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

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From the President ...

Remembering things is comforting and educational. You know how you lived and what you learned in school but a lot of that doesn't get recalled until you reach a much older age. Sometimes this is trig-



gered by current things and sometimes by older things.

For instance, I was thinking about how to tell about

one of the cars on the dash plaques from the Great Foodless March Madness when I came across this picture of a 1951 Cyclops from Russia. I wonder where they got their idea? They say this Cyclops had



an experimental 6005cc engine, that could do 126 mph.

I also remembered a few other things from this time period. The Rodgers and Hammerstein's musical "The King and I" starring Yul Brynner played on Broadway for 1246 performances. The great Mickey Mantle played his first game as a NY Yankee and only went 1 for 4. A TV version of the radio program "Amos 'N' Andy" premiered on CBS. Although criticized for racial stereotyping, it was the first network TV series to feature an all-black cast. After buying their television studio from Howard Hughes, "I Love Lucy" starring Lucille ball and Desi Arnaz premiered on CBS. It ran through to 1961. And, because I love westerns I remembered that the once Chicago Cubs first baseman Chuck Connors became the infamous Rifleman.

Just where is this going? I am not sure, but oh well. Back to the car on the dash plaque. We, as great Studebaker people, know the 1953 Studebaker Starliner Coupe set the world car makers thinking and redesigning when they discovered their tall 64 inch Bel Air looked stodgy next to the sleek 56.4 inch Starliner and both being classed as coupes. (Pillarless hardtop coupes accounted for almost 15% of car production in 1953.) With that Bob Bourke was presented with the Fashion Academy Award for this spectacular futuristic looking new American car with the European look. This is surprising as most European cars at this time had an old fashioned prewar appearance. Maybe this look was to honor the debut of Irish Coffee or was it designed to fit the new magazine for 1953, "Playboy". Who knows, but with other new things for this year including Lionel trains reaching their peak of \$32.9 million in sales and new words included 'drag strip', 'cookout', 'egghead', 'split-level house' and 'count-down' it could have been part of its DNA.

With the Kaiser and Jeep merging in spring 1953 and Corvette being introduced this year, another company thought that the Studebaker styling was so good it had to be copied and modified it into a real fiberglass sports car called the Glasspar Studebaker. A fiberglass Studebaker could be the new fad. I look at the styling and thought just who styled the Hawk?

With the minimum wage in 1953 being 75 cents an hour and gasoline a whopping 25 cents a gallon you won-

der who would work on designing something so far from the madding crowd.

The doo-wop group, The Platters, was founded in 1953 and the first Cinema Scope films debuted in theaters. The New York Yankees won the World Series over the Brooklyn Dodgers and became the first baseball team to win five consecutive World Series. But more important than all this was that DNA was discovered in 1953, not only in the human being but in the auto industry as well. For one bright shining moment, Studebaker's pace-setting design became the DNA of the next few years in the auto industry as it was the envy of all.

Maybe as a club we can set a new DNA to be the envy of the Drivers Club. 'Name That Tune' and 'Superman' will have nothing on us as together as a club we discover new places to go and show the Studebaker DNA. They always said it was different by design so let's get it out and show the car world we are still around to be copied. Let's set a new precedent in what happens at a club gathering and see if for the rest of the year we can be different from the old design.



THE LAST OF THE INDEPENDENTS GAME

Just like when I was a child, I look forward to Christmas to see what new toys I might receive. This year was no different. My son and daughter-in-law gave me the game, The Last of the Independents. I have seen this game on Bay for a year or so and was pleasantly surprised to see it under the tree.

The game is made by Numbskull Games. They are located at 5900 Meridian St., Los Angeles, Calif. The game simulates the building, engineering and promotion of automobiles by the smaller independent American companies in the post-World War II era. It depicts some of the difficult challenges executives faced as they competed against each other and the "Big Three".

Each player is dealt a company card from the following makes: Studebaker, Packard, Kaiser Frazer, Hudson, Checker, Tucker, Nash, Willys Overland, Muntz and Crosley. Each player starts out with chips that represent 20 million dollars. You then have to decide how you to want to spend your money in one of the following categories: Models, Engineering and Promotion. Within each of those categories are several choices for you to decide how you will make your car company, Car of the Year.

It's an interesting game and is designed for 3 to 6 players and takes 90 minutes to play. There are a lot of pictures of all the car companies' vehicles and nostalgia of events and of how life was back in the fifties. I would recommend the game for the Studebaker content alone but I think most Studebaker toy collectors will want to add this game to their collection.

FROM TUCSON, ARIZONA TO SOUTH BEND, INDIANA ON A LARK (PICKUP, THAT IS)

aving need for a pickup for the last twenty-five years, and to tow a '60 Lark convertible back to a prospective member in Mishawaka, Indiana, I bought a '62 Champ pickup from a fellow SDC member on July 2, 1974. This gave me ten days to make minor repairs on things that had gone wrong over a period of years, plus installing an air conditioner, dual gas tanks, radio, etc.

Planning on leaving for the National SDC Meet on July 12, I still didn't have all the work completed, so I extended my working hours into the early hours of the morning. Getting a few hours sleep, I then started out for South Bend, Saturday, July 13 in the a.m.

Things went good for the first three hundred miles. Then, with a few coughs and sputters, she quits in Las Cruces, New Mexico. Checking a few things out, finally discovered it's the fuel pump. No problem, I (can) get one from the parts box (that I always carry), but with all the hustle and bustle I forgot to put one in the parts box. So what to do now take one off the '60 convertible that I'm towing. This one worked, so we're off again.

Runs beautifully through the rest of New Mexico, Texas and half way through Oklahoma. Then climbing one of the red hills, a lot of smoke starts coming from under the hood. The engine stops as I pull of the road. I got the fire extinguisher out, as it seems to be a fire. Raised the hood and start spraying as I just filled both tanks and one was leaking a little. I could just vision the whole thing blowing up. After things cooled off, I discovered it was only a freeze plug. No problem, there must be a freeze plug in the parts box and there was. But guess which plug blew out - the one behind the exhaust crossover pipe. No problem, either, since I have my tool box and tools, that is all except a 9/16" socket that must be home on the garage floor. So I send the wife down the road approximately one half mile to a service station to beg, borrow or steal a 9/16" socket (sent a 1/2" socket for a sample, needing only a 1/16" larger.)

The service station had one but they kept my 1/2" for security, which I needed to use for removing the exhaust clamps but got by. I got the exhaust pipes off, freeze plug in and made a trip back to the service station for water. Now to see if it would start or had the engine, my wife or me cooked (with the temperature being 101° in the late afternoon)! Well, it started right up and ran beautifully.

I put the exhaust pipes back on and tightened all the nuts except for the one which couldn't be put back on because I had twisted one of the studs.

Thought I'd better add a can of Granatelli goop (STP) to make things go little farther, and you guessed it...the snap on top of the can pulled off. (Andy's entitled to one mistake!)

Back on the road, trouble free, through the rest of Oklahoma, Missouri and Illinois.

Arrived in Terra Haute, Indiana, and stayed overnight with my sister and her family. What was to greet me besides the sun the next morning but a flat tire. After checking wrecking yards, I was again on the road on Tuesday to the home of my 1962 Champ pickup with overdrive. Destination made Wednesday a.m., July 17th.

Chuck's recounting of his adventure first appeared in the Third Quarter,1974 ECHO. GCSC members were pleased to see Chuck at our Studebaker gathering at South Mountain Park, on March 14th. Later in the day, while visiting family in Scottsdale he had a fall and broke his hip. Chuck had surgery and is now recuperating at a rehab facility in Tucson. 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




