
Thanks to John Verrill for organizing this event and thanks to all the members for joining us in making this another successful DYSD event.

The Story of Richie and "The Prez"

On July 5, 2016 I was surfing eBay, just looking for some small Studebaker items, when I happen to see a 1957 President Classic on auction. The current bid was \$3,000, so I figured that maybe I could get my very first Studie at a real low price. I got into the bidding. There was another person that seemed really interested in getting it. The bidding was going at \$100 a bid. When I got to \$6,100 I gave up. It seemed the other guy REALLY wanted it. He was the only one left and he entered a bid of \$6,200.

The next day I got a message that the bidding would end in 5 hours. It was still at \$6,200 and I was resigned to the fact that I wasn't going to get it. Where would the bidding end? I had already gone from \$3,100 to \$6,100. I had lost this bidding war!

Two days later, July 8th, on Friday night, I got an email from eBay that the other bidder had defaulted by not contacting the seller in the required amount of time. They advised me that I had 24 hours to contact the seller to lock in the sale at my high bid of \$6,100!

Not being the type of person to rush into anything, I thought about it for 3 seconds and sent a \$500 required deposit by PayPal. THE PRESIDENT WAS MINE!!!

On Monday, July 11th, I went to the bank and got the balance, \$5,600, in a Cashier's Check, and immediately went to the Post Office and mailed it to the seller in Ronan, Montana. He had



it on Thursday and took it to his bank to cash it. They told him it would have to be deposited, even after they called my bank to verify the validity of the check and the availability of the funds. Then they put an extended hold on the funds because the check was over \$5,000 (see my article in last month's *ECHO*). The funds were finally released on July 28th.
