I will volunteer some place close to home, pack a healthy bag lunch and give it to a homeless person.


I will re-read my favorite children's book while showing off my Studebaker at a school.


Party and Meeting Highlights

This Little Light of Mine, I'm Gonna Let It Shine!

As we SDC members know, Studebaker has a fascinating history filled with many firsts in the automotive world and tons of interesting facts and stories. For decades the club has pretty much hidden its light under a bushel basket as the old saying goes. Your chapter and the national club are doing more than ever before to increase public awareness and we, as individual members, can help.

As individual members, we can do a lot of small and easy things to shine our light publicly on the marque, the national club and, most importantly, your chapter.

Are you packin'? There are a number of essentials that should be packed in every Studebaker. A fire extinguisher, extra fuel pump, current SDC membership roster, and a few tools are always being mentioned. To be an effective ambassador for the marque and club, you should also pack a supply of "Studebaker Story" and SDC brochures, a brochure or other info on your chapter, including a membership application! If your chapter has a "business card", pack a few of these in your wallet.

Educate with Pride. Okay, maybe that's a nice way of saying "exercise your bragging rights!" Some say it's not bragging if it is true and there is much truth about Studebakers worth bragging about. Besides, if we Studebaker fans don't do a little respectful bragging who will? The truth is Studebaker was the first to bring many automotive innovations to the public...innovations that most people would automatically assume that only the "big 3" could do.

In the January, 1996 issue of *Turning Wheels*, Almanac Editor Richard Quinn provided an extensive list of Studebaker's "firsts". A few of them include:

The first to cast a 6-cylinder engine in a block (1921).

The first to have a double-wall pickup bodies on trucks (1937).

The first to use self-centering, self-energizing brakes (1954).

The first to install front seat belts in every car in is line (1963).

Of course, that's just for starters. The complete list is in that 1996 *Turning Wheels* issue. What? You do not have a January, 1996 *Turning Wheels* laying around? Don't worry! You can download and print a copy of the Studebaker Firsts list from your computer. Just go to: http://tinyurl.com/bp8ww37 (type it exactly as you see it here).

I recommend that you print the Firsts list and include it with the other items mentioned above in your car. You just never know when you will have an opportunity to show someone just how far ahead Studebaker was throughout its history.

REALLY COLD STARTS

The second installment is concerned with a review of the many methods that can be used to start your car on those really cold mornings. The story begins on a personal note, describing my really cold start exploits growing up in Minnesota.

My first encounter with cold starts was with my 1930 Ford Model A that I drove to high school. When I purchased this car I had a choice between a coupe and a two-door sedan. Of course, I chose the two-door sedan so I could haul friends to school who were not fortunate to have their own personal transportation. My Dad, being an electrician, recommended that I keep the six volt battery warm. So every night I would take the battery into the house when I went to bed. It was amazing how effective this method was. There were few mornings that I had to brave winter's blistery winds walking to school.

After graduating, I attended St. Cloud State University in north-central Minnesota. The problem of really cold starts did not go away; I now had a '64 Dodge that I had to start on those nasty winter mornings. There was a solution, but it was a little more involved. My roommates I decided we would share the duties of getting up every couple of hours to warm the cars in the parking lot. This worked pretty well until you failed to participate in the communal effort as one roommate did. He was lucky; his VW started, but he could not shift it out of reverse. He had to

TECHNICAL INFORMATION Front Wheel Bearings

f your vehicle's front wheel bearings haven't been repacked for some time, it should be done. This is a very important safety item! How often depends upon how much your car or truck is driven. Under regular use, every 10,000 to 15,000 miles would be acceptable. Because most Studebakers may not be driven on a regular basis, they should be placed on a time schedule.

To do this, remove the front wheels, dust covers and cotter pins. Then remove the nut holding on the hub. Next remove the hub and drum assembly. Remember if your car has disc brakes, the caliper must be removed first. When the hub is off, remove the grease seal and bearings. Clean the inner and outer bearings and inspect them for any type of damage. If the bearings are okay, repack them with clean wheel bearing grease. Next reinstall the bearings, hub and drum assembly.

Be sure to use a new grease seal. If there is any question about the old bearings, it is best to replace them. While you have the front hubs off, this is a good time to inspect brake linings, wheel cylinders and rubber brake hoses. If anything looks questionable, it should be replaced. Remember, anytime you have the car jacked up for any reason, be sure to use good, quality jack stands for safety. drive it in reverse for three blocks before it would go into a forward gear.

Rumor has it you can throw a bed of burning charcoal under the oil pan. But, I was never brave enough to try it. There are the more traditional remedies like an oil dipstick heater or a radiator tank heater, both of which I can swear by. I used to have a Studebaker accessory engine heater kit that I picked up at a local swap meet; however, unable to find a use for it here in Phoenix. the heater has been misplaced over the years.



There is always the ultimate solution. I thought I would give you your choice of two. The first is from a recent ad in Hemmings (see ad). The good news with this choice is that you can heat your garage with it at the same time you are warming your engine for a quick get-away. The second solution is a no-brainer---move to Arizona like I did 36 years ago. Now, "Really Cold Starts" is only a topic to write about in the *ECHO*.
