WINTER GATHERING AT MARTIN AUTO MUSEUM

Frank van Doorn, Omaha, Nebraska, SDC North Central Zone Director and member of the SDC Executive Committee invited the membership to the 2017 North Central Zone Meet in Colorado Springs, Colorado August 3-6. Frank Wenzel said he and Kent Vandenberg are from Palm Springs, Calif. and invited the membership to the Southern California ASC Meet March 16-18 in Palm Springs.

Richard Dormois encouraged the membership to join the Arizona State Chapter of the Antique Studebaker Club on a tour of the Basha Southwestern Art Museum in Chandler, Arizona at 10:00 AM, Thursday, February 2, 2017 followed by a luncheon meeting at the JB Lounge in Chandler.

Chris shared that a project for support is a Phoenix Police Department Studebaker Lark Police Car unearthed at Chuck Naugle's Studebaker Acres in Vail, Arizona. She told of a recent SNF scholarship named for Chuck Naugle and how we may support it.

In the People's Choice competition Linda Smith sponsored and awarded the trophy to Frank Wenzel and Kent Vandenberg for their red 1935 Studebaker street rod. Chris Eastburn, on behalf of Premier Irrigation, awarded Kent Musgrove the People's Choice trophy for his 1924 Studebaker Roadster. Carl Reid awarded Phyllis and Paul Setaro the trophy for their 1962 red Studebaker GT Hawk. Chris and Chuck Collins sponsored and awarded the trophy to Tim and Joen Painter for their red and white, highly modified 1953 Studebaker Commander. Don and Nancy Juday were awarded the People's Choice Trophy for their 1964 Daytona Hardtop by sponsor SAC, SDC. Joe and Karen Guthrie sponsored the People's Choice award earned by Gary and Sandie Keating for their green 1941 Studebaker Commander.

Meet Chair Michell Eastburn handled door prize drawings, thanked the membership for their participation in our Studebaker Winter Gathering, encouraged participation in the Wickenburg Gold Rush parade, February 11, 2017 and offered surplus Olive Garden Meals for ten dollars.

Retiring Vice President Linda Smith shared farewell comments and appreciation for support on behalf of she and retiring President Ed Smith.

President Joe Guthrie thanked the membership for coming and concluded the business meeting about 2:20pm.

- From the East, take the 60 to 101 south or come down to Warner.

In alternating years, the two Arizona chapters host the All Arizona Studebaker Gathering, also known as March Madness, and 2017 the GCS Chapter will do the honors. All Studebakers and related vehicles are invited. There is no pre-registration or entry fee.

STUDEBAKER DISPLAY AND FUN JUDGING - Plan to drive or trailer your Studebaker for the display, whether it is a show car, driver or a project you are working on. All are welcome!

Use your imagination to make an award for the fun judging such as Best Working Clock, Slowest Studebaker, The Money Pit; any idea similar to these that can be an inspiration for an award. You can plan and make an award on your own or join in the fun and create awards on February 25th at the Rodhouse home. Then, on show day you look at all the Studebakers on display and decide which one best fits the award you will present.

SWAP MEET - Do you have spare parts in your garage you no longer need or can use? Bring them to March Madness and sell them from your display area parking space, the trunk of your Studebaker or from the bed of a truck.

RAFFLE - Donations of Studebaker and non-Studebaker items are needed for a successful raffle. Themed baskets are always popular along with models and other fun items. Bring your donation to the registration table at the meet or to the next chapter meeting or event.

VALVE COVER RACES - Make and bring a racer using a Studebaker valve cover. Here are the rules:

1. Total weight cannot exceed 10 pounds. There will be an official scale.
2. Must be a Studebaker valve cover.
3. Total length must not exceed 10% over stock length of original valve cover.
4. Dimensions may be no longer than 12" high or 12" wide.
5. No sharp edges or sharp protrusions on the racer.

TECHNICAL INFORMATION

DETAILING YOUR CAR USING A CLAY BAR

Auto detailing clay is used to remove dust, dirt, industrial fallout, acid rain and other contaminants from your car's exterior surface. Claying is most commonly used on paint, but also works on glass, fiberglass and metal. When done properly, claying is non-abrasive and will not damage your car.

Wash and dry your car thoroughly to remove as much of the dirt, grime and other contaminants from the surface as possible.

Cut the clay bar into three pieces in order to get more use from each bar.

Squeeze the clay in your hand until it becomes easily pliable. Roll it into a ball and flatten it into a circular shape that is about 3/4 inches thick.

Spray clay lubricant generously over an area measuring approximately 2 feet by 2 feet. Water will also work as a lubricant.

Slide the clay back and forth gently over the lubri-

cated area using as little pressure as possible. Add more lubricant if the clay sticks wire you're trying to slide it. You should hear and feel the clay picking up contaminants as it slides over the surface.

Fold the clay in half when it becomes dirty and knead it over itself until you have a clean surface. Be sure to examine the clay periodically to make sure that it doesn't pick up any large particles that could scratch your car's paint when you're sliding the clay over the car's surface area.

Wipe the lubricant off the car using a clean microfiber towel. The paint should be as smooth as a sheet of glass. If it isn't, clay the area again.

Repeat the claying process, one section at a time, until the entire car has been clayed. Overlap new areas with surrounding areas already cleaned to ensure even coverage and cleaning.

Apply a coat of wax or sealant, according to the instructions on the packaging, in order to protect the paint from corrosion that can form in the tiny holes that had been previously filled with contaminants before claying.

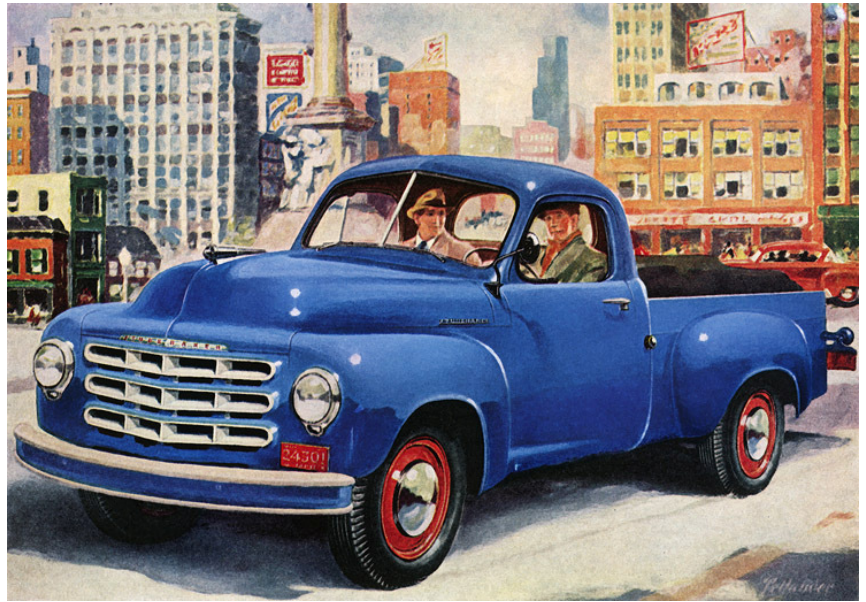
