

MORE ABOUT VAPOR LOCK

ne more comment on the vapor-lock problem. Although the comments that have been mentioned may help, I have found that if you carry a rag such as a terry cloth towel of some sort and the clothes pin idea is good to have, along with a container of water. Wet the cloth, wrap it around the gas line from the fuel pump to the carb, hold it in place with clothes pins. If the cloth dries out and you car stops again, simply wet the towel again. It works every time.

I understand that this gas today boils at about 130° . The gas line runs between a hot radiator and a hotter engine. It's not the car that is the problem, it is today's gas that is the problem and to overcome this in hot weather, what I have suggested will work.

MAYA

ast month, my wife Corlean and I visited my daughter Amy, who is a physician in Maine. We make this trip each year because she loves the cold country. When we go I try to visit a new auto museum. This year the museum was the Lars Andersons Museum in Brookline, Mass. It is the oldest auto museum in America.



The Museum is situated in the carriage house of the Anderson Estate. The Estate is a park donated by the family. The main focus of the Museum is electric cars. The Anderson family drove them back-in-the-day when electric, steam, and gas automobiles were common at the beginning of the last century. There was even a Tesla displayed with the cars of old, as well as a large Greyhound Bus exhibit, celebrating Greyhound's 100th Anniversary.

To my surprise, there was a Studebaker connection in Greyhound's history. There was a Raymond Loewy display concerning his contribution to the development of the image of the Greyhound Bus. As shown in the photo he loved to offer ultramodern designs, even for a bus. His design of the Greyhound Bus logo is still used today and in the day, the displayed bus model of his scenic-cruiser motor coach could be seen plying the roads of America. In both cases the final product followed his personal philosophy he called "MAYA": Most Advanced Yet Acceptable. This philosophy can also be seen in our Studebakers.

Next year we visit the Stanley Steamer Museum.

A Brief History of The Columbus Watch Company

The South Bend Watch Company had its beginning with the Columbus Watch Company from Columbus, Ohio. It was started by a German Immigrant named Dietrich Gruen who received a US patent for an improved safety pinion on December 22, 1874.

In 1876, Dietrich Gruen and William J. Savage formed a partnership to assemble watch movements they imported from Madresch, Switzerland and finished them with the new safety pinions and sold them under the Columbus Watch Company name. They hand painted the initials "C.W.Co" on each dial with a fine paint brush. In 1882 they decided to manufacture watches locally and made mostly 18 size watches. However, Gruen was always concerned about the size and wearing comfort of the 18s watch. He was the first to reduce the size and thickness of the 18s watch and introduced the 16 size movement. It is also claimed that he was the first watchmaker to introduce the stemwind movement. By 1884 they were making their own dials but they never made their own cases.



In 1894, the company went into receivership and new management was assigned. Having lost control of the Columbus Watch Company, D. Gruen started again with his eldest son, Fred and formed a company named, D. Gruen & Son. The name was later changed to the Gruen Watch Company. They moved their new company to Cincinnati, Ohio and made fine quality precision watches. The young company flourished until 1953.

The Columbus Watch Company continued to manufacture watches under the old name but also started to use the New Columbus Watch Company name. The newly organized company made the same models as before but switched to named models such as Time King, Columbus King, Champion, Burlington Route, North Star, The President, Railroad Regulator, Railway King, etc.

In 1903, the Columbus Watch Company was sold to Clement

Studebaker III and other investors who formed the South Bend Watch Co. The machinery, unfinished movements, parts, and approximately 3/4 of the 150 employees were moved to South Bend, Indiana. Clement Studebaker III was named president. He was the grandchild of Clement Studebaker from the Studebaker buggy and automobile legacy.






