From the President

Sometimes there is a lot to be said about understanding. What do you mean? Well, you can hear a lot of talk at a car show or event but do you really understand what is said or meant.



Let's do a few comparisons and examples. In 1953 the Studebaker Corporation celebrated its 100th anniversary. Raymond Loewy boldly stepped into a radical departure from the conventional styling of the day. All Studebaker models donned a sports car styling becoming the raciest standard models in the industry. What they mean was bring out your Studebaker to the *Pacific Southwest Zone* Meet in Mesa and show others why Studebaker styling is still cool.

The talk with car people eventually comes around to the power of the engine. The real energy that runs a car is locked in its fuel. The proper air/fuel mixture is compressed and ignited creating a downward force to the crankshaft that turns the transmission which supplies torque to the rear axle and the wheels and away you speed. What is meant here is the energy of the car club is locked in its' people. They provide the power through thoughts and ideas that are transmitted to successful events like *Drive Your Studebaker Day* and the *Pacific Southwest Zone* Meet.

Electricity has an essential role in the operation of your car. The electron theory assumes that electrical current is composed of free electrons moving in a conductor. The battery's electricity is a chemical reaction that forms a lead sulfate that can weaken the battery but recharging will dissolve the sulfate created and restore a full charge to the system through miniature dynamos run by the engine fan belt. The brake system contains a brake pedal, master cylinder, brake drums, wheel cylinders, brake shoes with linings and brake drums. Press the pedal, the master cylinder forces fluid through lines to wheel cylinders to expand the shoes that apply pressure to the drums to create friction to slow the car. They do give us an emergency brake if all else fails. What they really say is don't miss the opportunity to show how Studebaker People are the Greatest because they won't slow down. They are always there at the Madness of March, the camaraderie of the Christmas party, the haunting of trunk or treat and the excitement of the Pacific Southwest Zone Meet in Mesa.

ZONE MEET NOTES

Room reservations at the Holiday Inn, the meet hotel in Mesa, will still be accepted at our group rate on an availability basis. Mention Studebaker when you call 480-964-7000 to make your reservation.

When you arrive for the meet, go first to the meet registration table in the hotel lobby to pick up a packet with a dash plaque, name tags, banquet tickets, if applicable, people's choice ballots, a meet booklet and a windshield card if you are having a car judged or displaying one. Everyone registered will also receive a goody bag.

You can register for the meet up to and including Friday and Saturday morning of the meet. Please note the meals count for the awards banquet must be submitted by Wednesday, the 9th and if you want to attend please be sure to make your banquet reservations by that day. If you plan to register at the meet but would like to attend the banquet, call Chris at 602-995-5311 before the 9th to make reservations.

There will be entertainment during the social hour prior to the banquet. Four dancers from a dance studio will perform several ballroom dances.

If you have items you would like to sell at the swap meet, the fee is \$10 for any amount of parking spaces you need. Bring a canopy and tables, if you can, but tables can be rented from the hotel for \$5.00 each.

A note to vendors: the city of Mesa requires a sales tax license for vending in the city. The chapter has obtained a license to cover all vendors. Ed Smith will collect the amount owed at the end of the swap meet, then remit the taxes collected. The tax rate is 1.75%.

Finally, donations for hospitality and the auction and raffle are still needed:

Installing a GPS in a 6 volt car

There is an answer for a GPS in a 6 volt car and I installed one in my '49 Champion. I found a 6 to 12 volt positive converter, positive to negative ground that uses a common ground with the 6 volt system. Seems really strange, I would think it impossible, but it works. This is something one could not do in years past.

I mounted the converter, which is very small, to the top of the steering column with Velcro. It is hidden behind the instrument panel so it is difficult to see. Then I mounted a cigarette lighter socket next to the steering column just to the left of the converter. I hard wired the converter into the ignition system so the converter turns off when the ignition is off. I love my GPS.

One could also run a 12 volt negative ground radio with this setup. I am thinking of doing that with the radio mount under the seat.
