first met my neighbor Leo Dickson in 2008 when he hauled my Avanti from San Diego. During that five hour



drive I learned a great deal about his native Arizonan life and his relationship with Dennis Jones, a past Studebaker Club member who he met while working at Honeywell.

When Dennis passed away at an early age, Dennis left his acreage and home in west Phoenix to Leo, as well as his Dodge pickup, a large Studebaker parts inventory and an established tail-light business called the Tail Light Emporium. After Dennis' passing, Leo made many trips to Pomona, Calif. to sell tail-lights and Studebaker parts. Oh! I didn't mention the large collection of Studebaker cars at "The Ranch" that Leo was left to sell as well.

Later in his retirement he became a transporter of collector vehicles using Dennis' Dodge. He was on his third truck when he passed away. I forget how many millions of miles he told me had traveled in those trucks. It was a good side business, transporting collector vehicles across America. He always had his trailer parked in front of his house with a car on it. I found it very remarkable that he took a photo of every vehicle after delivery. He showed me a stack of photos two inches high.

In 2014 he transported my Avanti to a painter in Show Low, who was recommended by Malcolm. Again, it was another adventure with many stories, some of which I had heard before on the San Diego trip.

I saw Leo one last time in 2015 when he and his wife Nancy delivered my '53 Buick to my daughter's house in Maine. They were eager to go because they had relatives in Maine they had not visited in many years.

On April 11th, I received a call from a friend in California who tried to call Leo. There was no answer. His wife called back later saying Leo had made his last road trip, passing way two weeks earlier. Leo was a kind and gentle man who was willing to help you in any way. He will be missed by all of us.

One day while texting with a customer, he asked me if had or could find him a beat up Studebaker truck tailgate he could use for a wall hanging in his Man Cave. I texted back that I didn't have one myself but thought I knew where I could find one.

A few days later I had one in my possession and texted a picture of it back to him. He did not respond. Several days later I was vending at a Studebaker Swap Meet and told a man about the Studebaker tailgate wall hanger. He said that he wanted it and wan8ted me to send him a photo of it and he would send me the money, but never did. The tailgate continued to lean against my house for several more weeks.

Then a friend from Michigan City, Indiana visited and wanted to find an old Studebaker pickup box and tailgate to make a bench with. We located one at another local parts vendor and we cut the back 18 inches off with a sawzall.

This past summer our local Studebaker Club went on a tour to Elmer's in Fountain City, WI. And on the way we stopped for lunch at Bucknuckles Bar & Grill in Praag, WI. There were two tailgate benches on the property but they were basically made from round cedar posts and used a truck tailgate for the backrest framed with posts...

I wasn't fond of my friend's idea for a bench using the pickup box. Neither did I like the Bucknuckles benches because of all the wood. My mind started to turn

In my mind I started planning a Studebaker bench using the beat up tailgate. I figured I could use the Studebaker R-Series tailgate for a backrest. I looked around my collection of parts. I found an old rusted running board from an M-Series Studebaker pickup that I thought would make a seat for my project. It was rusted badly where it mounts to the running board brackets. I measured it and thought I could just cut it off where it was rusted and it would be the right length. I found two worn out wire wheels that had oblong lug holes for the arm rests.

Next, I started sharing my vision with others. Most liked the idea and offered some advice. I listened to their suggestions and milled them around in my mind. Some were good and some I didn't like. However, one suggested that I should consider using an old valve cover from a six cylinder, cut it in two and weld them to the top of the wheels. I liked the idea but realized that only overhead-valve Studebaker six cylinder engines had the right type of covers, but they have the fill hole tower on one end. I didn't want the fill-hole tower to be in the way of laying your arm on the arm rest. Then I saw the Studebaker 232 V8 standing in the corner of my garage. I removed one of the covers and placed it on one of the wheels. It was a perfect fit, right length and height without cutting it. I just needed two covers, one for each wheel. Another suggestion that I liked was cutting the rust out of the M-Series running board and welding the curved



ends back on so the seat would have curved ends with no sharp edges.

Next, I needed to make a frame of metal to attach the parts to. I am not a very good welder. I needed to find someone to make the frame for me. I texted the welder who made new ramps for my transport trailer. He was very excited about the project and came over the next day to look at my parts and get an idea of my vision. We made a rough drawing and he took some of the parts back to his shop and returned in about two weeks with the finished frame.

When I put the wheels on the brackets I realized something was missing. The wheels needed a Studebaker hubcap. I started calling around to some of my Studebaker friends that I knew had cars of the same era as my wheels. I found a beat-up Studebaker Rockne Hubcap that fit the bill. So, basically my Studebaker bench is complete but I still need one more hubcap.

# **DUCK AND COVER**

uck and Cover is not some new fancy restaurant in Phoenix, but was a method of personal defense in the early '50s against nuclear bomb attack during the cold war with Russia. In 1951 President Truman established Conelrad, a means for the government to communicate by radio broadcast, emergency information to affected citizens, without aiding the enemy forces in locating their bombing targets using the broadcast signals.

The emergency information stations, as can be observed on many of our Studebaker radios, is by the civil defense symbol (a triangle in a circle) found at two locations on the AM dial, 640 and 1240 kHz. All other TV and radio stations were required to leave the air. It was during these broadcasts that affected citizens would be given instructions as to whether simply duck and cover or seek out the protection of a bomb shelter.

In August of 1963, just after the Cuba Missile Crises and just before the John F. Kennedy assassination, the requirement to place these symbols on auto ra-

dio dials was suspended when it was learned that missiles would be used to deliver nuclear warheads, making the Conelrad system outdated. More than anything else, these symbols on my Avanti's AM radio, make the car seem older than it really is, especially when Sirius-XM radio is now my only source for information and music.

# Technical Information ..... WHAT'S IN YOUR TOOLBOX? By Mark Carson SANDITS

C andits puts sanding grit on the tips of cotton swabs for smoothing surfaces in tight areas. If you mistake Sandits for a cotton swab, something bad will probably happen. Or something funny, depending on whether you're the one on the receiving end of the unfortunate outcome. That's because while it looks like a regular Q-tip, those tips are actually covered by gritty sandpaper material. Described as "cotton swab-shaped sanding sticks," it lets you sand hard-to-reach surfaces where you would otherwise have to get creative with sandpaper to properly reach. The size also allows you to sand more delicately, making it ideal for smoothing pieces without scratching them.

This thing should work a heck of a lot better than wrapping sandpaper on a screwdriver like many of us have done before. Each stick of Sandits measure 6 inches long, with each tip armed with a different grit to maximize its potential applications. There are two variants available: one with medium and fine wedge-shaped tips (120 and 180 grit sizes on either end); and another with very fine

and extra fine round tips (400 and 800 grit). Recommended for sanding wood, metal, and plastic, the grits are secured to the tips using marine-grade epoxy, ensuring they will stay on even when used under wet conditions. Available from many online and big box retailers.

# This N That .....



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
