STUDEBAKER DISPLAY AND FUN JUDGING - Plan to drive or trailer your Studebaker for the display, whether it is a show car, driver or project you are working on. All are Welcome!

SWAP MEET - Do you have spare parts in your garage you no longer need or can use? Bring them to March Madness and sell them from a parking space, trunk of your Studebaker or from the bed of a truck.

RAFFLE - Donations of Studebaker and non-Studebaker items are needed for a successful raffle. Themed baskets are always popular along with models and other fun items. Bring your donation to the registration table at the meet or the next meeting.

VALVE COVER RACES - Make and bring a racer using a Studebaker valve cover. Here are the rules:

- 1. Total weight cannot exceed 10 pounds. There will be an official scale.
- 2. Must be a Studebaker valve cover.
- Total length must not exceed 10% over stock length of original valve cover.
- Dimensions may be no longer than 12" high or 12" wide.
- 5. No sharp edges for protrusions on the racer.
- Must be gravity powered. Absolutely no power allowed.

VOLUNTEERS ARE NEEDED. You can volunteer to assist to insure a successful March Madness. Contact Michell or Peggy and let them know how you can help.

- Setting up canopies and tables. Arrive by for set up.
- Setting up raffle and selling tickets.
- Registering participants.
- Helping with parking.
- Setting up valve cover race track; helping with races.

Please make plans to attend and enjoy the day with your Studebaker friends. There will be a food vendor or bring your own food, drinks and chairs.

Due to no longer having the 1960 Hawk, the Bells are not renewing their membership and sent the following note.


We would like to take this opportunity to say Goodbye! We have enjoyed our association with the club. Thanks to all for the fond memories.

Right after that sale we drove to the Zone Meet to see our friends and enjoy our Studebaker. Saturday was display day at a local shaded park. I filled out my description card for placement on my windshield. All the details about the car were listed. At the bottom of the card was a space for 'Remarks'. In small letters I printed 'For Sale', not expecting anything to happen, but I knew that we wanted to minimize our car collection.

As the morning progressed one man began looking over the car closely. We talked about the car briefly and I told him that the car had been restored by Malcolm Stinson about 10 years ago. This apparently was important to him. After the conversation he moseyed on. About 20 minutes later he came back seeking me out. He asked me, do you know the

color of the gas lid door does not match the rest of the car exactly? When he asked this I knew he was definitely looking at the car seriously. I replied, yes I know. Then I asked him, do you know that the driver's door does not match the rest of the car exactly but it does match the gas lid door? He came back later after doing some comparing and asked for the story on the mismatch. I told him the story and he seemed to be more interested in the car. Sometime later he came back and asked, how much do you want for the car? I knew he

Ed brought us all the way home to Gilbert after dropping Linda at home in Goodyear. The Gran Turismo Hawk is now owned by Les Breeden and his wife in Cherry Valley, California.

The net result of this sale left us without a regular Studebaker ready for touring. If we bought another 'last Studebaker' it was going to be pre-WWII. Then I would have an antique when I sold the 1941 Commander (there is a for sale ad for the Commander in this issue). I had an old set of original 1934 all-copper Arizona plates in my storage. I have been wanting a car that would fit those plates. Now I had the resources to buy that kind of car. But it had to be a Rod for touring purposes. Now I had the license plates and the money, all I needed was the Studebaker. Mel Martin's 2019 event was the unveiling of both the plates and the 'new to us' 1934 Studebaker Commander Rod fresh from Bridgewater, Virginia.
