

BUILD IT AND THEY WILL COME 2019 ALL ARIZONA STUDEBAKER GATHERING

Don a beautiful overcast day at South Mountain Park in Phoenix on Saturday, March 2nd they came from near and far to enjoy the festivities in our version of March Madness. Many are to be recognized for their contributions of time, energy and resources to make this gathering one of the finest in the Studebaker culture. An informal event by design, there was no required registration for families but it appeared north of a hundred members and guests gathered. Custodians of forty four Studebaker cars and trucks signed in and were evaluated in "fun judging" categories by members who judged and awarded trophies of their own making. In total twenty two such awards were fashioned and given to those deserving. Space here doesn't permit descriptions of all of them but suffice to say, there were some very creative examples. Lou Fencl earned the Collins family sponsored long distance award for driving his 1956 Tomato Red 1956 Transtar 1/2T pick truck 156 miles from Pima, Arizona. "Best Truck" category was earned by John Verrill of Prescott for the Hunter Green 1955 E12 C Cab 3/4T dually pick up serving as a U.S. Forestry Service vehicle before John commenced restoration two decades ago. Richard Domois awarded the trophy made from a 1938 Studebaker Fast Transport 1/24th scale model.

The Arizona Avanti Owners Association displayed six examples from a stock 1963 Avanti to a Ford V8 powered 2006 Avanti, one of the last iterations assembled in Cancun, Mexico. Dale Sexton's amazing serial number one AVX also appeared. The organization chose March Madness to hold an annual membership meeting.

Claudia Robinette and Chris Collins managed the traditional can raffle fund raiser where forty three attractive gifts were displayed including models, hand crafted items, framed prints and a bicycle. The raffle garnered \$339.00 for the treasury. Thank you to all who donated items and bought tickets.

Ed Smith, Ted Widhalm and Linda Smith managed the hotly contested Studebaker valve cover races throughout the day. Mike Borens earned first place, Chloe Eastburn took second place, Aubrey Eastburn got third place and Patrick Eastburn and Domenic Willis received participation and hard luck awards, respectively. Thank you to each for your hard work and dedication.

A very special thank you to Rachel and Chris Eastburn of Premier Irrigation for affording March Madness shelter in the form of two commercial canopies which really came in handy when the mid day light rain commenced. Can raffle and awards tables were quickly moved to shelter and were not dampened.

Grand Canyon State Chapter president Michell Eastburn opened the membership meeting about one o'clock welcoming the assembled multitudes and thanked all those who helped her put this March Madness together, all those who brought Studebakers to show and those who did not and our special guests from the Southern Arizona Chapter. She outlined our April Member Appreciation gathering at Arlene and Ken West's estate in Desert Hills, Sunday, April 14th. Michell and Peggy Eastburn will prepare the entrée and pot luck sides and desserts provided by the members will round out the fare. MAY 11 LIBERTY WILDLIFE

An outing to Liberty Wildlife in Phoenix is planned for Saturday, May 11th. If you have not visited this facility in the past here is information describing what it is:

Liberty Wildlife is a non-profit rescue, rehabilitation, education and sustainability organization located just south of Sky Harbor Airport. Tucked inside Phoenix city lines, we have an amazing backdrop along the Rio Salado. Tour through our sustainable building and get a glimpse of how our hospital treats the sick, injured and orphaned wildlife that arrive daily. Also walk through our education trail where you will see non-releasable birds of prey, including native hawks, owls and even bald and golden eagles. Each day that we are open to the public there is a presentation in our amphitheater at 11:15. You'll get an up close experience with some of the wildlife that we care for.

The facility is located at 2600 E. Elwood St., Phoenix. Admission is \$6 for adults; \$5 for seniors 65+ and veterans; Children K-12 \$4; under 4 free. Plan to arrive at the facility around 10 am when it opens. Live eagle feeding happens at 10:40 am followed by the live bird of prey presentation at 11:15 am.

After the tour of the facility we'll caravan to a local restaurant TBA for lunch and a chapter meeting.

Now, it gets exciting. You will remain on paved roads at all times. If you find yourself on a dirt road, you're lost. Continue east on Delores until you see 2 stucco posts, one with a roadrunner on top and the other a coyote. Turn right (south) on the paved, narrow road just before those stucco posts. Looks like a driveway to the house on the corner, but it's not. It's 18th Street and you'll follow it south through a dip and around the corner to the 3rd house. The American Flag will be flying at the gate. Just drive in and we will get you parked either in the front yard or back yard. There's lots of room to spread out.

ARIZONA EMISSIONS TEST EXEMPTION ADOPTED



SEMA-supported legislation (H.B. 2357) that was signed into law in 2005 to exempt qualified collectible vehicles 15 years old and older from the state's mandatory emissions inspection and maintenance program was finally adopted by the state via the regulatory process and will go into effect on June 1.

In order to qualify, a vehicle must be either 15 model years old or older or be of a unique or rare de-

sign, of limited production, and an object of curiosity. In addition, vehicles must be maintained primarily for use in car club activities, exhibitions, parades or other functions of public interest, or for a private collection, and is used only infrequently. Additionally, the vehicle must have collectible or classic automobile insurance coverage that restricts the vehicle's mileage or use, or both, and requires the owner to have another vehicle for personal use.

The current exemptions for pre-1967 vehicles also remain in effect.

The Three Rs And It Ain't Reading, Writing and Arithmetic

By Dan Kuhl

Back in the early 20th Century there were three automobile royalties manufactured that stole the stage in prestige and quality; they were cars that most driving citizens in America aspired to own but, more often than not, settled for Henry's Model T Ford. These autos of luxury were known collectively as the Three Ps, Packard, Peerless, and Pierce Arrow. Today the Three Ps are all considered classic cars by auto hobbyists and demand high prices by collectors.

It is interesting to note that two of these marques had an association with Studebaker. In both cases, neither Pierce Arrow in the '30s nor Packard in the '50s benefited from the relationship, both went out of business during financial downturns in America's economy.

The Three Rs are best known as reading, writing, and arithmetic, the three skills of literacy. But in this narrative, the Three Rs will be known as the Roosevelt, Rickenbacker and

Rockne automobiles. They are rare and never seen by most hobbyists. They are very unique automobiles as are their namesakes - Theodore Roosevelt, Eddie Rickenbacker, and Knute Rockne, the first a President of the United States, the second a WWI ace pilot and Indy 500 race-car driver and the third a University of Notre Dame football coach.

The Roosevelt was manufactured by the Marmon Motor Car Company of Indianapolis, Indiana from 1929-30. It had the first straight eight engine in the low priced field and conveniently located the headlight switch, starter but-

ton, and horn all in the center of the steering wheel. A Roosevelt can be seen on display at the Watson Lake swap meet held in Prescott each August.

The Rickenbacker was manufactured by the Rickenbacker Motor Company of Detroit from 1922 to 1927. The car sported a "Hat in a Ring" at the top of the radiator shell, which was the logo for Rickenbacker's 94th Squadron in WWI. The Ricken-

backer was the first production car to use modern four wheel brakes. I have only seen one of these in a small auto museum in South Dakota.

The Rockne was manufactured by the Studebaker Corporation of South Bend, Indiana from 1932-33. Knute Rockne, a very successful football coach at Notre Dame, located just down the road from the Studebaker factory, was approached by corporate management to fill a sales manager position. He agreed, but was unable to fulfill his

obligations when he was killed in a air plane crash in 1931. Knute Rockne died before he could see the car named after him. The engine in my '59 Studebaker pickup was developed for use in the Rockne. Named the Commander Six, it was in use for 28 years.




