50 YEARS AGO

There is a very important 50th anniversary coming up this month! The South Bend plant ceased production on December 20, 1963, and the last Studebaker automobile rolled off the Hamilton, Ontario, Canada, assembly line on March 16, 1966. After poor initial sales of the 1964 models and the ousting of president Sherwood Egbert, the company announced the closure of the South Bend plant on December 9, 1963, and produced its last car in South Bend on December 20.

The engine foundry remained open to supply the Canadian plant until the end of the 1964 model year, after which it was also shuttered. The Avanti model name, tooling, and plant space were sold off to Leo Newman and Nate Altman, a longtime South Bend Studebaker-Packard dealership. They revived the car in 1965 under the brand name "Avanti II". They likewise purchased the rights and tooling for Studebaker's trucks, along with the company's vast stock of parts and accessories. Trucks ceased to be built after Studebaker fulfilled its remaining orders in early 1964. There were some '1965' model Champ trucks built in South America using CKD parts (completely knocked down). These models used a different grill than all previous Champ models. Of course, as we know, after Nate Altman built his last Avanti in 1982 it was then purchased by Stephen Blake, to Michael Kelly, to John Cafaro and then back to the master crook Michael E. Kelly. The last Avanti to date rolled off the line in Cancun, Mexico in 2007. It used a V-6 Roush Racing Engine. The factory and showroom still stand, as do many extremely rare Studebaker and Avanti concepts and racing vehicles on the second floor of the building in Cancun-R.I.P.

Phegley's Purple Bomb

n 1954, Richard Phegley was a junior at Colton Union High School in Colton, California and he was driving a 1951 Starlight Coupe that he purchased just a year earlier when it was only 2 years old. The school paper, *The Pepper Bough*, featured Richard and his car in the May 21, 1954 edition with this headline announcing the story, "Phegley's Purple Bomb Rated Top". Here is the text of the story as written by one of the paper's reporters.

Setting the style in custom cars at Colton High is Dick Phegley's sparking (sic) '51 Studebaker Starlight Coupe. This low beauty is set off with a very flashy metallic purple (paint) job, '52 Studebaker tail light rims and planed off nose and deck.

The Studebaker original front spinner was removed and a sheet metal plate now replaces it. The latest addition to the car is an immaculate upholstery job of white naugahide with black beading, done at the A & M Upholstery shop in Colton.

Other modifications are (it is) lowered, low mellow pipes, whitewall tires and moons. The body work was done by Warren and Day Studebaker of San Bernardino. Future changes are Frenched head and tail lights and a new screaming V-8 engine to be added, maybe soon.

For you who are thinking of customizing your car, it costs a lot more than you think. To give you an idea on what customizing costs, Dick went to Bowman's Body Shop in Riverside to see how much it is going to cost him to have things done. French tail lights, \$50; French rear gravel shield, \$20; lead fender seams, \$85; fill gas tank flap, \$15; install solenoids in door, \$10; and parts, \$12; air scoops in rear fenders, \$20; round hood corners, \$6; lower hood, \$18; fill seams in fender to grill, \$20; French headlights with '52 Ford rims, \$40; and parts, \$8; and primer paint complete, \$15; all this adds up to about \$319. We hope you did not change your mind about customizing your cars because we would like to see more customs around the campus.

Richard says his Starlight coupe was only one of two Studebakers at his school. The other was a 1950 4 door sedan, lowered, with pipes and fender skirts.

Thank you, Richard, for sharing a piece of your Studebaker history. It was interesting reading the prices for the customizing in 1954. What would the cost be today?


CHECK YOUR FAN
