

2018 PACIFIC SOUTHWEST ZONE MEET PROPOSAL

We have been asked as a Chapter to sponsor the Pacific Southwest Zone Meet in 2018. A lot of the ground work has already been started and most of the details have been tried, tested and adjusted. There are a few things that we still need help with. First one is an approval from our chapter members.

Before that approval is asked for I want to get some feedback on the proposal and, if need be, possible changes. The proposal is for the Zone Meet to be centered in Show Low. It will cover 5 days, Monday through Friday, and the Days Inn will most likely be the host hotel, with driving trips to the Petrified Forest and Painted Desert on day 1. Day 2 will be a trip to Greer and points in between stopping at an archeological dig and museums. Day 3 would be trekking down to Payson for sights, the Tonto Bridge and Zane Grey cabin. Then, day 4 we would head to Fort Apache and down to the Salt River and back. Day 5 would be Show Low area with a visit to a couple of museums and to a hit and miss engine collection and combined car show with the locals. There would be a banquet in the evening with judging awards presented. This is a driving zone meet with over 700 miles driven on the tours.

Your board was presented with this and after some discussion came up with a couple of other possible options. One was a Thursday through Sunday with the Show Low tour on Thursday, Painted Desert/Petrified Forest on Friday and Greer tour on Saturday, ending with the Banquet. Sunday could be an optional stop in Payson on the way back to the valley for those that wanted to.

The other option the Board suggested was Friday through Sunday which has been the typical Zone Meets with a bit of Show Low and a welcome something on Friday with the local car club. Saturday would be to Greer sights and the Banquet. The Sunday option to Payson would remain.

There will be a need for a few volunteers no matter which option is selected, to help get this started and running smoothly.

- First off, there will need to be someone to set up coffee breaks every morning and transport yourself and supplies to break locations along the routes.
- Someone will have to handle registrations.
- We will need a treasurer to handle the monies and pay the bills.
- There is a need for someone to prepare a booklet for the meet. Most of this has been written but it will have to assembled into a booklet form.
- We will need a few to help park cars on the show field.
- Someone will be needed to handle judging and to help decide just what trophies are needed.
- A volunteer is needed to handle t-shirt sales if it is decided to have them. We could use suggestions for something besides a t-shirt.
- Someone with a trailer who is willing to be a recovery vehicle. We are driving Studebakers so you probably will not be needed, but?
- We could use a Chairperson for this event or Malcolm Stinson has volunteered for this.

We would like some feedback on this as to which proposal would most likely suit the club. There will be some feedback time at the June 4th event at Deer Valley Airport or contact Ed or Linda with your thoughts and comments.

TECHNICAL INFORMATION Installing Scripts

When installing scripts and emblems that have the tabs broken off purchase a high quality double sided tape from an Auto Body Supply Store.

First, clean and polish the emblem or script with "00" steel wool. Make sure the backside is good and clean with no oils or grease and be careful to keep your fingers or hands away from the back surface.

Apply the double sided tape and use an exactoknife to cut off the excess tape around the edges. Make sure the surface of the car is clean with no oils or grease where you intend to place the emblem or script. Apply the emblem or script to the car body.

Using tape has a hidden advantage in that the body will not rust under the tape because there is no need for mounting holes through the body.


Lowell and his son John have been avid car collectors for quite some time. Back in their home town, Baraboo, Wisc. which is the home of the Ringling Brother Circus, they have a collection of a dozen Chrysler product vehicles. There are no Studebakers in the collection. The interest in Chrysler originated with John working for Chrysler.

Last month the time was right when a 1951 Starlight came up for sale on eBay. The car was perfect; it was restored, the price was reasonable, and it came with a little provenance. The car had been owned by Senator Howard

Baker of Tennessee. The Senator had passed away in 2014 and his collection liquidated with the proceeds donated to the University of Tennessee.

In the 1970s Senator Baker was involved in the Watergate investigation and came very close to filling the Supreme Court vacancy filled by William Rehnquist. In 1980 he ran in the Republican Presidential Primary, but dropped out when George H.W. Bush appeared to have the upper hand. The Senator is remembered for brokering compromise, enacting legislation, and civility. Today's Republicans could benefit from a study of his practices.

n 1952 Studebaker would be 100 years old. They asked for car design to be a part of the celebration which would happen during 1952. They had the design group working on this after the 1950 changes were done. What happened was



that while they were working on the Model N design they also got busy playing around on the coupe ideas which ended up taking over after the president found out about the coupe.

The Model N cars which were being tested on the proving grounds and production had given them model numbers H2 and 11G but they had not yet been accepted by the powers that were in charge of Studebaker. The Model N was a new body and after spending money to create the 1950 front clip and rear fenders they just didn't want to spend the money on it with all the new coupes in the works.

So the prototype was taken out to a field on the proving grounds and dumped. I don't know where it ended up but in 1969 many prototypes and test cars were found. The 1947 station wagon was

saved and is now in the museum but what about the Model N cars, did any get saved?


