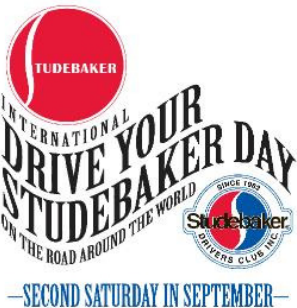

Every five years, SDC members return "home" to South Bend for the annual international meet. May 3-6 were the meet dates in 2017 when over 1500 members met to celebrate all things Studebaker.

Most of the activities we have come to expect at our meets happened even with a shortened schedule. Wednesday was the start day with the swap meet opening at 8 am at the fairgrounds with a special vendors night from 5-7pm. The SDC and AOAI held their board meetings, SDC judges met and the Co-Operator Seminar was held. Thursday was packed with many meetings, band rehearsal and concours judging. In the evening, the SDC band held a concert during the members night buffet which was followed by the presentation of the Harry Barnes and service awards and the SDC auction. The ASC held their auction at the same time at the Studebaker National Museum. Thursday was notable for an all-day rain and chilly temps, but we are hardy folk and everyone made the best of the situation.

Judging continued on Friday, several tours of Building 84 (shown in the meet logo above) were held, ladies met for a luncheon and 196 Studebakers paraded from the fairground to downtown South Bend where many merchants offered specials for participants.

45 YEARS AGO

In May, 1972 the Volume 1, Number 1 issue of *The Grand Canyon State Chapter Newsletter* (not yet named *The ECHO*) the editor, Tom Pfeifer, printed the results of a questionnaire circulated to nearly 70 Studebaker enthusiasts at an April 16, 1972 organizational meeting at Randolph Park in Tucson. The results showed:

- The average age was 34
- The eldest being 57
- The youngest being 19
- The total number of Studebakers owned being 249
- The preference for meeting time was Sunday afternoon
- The preference for yearly dues was \$4.00
- The preference for types of meetings in the following order was: picnics, swap meets for parts and information, technical, tune-up and repair work sessions, road rallies and economy runs, parties, business only.

The next meeting was May 21, 1972 at the Casa Grande Ruins National Monument near Coolidge with a bring your picnic followed by a meeting and then a technical session on Studebaker engines.

A few weeks later the Chapter received its charter from the Studebaker Drivers Club.

TECHNICAL INFORMATION

Brake Pedal Height

By Jerry Blount

I was recently asked about brake pedal height on a factory disc brake equipped Lark. The owner said the brake pedal seemed too low for his comfort, although the car stopped just fine.

The shoulder bolt that attaches the MasterVac pushrod to the brake pedal arm is unique to the disc brake equipped Lark types and Avantis. The bolt has a special eccentric type shoulder. This can be used to control pedal height.

The shop manual says to rotate the bolt until the brake pedal is the same height as the clutch pedal, if so equipped.

On cars with an automatic transmission there should be 7/8" to 1" clearance between the brake pedal arm and the tab on the suspended pedal bracket.

When the pedal is at the desired height, hold the bolt head from rotating and tighten the lock nut (or lock washer and nut) securely.

One would not be readily aware that this adjustment is available. The owner of the car in question was able to raise his brake pedal to a height that was to his liking.

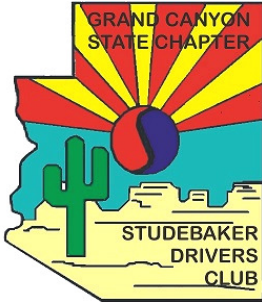
