The ACI website is not at all user friendly but I did locate a friendly person that is very willing to assist someone wanting an Arizona novelty plate! The plate in the photo depicts what you will get with your lettering in the center. The number of letters will determine the size of the letters. The ARIZONA at the top and GRAND CANYON STATE at the bottom come on all the plates. Call Tana to discuss your interest or send her an email. The cost is VERY reasonable at about \$14 / plate plus shipping and tax. The plates are REAL copper with stamped letters like a license plate should be!

Spruce up your Studebaker for a nominal cost and have fun naming her or him.



TECHNICAL INFORMATION About Those Crooked Hoods

hose bent hood corners on 1953-'54 C & Ks, 1953-'60 Sedans and 1960-'64 Champs are (often) due to the hood hinges being out of adjustment.

When the hinges are properly adjusted, the rear of the hood will lift and move forward when the hood is opened. When out of adjustment, the rear of the hood will not lift properly, resulting in the corners of the hood hitting the tops of the fenders when closing. Each hinge has 3 bolts that attach it to the body. The hinges have slotted holes for adjustment. There is a spring pulling straight down from the back of the hood that helps pull the rear of the hood down when closed. If, over time, the hinge to body bolts loosen, the rear springs tend to rotate the tops of the hinges rearward. The hinges then go "over-center" and don't want to move freely.

The shop manual is of little help, it says loosen the bolts and adjust as required! A good starting point is to loosen the bolts, grab the rear of the hood and pull forward and up. This will free up the hinge movement, and minor adjustments can be made for the final fit. If the back of the hood does not pull down properly, chances are the pull down springs (284505P) are missing. Also, C & K bodies and 1953-'58 Sedans use a spring (308907P) to help pull the hood forward.

Another factor is the attachment of the hood to the hinge links. There should be a flat washer between the hood bracket and the hinge link. The castellated nut should not be tight but should allow for movement. The cotter pins must be installed. I have seen these nuts tighten if not fixed in place with a cotter pin. By correcting these items, you can change from a hood that is reluctant to open, that catches the cowl with a "pop", and then jams the hood corners into the front fenders, to one that smoothly opens and closes.

WHEEL VALVE STEMS

A fter experiencing several wheel valve stem failures at high speed recently on different vehicles it appears the valve stems need periodic inspection or replacement even if the tires aren't too old. Some valve stem quality may be questionable.

If you have full wheel covers you will need to remove them and check for any cracking around the base of the valve stem. Also check to see if the wheel cover has moved on the wheel putting the valve stem in a bind.

One solution is to install the metal valve stems which are held in place with a retaining nut. These are available at auto supply stores.

This will also help with wheel covers that rotate on the wheel.

THE ARIZONA CONNECTION

(Part I)

This article is the first part of a two part series describing the history of supercharging and Studebakers like the Whistler.

One hundred years before the Studebaker Drivers Club was formed, Arizona was recognized as a territory; that was 10 years after the Studebaker Wagon business opened in South Bend. Many of Arizona's new settlers came in Studebaker wagons and buggies. When Arizona became a state on Valentine's Day, 1912, these conveyances were still the main means of travel as illustrated in the 1915 photo of a Kingman dealership.

By 1926 the automobile was becoming a common occurrence in Arizona. In that year 13 of the the State's 14 county sheriffs drove Studebaker Big Six Duplex Phaetons to chase down Arizona outlaws. An example of one is on display at the Arizona Historical Society in Tucson. This car was driven by Walter Bailey who was the sheriff in Pima County.

Also, in 1926 construction on Route 66 began. Back-in-the-day Studebakers could be seen driving across Arizona, taking the occupants to a new life in California. Today, some of our club members travel to Rte 66 to participate in the Mother Road's annual spring rally. At the west end of Rte 66 in Arizona is Oatman, a mining ghost town that attracts many tourists. In Oatman is a Studebaker fire truck that remains from the glory days of gold mining.

In Jerome there is some great Studebaker history, as well. There is the H.E. Dicus dealership building and the Gold King Mine with its many antique Studebakers from Don Robertson's collection.

Following WWII Studebaker celebrated its 100th anniversary. At the same time Robert Paxton McCulloch was perfecting his supercharger technology, and by 1957 Studebaker

was using his supercharger to boost sales as well the power from their small block engines.

In the 1960s with the company's legacy turning to a performance image, Tanner Motors in Phoenix, became synonymous with high performance Studebakers. Spearheading Tanner's image was the drag car, the Whistler. At this same time Leeper Studebaker in Yuma had purchased a R3 Avanti for a grocery getter that turned out to be one of only nine sold. Also, at this time Chuck Naugle was settling in Vail, Arizona to begin his vast collection of Studebaker vehicles that included the Whistler and the Phoenix police cruiser recently restored by the Eastburns.


While Paxton was making a name for itself under the tutelage of Andy Granatelli, Robert McCulloch was expand-

ing into other interests, including a move to Lake Havasu City. There he worked on his outboard boat motor and promoted real estate development with addition of the relocated London Bridge. Near the bridge is a historical museum that has a great display of McCulloch contributions to Lake Havasu and technology. In 1974, when Studebaker and Paxton went separate ways, the Paxton supercharger was no longer manufactured. But here in Phoenix in that same year, the Hall of Flame opened with the world's largest collection of firefighting equipment, including Studebakers!

Today the Studebaker Drivers Club maintains a presence around the world. Here in Arizona we have two great Club chapters that keep Studebakers on the road and in the eye of the public. And, we have the Eastburns, Krouliks and last, but not least, Russ and Sharon Ware of StudebakerParts.com to provide the parts that we so desperately need to maintain our Studebakers. But, we should never forget Chuck Naugle and his generation who freely provided their historical Studebaker knowledge and expertise.




