1931 STUDEBAKER INDY CAR

n the last issue of the newsletter, there was an announcement about the potential purchase by the Stude-

baker National Museum of a 1931 Studebaker Indy race car. The car was being offered at the Gooding Auction on August 17th and the museum Board of Trustees committed a significant



amount of funds toward the possibility of acquiring the car, which would be an important addition to the Museum. Loose or Stiff Steering?

ver have loose or stiff steering on your 1951 or newer Studebaker? This can be caused by a worn or frozen bearing or bushing in the bell crank assembly. If it's worn, then blame high mileage, but if it's frozen, then a lack of lubrication is the cause. O.K., now what to do? Originally there was one bearing or bushing at the top and also one at the bottom. You may have two bearing or bushings on the top and one on the bottom. These should be replaced as needed. Keep them lubricated for a lot more miles of good steering.

New bushing and bearing kits, as well as new pins, are available from Stude-baker vendors. An example of a bearing kit is shown on the right.

As many of you may already know I am a member of other car clubs including the Buick and De Soto clubs. A friend from the Buick club recently traveled Route 66 in his 1949 Buick Super. His travels were featured in multiple issues of *The Buick Bugle*, the Buick Club's national magazine. Also, other folks who I do not personally know, described their Route 66 adventure in *DeSoto Adventures*, the DeSoto Club's national magazine. After reading their stories I knew it was time to make a move.


On June 19th, with the articles in hand and a copy of *EZ 66* (see ref. below), my wife Corlean, our two dogs, Pabst and Schlitz, and I embarked in our Nissan pickup on our quest to experience the historical treasures of Route 66. On the way to the eastern terminus in Chicago we stopped in Ottawa, a small town just outside of Chicago where the Radium Girls painted clock faces with radioactive radium. It contaminated their bodies when they placed the paint brush tip in their mouths to make a fine point. Many suffered horrible deaths and helped lay the foundation for our country's labor safety laws.

On Sunday we headed for Chicago, hoping to avoid some of the big city traffic. Should you decide to travel Route 66, look for the starting point (sign) on Adams (one-way westbound) and Michigan. Back-in-the-day it was Jackson Street which is now one-way east.

Because we had the dogs and a limited amount of time, we decided to visit many of the highlighted stops and only drive the actual Route 66 road when it was part of our chosen visits. Even with this limited scope we had plenty to do and see, and even had time to drive all of Route 66 in Kansas - all 13 miles of it.

So what about the Studebakers? The first Studebaker, a 1962 GT Hawk was on display in the National Route 66 Museum in Elk City, Okla. The second, a M Series truck was spotted resting in an refurbished service station/restaurant, "U-DROP-INN" in Shamrock, Tex. I am sure there were others that we missed along the way. A special treat was the *EZ 66* author who is a Studebaker guy. He was a previous member of SDC for 10 years who owned a Hawk and had a Hawk grille sitting on the floor in his Chandler, Okla. shop when we stopped for a visit. He was very friendly, signing autographs and posing for photographs. He is currently looking for a 1958 Packard hardtop or wagon.





Our plans to complete Route 66 include the Northern Arizona Fun Run with Ed and Ken in 2020 followed by a drive to the Santa Monica Pier soon after. There is much to do and see on the southern California Mother Road, including the site of the first McDonald's Restaurant.


