

# ABOUT THE COVER

Studebaker built an automobile from 1927-1930 named after the company's president at that time, Albert R. Erskine. The debut Erskine in 1927 was designed with a European flair and received the title "The Little Aristocrat". But in 1928, when Scott Grainger's Erskine (see page 9) was built, that title was down played and the models were referred to as the Erskine American 6 to let people know it was an American-built car. In 1928, 22,275 Erskines were built. The ad featured on the cover extolled the Erskine's performance capability.


You can nominate yourself or another member, with his/her permission, for any office or board position. No job is difficult and serving is a great way to meet other members and help your chapter, too.



I used to go solely for the cars, and then I met car people who became long-term friends. These days I go as much for the people as I do for the cars. Car people are generally more interesting than people in the street and are excited about cars in general, especially their favorite marque.

A lot of car guys are reclusive. They spend a great deal of time working on their rides and learning about them and don't do a lot of socializing. Of course I am making a sweeping generalization, because the social scene is the main thing for some collectors; but those who actually do their own restoration and maintenance on their cars- of necessity- somewhat solitary people, and are more at home in the company of a Nash or a DeSoto than they are at a cocktail party.

So the message for those people is: Get out and go to a car show. You will learn a great deal about your car, its history, its virtues and its attributes, and you will meet the nicest people. Fats Waller says in his signature song: 'You meet the nicest people, the very, very nicest people in your dreams;' but I say, why not meet them in reality by attending a car show featuring your favorite marque?"

# RACING THREATENED AT BONNE-VILLE SALT FLATS (BSF)

This year's Speed Week was cancelled at the BSF due to deteriorating conditions and wet weather. Begun in 1949, Speed Week is the BSF's largest annual racing event, with hundreds of teams racing every type of vehicle, from hot rods, roadsters and belly tankers to motorcycles, lakesters and streamliners.

Despite a rich history of racing for over a century, the salt flats have significantly decreased in size, strength and thickness over a number of decades as salt brine has been channeled away from the area. The BSF's international track once measured 13 miles long but has been reduced to 8 miles or less. The land has been managed by the U.S. Bureau of Land Management (BLM) since 1946. The SAN, along with other organizations and companies comprising the Save the Salt Coalition, has been

"With the support of the Hamilton British Sports Car Club, students were put in the driver's seat to experience some incredible British sports cars."

Caledonia Fairgrounds was transformed into a closed-course where participants took turns behind the wheel of several classics, including several British margues such as a 1972 MGB and a 1949 MGTC.

"We have to pass along our love of cars to the youth, many of whom have never even seen let alone drive a car with manual transmission," Hamilton British Sports Car Club member Colin Tyrell said. "We ended up with 20 owners volunteering their time and classic cars to support Hagerty. I couldn't be happier with the support of the club."

Recent research shows that today's youth have less interest in driving and likely possess less driving skills than teens three decades ago. According to a University of Michigan Transportation Research Institute study, only 46 percent of 17-year-olds in the U.S. have their driver's licenses, a 33-percent decrease since 1983. Additionally, less than 10 percent of currently produced vehicles are equipped with manual transmissions, a technology prevalent on classics.

I intend to keep Indy as original as the previous owners. She will be stored indoors but she will see the road more often. I believe automobiles should be driven.






