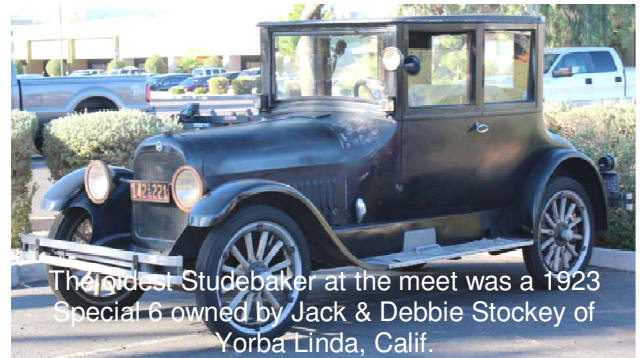

TECHNICAL INFORMATION.....

The following is a comment from Odd Justad, member of the Greater Seattle Chapter, regarding the tech tip in the October newsletter.

Saw your tech tip on running GPS in our 6 volt cars. For a radio that might be the way to go, but most GPSs today run on 5 volt. If it has the normal USB connector and can also be plugged into your computer, it runs on 5 volts. All you need to do is reverse the polarity in from your cigar lighter outlet. Get an extension cord for cigar lighter outlet, cut the wire and splice it back together with reverse polarity. Be sure the extension outlet case is insulated so it can not touch any ground in the car. Have been running my '40 Champion like that for years.

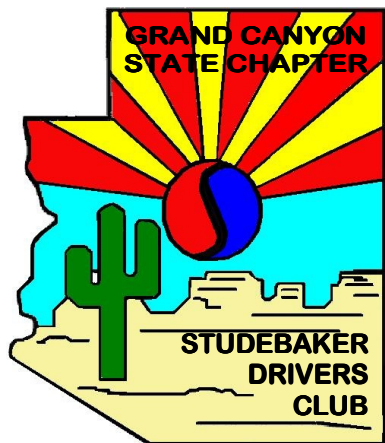
