From the President

There is so much to do during March it could make one go mad. There are numerous museums to visit in the Phoenix area and one of the best is the Heard Museum, where they host the Guild Indian Fair & Market each March.



Spring training is big in the valley this time of year and you don't have to drive very far from anywhere to attend a game throughout the week. The World Baseball Classic First Round is also here this year so even more games are added for our enjoyment. This is great because we have Chase Field which was the first baseball facility in the world to combine a retractable roof, air conditioning, and a natural turf field.

Along with lots of native cacti, the Desert Botanical Garden host one of the world's finest collections of desert plants with 139 rare and endangered species from around the world. It is one of only 44 botanical gardens accredited by the American Association of Museums. If you don't have enough cactus at home there is no finer place to enjoy desert beauty than within the 50 acres of the Desert Botanical Garden.

For those that like to walk you will find Piestewa Peak, Camelback Mountain, Boyce Thompson Arboretum, and South Mountain offer great workouts and wonderful scenic valley views. The peaks climb to over 2,000 feet and include the most heavily used trails in the nation. Camelback Mountain is probably the most recognizable natural feature of the City of Phoenix. Named Camelback Mountain because it resembles a resting camel, with a large hump on its back, this is one of the most popular recreational areas for hiking in the City of Phoenix. Of course if you don't want to walk that much there is also places like the Boyce Thompson Arboretum which brings together 3,200 plants from the Earth's many and varied deserts and dry lands. During wildflower season, the Boyce Thompson Arboretum is especially beautiful, displaying all the wonderful colors of the desert. You can also find more than

250 species of birds if you have the desire. There is also an Art Walk in Scottsdale if you prefer a cooler evening adventure on a Thursday.

About one and a half hours north of Phoenix are two National Monuments that are well worth a day trip from the Phoenix area, Montezuma Castle and Tuzigoot. Both monuments are very interesting, but Tuzigoot will allow you to walk in and around the structure. Then just a few miles northeast of Scottsdale, surrounded by the spectacular Sonoran Desert, there is a sprawling complex called Taliesin West, A living memorial to a great American architect, Frank Lloyd Wright.

For those wishing to go a little farther afield, there are also a couple of things that include that fabulous vehicle the Studebaker. The Antique Studebaker Club, Southern California is hosting the annual Palm Springs meet and the Tumbleweeds Chapter in Nevada is hosting a show in Laughlin with some prodigious room rates.

These are all great things to do but one of the best things going on in March is the Grand Canyon State Chapter's hosting of March Madness. This event not only takes place in the largest municipal park in the country at South Mountain but it also includes a large array of things to see and do.

At this event you can watch races or race your own, eat some great food, converse, see some excellent fun awards being presented and participate in the silent auction. You can even test your skill tossing washers.

They say Fish is brain food, yet people eat it on Friday and then do the silliest things on the weekend.

I hope you enjoy the pleasures that are offered during what seems to one of the busiest months so far this year. Eat a lot of fish and do silly things if you wish but save some room for Hot Dogs and Hot Rods and then go MAD at March Madness.



- 5. No sharp edges or sharp protrusions on the racer.
- 6. Must be gravity powered. Absolutely no other power source allowed.

This year the races will include pinewood derby creations; you can get a kit at a Boy Scout or hobby store.

Valve cover racers can be painted any color.


Ann Turner, the co-editor, writes in the March issue Art has advanced pancreatic cancer but he will continue to work with Ann proofreading and keeping up with emails.

Impossible Coconut Custard Pie

Submitted by Arlene West

1/2 cup Bisquick

4 eggs

4 oz flake coconut

1 tsp butter, softened

3/4 cup sugar

2 cups milk

1 tsp vanilla

Combine all ingredients, pour into a 9 inch buttered pan. Bake at 400° for 25-30 minutes until custard sets. Like magic it layers into crust, custard and coconut topping.



... TECHNICAL INFORMATION ... Starter Bolts

fter working on my '53 Coupe for the last 30 years I thought I knew everything about it. But about two months ago during a reconstruct. I drove it around the block. It ran fine so I put it back in the garage to continue my restoration. I hadn't started it for about a month and when I turned the key it was kicking back, sounding very bad without even a hint of starting. It ran great when I turned it off so I was dumfounded. Most of the noise was coming from the starter and flywheel so I thought this would be my starting point for fixing the problem. I took out the starter and removed the flywheel cover and found filings in the housing. (My first clue to the problem.) I disassembled the starter and it looked fine. I saw nothing that would cause any concern so I decided to reinstalle the starter without the flywheel cover to see if I could actually see what the problem might be.

Now comes the memory part of this story and mine is failing just like the rest of my body. I vaguely remember reading in the Co-operator a few months ago about using the correct bolts when installing your starter. It

said they had to have a shoulder large enough and long enough to center the starter in the housing. The bolts I had just removed were new 9/16 bolts and they barely fit when I installed the starter using the flywheel cover. However, now without the cover, they were too small for the holes. I found two 5/8 bolts with a 1 inch shoulder (they could have been the original bolts). I continued the installation and it started right up no noise or any other issue.

I believe what happened was the bolts were not centering the starter. As I drove it, the bumps in my dirt road allowed the starter to shift (because of the smaller diameter) just enough to cause a bind; hence my problem. The moral of the story is: If you have a problem with your starter maybe it's the bolts not centering it properly.

P.S. The Co-operator is just filled with little nuggets like this but the problem is finding the answers to your questions. This leads me to a thought I have had. *Model Railroad* magazine just released all 75 years of their printed material on CD and by typing a few words it will bring up every article that pertains to the subject. Maybe there is someone who is ambitious enough to do that with *Turning Wheels*. I purchased the indexes but you still have to have all the issues, go to each reference article and find it. If it were all electronic that would be great.


