# **NOVEMBER EVENT - THE DWARF CAR MUSEUM VISIT**

A t about 9:30 AM, four Studebakers and other brands took off from the Cracker Barrel, I-10 and Chandler Boulevard headed for Ernie Adam's Dwarf Car Museum in Maricopa. The sign said "Maricopa 26 Miles". It was. We moved another twenty miles or so through cotton, cattle feed and melons but sparsely inhabited Pinal County until arriving at 52954 West Half Moon Road.

Ernie and thirteen finished and under construction dwarf replicas of several American production cars powered by engines of other countries, mostly Asian, welcomed us. Mr. Adams has been building dwarf cars since 1980 in the Phoenix area and currently in Pinal County where he moved buildings from Phoenix and constructed some on the current property. Although several rooms in the main steel building quarter the dwarf cars, a myriad of interesting, once driven, motor cars and trucks of domestic manufacture, adorn the twenty acre expanse. Most of our membership ventured outside to examine and photograph an array of refrigerators, washing machines, farm implements, vintage tools and miscellaneous interesting junk. I think about twenty eight people signed Ernie's guest book and enjoyed snacks and bottled water. There is no admission, but a slotted box with a sign indicating this is a non profit museum and donations are welcome. Ernie, who lives on the property with his wife, said folks are usually pretty generous and the museum is a popular destination for tour busses and visitors from many other countries. He made himself available all the time we were there and shared historic stories about the place and his adventures driving the dwarfs throughout the Midwest at-

tending collector car events. Over the years he has been recognized at most of our local car shows including the Orphan Car Show we attend every year at Los Olivos Park in Phoenix.

About 11:30 AM we took off for the NASCAR themed Raceway Grill a short ways away on Papago Road, also with a Maricopa address but remote from most habitat. This is essentially a sports bar on steroids where we enjoyed lunch off the varied menu and quite an array of memorabilia, vintage license plates and examples of car parts on the walls and ceiling.

# WE HAVE GOT A PROBLEM

hartered as a Non Profit Public Benefit Corporation. and, hopefully, you can help solve it while benefiting yourself, a friend or a loved one. Primary among our three obiectives is providing educational scholarships to qualified students seeking higher education in a field related to automobile preservation or restoration. Note that I said, "related to". Each scholarship application is reviewed on an individual basis by our liberal scholarship committee which determines if your field is related and makes a recommendation to the Board of Directors. A lot of weight is placed on the letter you write to the committee.

Most of us think of someone seeking a scholarship as being a young person entering college out of high school. The Studebaker National Foundation scholarship is offered to any qualified student, regardless of age or where they are on their educational journey. For instance, if a qualified high school senior wishes to enter an accredited college or university in the hope of learning about something automotive, he or she will likely qualify for a scholarship. On the other end of the spectrum, if someone is seeking a PhD in a related field and needs help financially, submitting an application for a Foundation scholarship is encouraged. It needs to be made clear here that the scholarship is currently fifteen hundred dollars (\$1,500.00) for each semester, trimester or quarter and upon successful completion of each, the student is encouraged to reapply. Several have, to take them through to graduation.

While the student or the student's sponsor should be a member of the Studebaker Drivers Club, the Avanti Owners Association International or the Antique Studebaker Club when the scholarship is granted, the course of study nor the college or university need be Studebaker related.

All this being said, WE STILL HAVE GOT A PROBLEM. We simply are not receiving scholarship applications, although our treasury can accommodate them. I think one of the reasons is that the Advertising arm of the Studebaker National Foundation is not doing an adequate job of getting the word out. We have been in the business of helping people get through college for fourteen years and too few have been helped. I am reaching out to you through this newsletter to help us turn this around.

# MEET THE FOUNDER OF THE MARTIN AUTO MUSEUM

Since 2012, the Grand Canyon State Chapter has been hosting its Winter Gathering in January at the Martin Auto Museum. Everyone who attends can take a self tour to view all of the great vehicles on display noting what's new since the previous visit. The following biography of the founder of this fabulous auto museum tells you how he got started collecting the vehicles and his vision for the museum. It was printed in a recent e newsletter published and distributed by the museum staff.

rom an early age, growing up in Iowa, Mel was imbued with a strong sense of responsibility. As a young boy he delivered newspapers to help his family make their mortgage payments. In his early teen years, his family relocated to

Mayer, Arizona where Mel pumped gas at his father's filling station. At the age of seventeen Mel moved to Phoenix where he opened a garage named M & M along with a towing service. Over the years he continued to add more tow trucks and expand his business. Eventually Mel started an Automobile Auction Company. His love of cars continued to spur him on to other car related businesses.

An expert car mechanic, Mel can trouble shoot and repair almost every vehicle both on and off the road these days. By 2005, Mel's dream to exhibit a large and diverse population of vehicles under one roof became a reality. Mel saw a need to preserve vehicles in their original state. With typical zeal, he undertook this project in the hope of sharing his vision with young people across Arizona. Today, the Martin Auto Museum is a cul-



mination of years of collecting and uniting over 75 vehicles that represent the exciting history of the automobile.

Not content to just showcase the cars, Mel arranged for lesson plans from pre-K through 12th grade to be included on the website. All focused on the history of the automobile throughout the ages. His goal: students would experience, first hand, the dynamic narrative of each automobile, connecting it to the decade and point in time in which a significant historical event had taken place. # MEET THE TEST YOU WILL NOT BE SORRY WHEN YOU BUY THE BEST POST-WAR LORRY

recently read an article in a collector car magazine describing how the post-war Studebaker trucks were ahead of their time. This is not to take anything away from the post-war Studebaker cars that have received so many accolades.


The R-Series trucks were brand new following the very successful M-Series that started prior to World War II. Robert Burke's group decided to come up with an all new truck series that had no basic design features found in the Studebaker cars.

To refresh your memory as to what made these trucks so special and ahead of the other brands plying the roads of the world, the following should be considered note worthy. Studebaker debuted their "Super Line for '49" R-Series truck in the spring of 1948. It featured a double-wall pickup box, the only one in the marketplace. Studebaker also moved the running boards inside of the cab, making the cab very modern looking, again the only one in the marketplace.

And last but not least, was the new truck's modern for the day ventilation-climatizer ventilation system that brought air into the cab through the grill. With the Climatizer the system was able to keep cab occupants comfortable under any "normal" weather condition. The other manufacturers were still installing cowl vents to keep the air moving in the cab with separate heaters mounted under the dash that were unable to warm the fresh air coming in through the vent.

Other changes included under-hood accessibility to dash gauges, wipers, and Climatizer, and the truck's over-all low profile that made most of the trucks in the marketplace look like outdated beasts of burden.

So why use the term Lorry? Well, because so many of the boys returning from the War passed through England and were very familiar with the Studebaker Lorries that carried them into battle. Although lorry is an old term it meets the test so often heard at car shows, "Studebaker was definitely ahead of its time".

This seems fairly obvious but, if you work on your Studebaker, you need to have access to specs, instructions, "how to" stuff, and the rest. The first thing you should have or acquire is a copy of the Shop Manual for your car. It also helps to have the Body and Chassis manuals to identify parts more easily. These are all available from Studebaker vendors who advertise in *Turning Wheels*.

Each month's *Turning Wheels* also has the Studebaker Cooperator in which various technical questions sent in by members are answered. The SDC page www.studebakerdriversclub.com has a resources section, as well, that includes the subsection "tech tips, specs, and data," and there is a lively forum in which questions are asked and, hopefully, answered correctly.

And last, but not least, the web page known as Bob Johnstone's Studebaker page www.studebaker-info.org has a lot of material available to us.
