COLD STARTS

With winter coming on, I have decided to do a couple of articles about starting cars under difficult conditions. The first installment is about my friend's 1924 EK Big Six, located in Hastings, MN. This the same great town in which my 1959 Deluxe Scotsman sold new and the same Hastings where the world famous Spiral Bridge, built in 1895, spanned the Mississippi River (see photo). As noted in previous articles this Big Six came with many unusual features. Of interest for this article is the engine's "choke" system that you may not be familiar with. Not unlike the choke found on a more modern Studebaker, the system supplies extra fuel to each combustion chamber when the engine temperature prevents an opti-

mum fuel-air mixture for ignition.

As noted in the photo of the engine compartment, there is a threaded hole next to each of the six sparkplugs.

Each hole contains a threaded "L" shaped rod with a wooded handle on it. I believe the handle is made of walnut. On a cold morning, the lucky driver would remove these "Primer Plugs" and squirt a small amount of gasoline into each cylinder, using the small gas can similar to the one mounted on the firewall in the photo.

I guess there is no getting up late for work with this system. In the next article I will offer suggestions on how you can get up late and get your car started on those really cold mornings, often encountered in Minnesota and occasionally in Flagstaff here in Arizona; and more importantly without having to fumble around with gasoline using numb fingers that would rather stay burrowed in your warm pockets, and without having to explain to your boss why you are again late.

A Bus: The Studebaker Wagon Works

hroughout the 40 years the Grand Canyon State Chapter has been in existence, the membership has had many interesting projects and one of those projects spanned a 5 year period from 1981 to 1986. On April 11, 1981 the chap-



ter purchased a Studebaker bus for \$200.00 from the First Chinese Baptist Church in Phoenix. The left side was rusted out because that side always got wet when the church had the watering system turned on. Repairing the rust and making the bus mechanically sound required many work sessions, mainly held at the Eastburns where the bus was parked for quite a while. When it was time to paint the bus, it was driven to Pete Mensing's shop and then The Studebaker Drivers Club lettering and wheel were painted on the bus by Steve Piper. Shortly after the bus was purchased, a naming contest was held and Mo and Elaine Roll (Karen Mensing's parents) submitted the winning name, The Studebaker Wagon Works. According to a report in a 1982 *ECHO*, expenditures for the project up to that time totaled \$680.22 which included the purchase price, parts, paint and license fee.

When the bus was completed it was used to transport members to events, displayed in car shows and driven in parades. Then, in 1986 it was sold for \$2400.00 to a man from northern California who wanted a vehicle that would transport his ill daughter who had to lie down when traveling long distances and it became a motor home.

Not much thought had been given to the fate of the bus over the years until Dave Gahlbeck of the Whatcom Chapter mentioned on the SDC Forum that he had purchased a school bus in California and would have it transported to



his home in Washington. While researching the history of the bus, he learned that it had been our Chapter bus and made contact with a few of the members who had worked on it to find out more about it. As you can see in the photo (that's Dave in the photo), the bus has held up well and will give Dave years of interesting Studebaker experiences. He has even mentioned bringing it down for the Pacific Southwest Zone Meet in October.




