FUN JUDGING - Use your imagination to make a fun award such as these that were given in the past: Best Color Scheme or Hub Caps or Speedometer or Working Clock, The Money Pit or Slowest Studebaker. There are many more ideas like this that can be used as inspiration for an award. You can plan and make your award on your own or join in on the fun at the awards party on the 22nd. - 3. Total length must not exceed 10% over stock length of original valve cover.
- 4. Dimensions may be no longer than 12" high or 12" wide.
- 5. No sharp edges or sharp protrusions on the racer.
- 6. Must be gravity powered. Absolutely no other power source allowed.

You can also bring a pinewood derby creation; kits are available at a Boy Scout or hobby store.

TECHNICAL INFORMATION

Many of you have received (or brought for yourselves) various after-market accessories for your car - stereo systems, tachs, computers and alarm systems. These accessories will require installation of some kind and most electrical/electronic devices come with instructions (usually written in broken English). The most important thing to remember is never apply power until all other wiring has been installed and verified. Only until after all wiring has been verified do you apply power. Also, all devices need to be fused properly and grounded properly.

Most damage to new devices is caused by improper wiring and installing the wrong size fuse. Use only recommended size fuses. When in doubt, consult a professional or the manufacturer. Also, never install a wire through a metal panel without installing a grommet in the opening. It may not cause a problem immediately but will in the near future. Not following the above recommendations will cause a great deal of damage. Furthermore, if your insurance company inspects the damage for an insurance claim and finds improper installation procedures they may refuse to pay the claim.

I have been installing and repairing auto electrical systems for many years and unfortunately have seen many "short-cuts" that have caused a lot of grief or embarrassment to car owners. Please follow the recommendations above or inquire when necessary.






