From the President ...

This is becoming a very confusing world and I would hate to be growing up during this time. The difference between what the schools are telling the students and what the stores they shop in are



saying can do nothing but confuse kids. It seems that we have gotten to the point where they think that everything they see on television is real. They call it a "reality show" don't they? Schools say holiday, Fall Break, Spring Break and the stores call it Christmas, Easter and Columbus Day. The schools try to teach why math works and where its roots are through things like New Math and Common Core but they forget to teach why it is important to know how math works in the real world and the simple things like counting back change. (2+2 =4 as long as I can remember).

You wonder what all this has got to do with Studebaker and the Grand Canyon State Chapter? Let me show you. First thing you should know is that Everyone knows about Studebakers. They are the ones that make that coming and going car and it seems to be everyone they ever made. The fact is it was the wraparound rear windows of the 1947-52 Starlight Coupe that made it look that way. First to produce a curved windshield in 1941- Studebaker. They tell us Studebaker would have survived had they used Ford engines instead of the Chevy ones. They don't want to believe that Studebaker made its own engines and set many firsts with those engines. They were the first in 1913 to cast a six cylinder in a block and the first to make a 6 cylinder car priced under \$2000. They were the first to think about economy with their V8 and had many features that the competition could not touch like a crankshaft of high quality steel which would have cost Ford about two thousand dollars to match.

Remind these people that the Beer Wagon they are so familiar with is a Studebaker from 1900 and those Clydesdales are still proud to be pulling it. Tell them that Ford celebrated 100 years in business in 2003, General Motors made 100 years in 2008 and Chrysler had to wait till 2014 while Studebaker celebrated their 100th anniversary in 1952.

In 1927 Studebaker was the first to use a mechanical fuel pump. Another first was established in 1931 was when the "free wheeling" was introduced which became the basic principle for overdrive and most automatic transmissions and in 1935 they were the first to assemble cars with an overdrive transmission and the first ever six passenger sedan.

In 1948 Studebaker was the first truck to enclose the cab step.

First ever manufacture to win first place in all three divisions of the Gilmore economy run in 1940.

Studebaker engineers kept pace with new trends by producing self-centered and self-energizing brakes in 1954 which quickly caught on with other car manufacturers. The flared fin brake drums were then introduced to minimize "fading" due to heat. In the early 1960s when the CELEBRATE! 29 Gregg Avery & Luz Lozano Lark and Avanti were introduced, new records of style and speed were set. The Lark V-8 took first and second place in the 4,100 mile Trans-Canada race and then the Lark was selected as Pace Car for the 1962 Indianapolis 500 mile race, the first compact ever selected.

"First by far with a postwar car" was Studebaker's advertising line when it introduced its 1947 models. The innovative company beat its competitors with cars that were a stark departure from the upright designs of pre-Pearl Harbor days, and they kept ahead of everyone with the bullet-node front ends, Loewy coupes, Hawks, compact Lark, and the Avanti.

The Avanti was an Italian car with a Chevy engine they try to tell us. Reality is that it was built in America and set new world production car records by traveling two and one quarter miles in 60.8 seconds. Top speed was recorded at 171.10 miles per hour. How many other manufactures can boost a car with the breakaway from traditional exterior lines and high performance personal prestige, remain almost unchanged for over 23 years?

All this is really good stuff to know and great to tell others but it is hard to tell them if all you go to is Studebaker only events. We love our brand but we need to show others just how great Studebakers are. Get the car out and park it next to a new car and see the look on people's faces when they ah at the stylish lines. Park it next to a similar year car and show the difference so they can see instead of just hear about those Studebakers. Tell them how Studebakers are Great and they will quickly find out that Studebaker People are the Greatest.

Who Kept Time Before Clocks or Watches?

Before clocks were invented time was kept by a single person in each town who used a solar sun dial. Each town's official time varied because the rotation of the earth around the sun caused high noon to be different at each location.

When clocks were invented each clock owner would set his clock to the time established at high noon by the town's official sun dial. At that time only hour hands were used on clocks because minutes were not important.

When rail roads were developed the need for more accurate time demanded the addition of minute hands and then second hands.

The city of South Bend financed the building of the museum and supports it with a monthly monetary contribution and is fully supportive of the institution. The museum brings more tourists to the city that any other entity except Notre Dame.

The museum archives preserves over 100 years of the Studebaker corporate records and consists of several tons of material covering 5000 linear feet of shelf space. It is housed in a separate building directly south of the museum. The full time archivist is a member of the SDC and is a regular contributor to *Turning Wheels*.

The museum's board of directors consists of 28 individuals, mostly prominent and influential business people from the South Bend area. The board also has always had at least 8-10 members of the Studebaker Drivers Club and/or The Antique Studebaker Club.

To supplement income the museum acts as host to various community events including private parties, reunions, graduation events, etc.

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
