

Update from ADOT:

Selling a car? Protect yourself and complete a 'sold notice'. It's a free service and can be done at AZMVDNow.gov

Thinking of selling or trading in your car? After agreeing to a price, one of the most important things a seller can do is complete a "sold notice" with the Arizona Department of Transportation Motor Vehicle Division.

Wait. What's a "sold notice" and why is it important?

A "sold notice" ensures that MVD and law enforcement have a record of the vehicle's current owner. This can protect the seller from liability if the car is involved in a crash or crime, is ticketed, or becomes abandoned, which carries a hefty fee. There is no cost to complete a "sold notice" and it can be done online at <u>AZMVDNow.gov</u> (link is external).

Submitting a "sold notice" is easy. Simply, log-in to your account at AZMVDNow.gov and:

Click on "submit a sold notice"

- Select the vehicle you've sold
- Enter the buyer's information
- Enter the date the vehicle was sold

Additional steps to follow when selling or trading in a car include removing the license plate and transferring the title to the buyer.

TECHNICAL INFORMATION

Home made tools

have been cleaning up a number of cylinder heads and blocks lately. You know that caked on crud you see in the cooling passages inside the head or block (mostly rust) and you can't quite figure out how to get to it. Well, I might have just the tool for that, and it's home made.

I use wire cable and turn it into a flexible wire

brush. There are only 2 parts to making this tool, wire cable and copper tubing, and a crimping tool; I use a coax cable crimper. The key is matching wire and tubing so the wire just fits inside the tubing. Then any diameter wire can be used to make this tool to fit the job at hand. I have made them as big as 3/8" wire cable.



My favorite is 3/16" wire and 1/4" copper tube. Cut wire to desired length (12" to 18" works for me). Cut three pieces of tubing at 6", 1" and 1/2". Slide

the 6" piece on first, this is the handle. At one end of the cable, take the 1" piece and crimp this to the cable, this end is captured in the drill chuck and prevents the cable from unraveling during use. At the other end, slip the 1/2" piece about 1" to 1-1/2" up from the end, crimp this to the cable. Using two pair of pliers, unravel and bend back the cable strands till it resembles a wire brush. Chuck it up in your hand drill and you're ready to go, BUT! YOU MUST RUN YOUR DRILL IN REVERSE. This is because most cable is assembled in a right hand lay. If the brush end of the cable gets wedged and stops turning the drill will keep turning the cable and open up the lay and render your new tool useless.

He worked his way up from salesman to sales manager, and then to district manager. After a stint in the military, he opened his own chain of Studebaker dealerships in the Los Angeles area that turned a healthy two million dollar profit selling 16,000 Studebakers.

His sales prowess did not go unnoticed. Albert Erskine, President of Studebaker in the 20s, invited this California sales guru to come to South Bend to be VP of corporate sales. His tenure did not last long however; he soon moved up the ladder to president with the passing of President Erskine in 1933.

This renowned president ran the Studebaker Corporation from 1935 until 1948 when Harry S. Truman tapped him to help in the recovery of Europe following WWII. In 1953 he returned to Studebaker to be the chairman of the corporation.



If you know your Studebaker history you have guessed this person is Paul G. Hoffman. He is important to this story because he had a son, Lathrop Hoffman, who took over his father's LA dealership when his father was back in South Bend trying to breath life back into the ailing Studebaker Corporation.

Working as the business manger at the Lathrop's dealership was Charles Janis. Charles was the father of Bob Janis who is a fellow member of the Auto Restoration Club here in Sun City West. Knowing of my fondness for Studebakers, Bob presented me with one of the three inch medallions issued in 1952 by Studebaker in celebration of their 100th Anniversary. The medallion is from the Lathrop



dealership. Talk about generosity; thank you Bob. Another example of why it's a small world when it comes to Studebakers.
