From the President ...

SEPTEMBER 12 DRIVE YOUR STUDEBAKER DAY

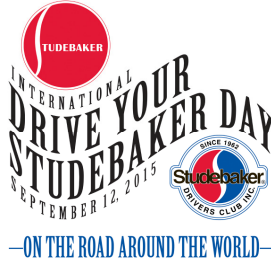



ARE YOU A LAZY TRUCK OWNER?

I am kinda; especially when it comes to checking the brake fluid in my '59 truck. The truck has been in my possession for 12 years and it is getting harder to check that fluid every time I take the truck out. Maybe its because I am getting older, too.

This year, I finally decided to make a change --- add a remote master cylinder reservoir, which was actually an option back in the day. A billet reservoir kit from "Street Rods, Parts, and Memorabilia" (937-382-1871) located in Wilmington, Ohio was chosen. The cost was very reasonable at \$75.00. If interested, the company is easily located on the web.

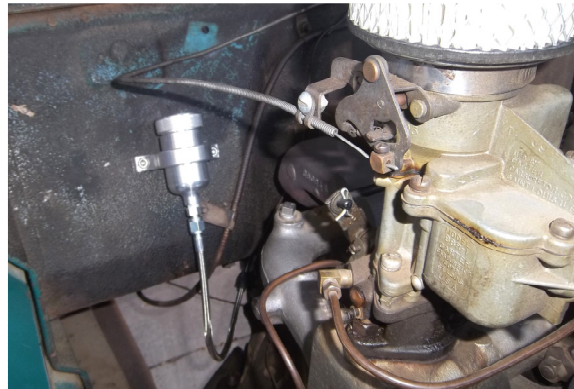
The kit comes with a screw cap reservoir made of aluminum, aluminum mounting bracket, a woven stainless steel line for fluid transfer to the master cylinder, and a 90 degree fitting that permits the access to the master cylinder fill cap under the floor-board. The fill cap must be drilled and tapped to accept the fitting. Care must be taken to not damage or block the vent hole in the cap.

Now when I head out to the next show, I simply lift the hood and take a quick look!. The next time you see my truck, come on over and check out the new system. And, at the same time see my new "Motor Minder" gauge that will be the subject of my next article.
