INTERNATIONAL DRIVE YOUR STUDEBAKER DAY

Saturday, September 8, forty eight Grand Canyon State Chapter members and friends gathered about 11:00 am at Buddy Stubbs widely acclaimed Harley Davidson Motorcycle dealership he established in 1966 on Cave Creek Road in Phoenix. Through the years, Buddy built the adjoining antique motorcycle museum. Our group enjoyed a hun-

dred new bikes in the show room for retail, the gift shop and biker apparel store.

The motorcycle museum, covering two floors, display a hundred and forty one motorcycles from nine countries and thirty seven manufacturers dating from 1903 as well as motorcycle memorabilia and advertising paraphernalia, was likely the hit of day for some. Harleys were most prominent, but there were scores of Indians and Triumphs and many less known brands not sold in the U.S. Docent Dwight Smith shared motorcycle lore and stories and showed us Buddy Stubbs' original office he occupies three days a week sharing time with his Harley dealership in Anthem. Marketing Manager Adrian Burkhart expressed appreciation for our visit and the sixteen Studebakers displayed in the parking lot. If you missed this tour you may have an opportunity in the spring of 2019 for another Studebaker club event at the dealership.

About noon, we toured to the North Mountain Brewing Company at Dunlap and Cave Creek Rd., established by Rob and Candy Bergner about six years ago for our lunch and membership meeting. We overflowed "The Parlor" and overwhelmed the kitchen staff and our servers, Liz and Kayla; however, no concerns were expressed about the slow delivery of chow and the variety of pizza, sandwiches and salads were tasty.

After we purchased the car I was having trouble finding a battery that fit properly in the battery case and one that the positive and negatives would be on the correct side and would have enough amps to crank the 289 V8 with no problem.



I discovered Costco's Interstate battery did all of the above better than any other battery. Also, their warranty is probably the best in the industry. When my first battery failed, they gave me a free replacement, no questions asked.

Costco's item number on the battery is 852203.

The battery quite likely fits and works well on other Studebaker models since the battery case is the same in other Studebakers.
