate and raise awareness of the vital role automotive restoration and collection plays in American society.

Event organizers will be sent a copy of the official Senate Resolution for display at each event.

States, cities and two Canadian provinces joined the U.S. Senate last year by passing their own proclamations and resolutions. This year, the Hawaii State Legislature has already passed two resolutions and several other states are pursuing similar initiatives.

Johnson famous race car driver who raced Studebakers in the Indianapolis 500 during the 30s. The lady gave us her husband's mementos and at the same time instilled in me

Luther Johnson's racing accomplishments at the Indianapolis 500 have been well documented, but little has been written about his special talent that he demonstrated at the Studebaker Proving Grounds during a dealer new-

car showcase. At this show, Luther was blindfolded and a hood was placed over the blindfold to ensure that couldn't see. He then drove a Studebaker around the track in reverse at a very high rate of speed and stopped the car in front of the grandstand filled with mesmerized dealer representatives.

If you go to the 2012 International Meet in South Bend and are fortunate to drive the Proving Ground Track, as I did during the last South Bend International Meet, imagine what it would be like to drive around the track with your eyes covered. You can bet the thought will be more than a little disconcerting!

#### TIRE TIPS

by Malcolm Berry

Something that may be overlooked on our collector cars is the age of the tires. Most collector car tires never wear out the tread. The cars are driven very few miles each year. Although the tires may still look good, they can be dangerous because of deterioration. The question is how long is it safe to use your tires? Many tire and car manufacturers recommend changing all tires after six years. With cars that driven regularly, it's not a problem because the tread will be

gone before six years. So, how do they figure out a time frame of six years? By looking at a number of factors: the rate at which rubber decays, how the average person cares for his/her tires, real-life data on tire failure and the tire sales numbers. Most tires have a date code on them. Before you buy the tires be sure to check the manufacturer date on them. They could be a year or two old when you buy them.

If you drive your car to local shows and exclude highway driving, you can probably get by with driving on these tires for a longer period of time. However, if you drive your car at highway speeds, tires need to be changed sooner.

Personally, I've had a five year old tire explode on the highway. I'd rather be safe than sorry. When you think about the money invested in your car, new tires are cheap insurance!



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
