TECHNICAL INFORMATION

BUZZING OR CLICKING FROM TRANSMISSION

have heard many people ask about the buzzing or clicking noise* from under their Studebakers equipped with automatic transmission - sometimes in park, sometimes in reverse and sometimes in neutral.

Well, the noise is a spool valve in the pressure regulator chattering. It's trying to tell you that there is something wrong with the adjustment of the throttle pressure control rod from the transmission to the gas pedal linkage. This rod is adjustable and as the transmission mounts get old and sag, the transmission also moves down. This tends to shorten up on the adjustable rod, so you have two choices:

One, is to replace the sagging mounts and hope the rod was never adjusted to compensate for a sagging transmission. If had been adjusted, adjust the rod several turns in on the clevis to shorten it and hope the transmission now works as it should. Two, is to adjust the rod several turns out on the clevis to lengthen it and see if the noise goes away.

*The noise sounds like two gears that are just barely hitting and skipping over each other, or a ratcheting type noise.

THE ARIZONA CONNECTION

THE CENTRIFUGAL SUPERCHARGER A BRIEF HISTORY (Part II)

Supercharging has been around for well over a 100 years. There are three basic types: root, twin screw and centrifugal. This article will focus on the history of centrifugal supercharging in American automotive history. But, before the historical review begins, we need to ask why use a super charger in the first place? It adds increased horsepower to what would be a normal engine and does not suffer the lag-time that occurs with turbochargers (rpm must be increased to get exhaust gases flowing thru the turbo). In another words, a centrifugal supercharger is not as rpm dependent as a turbo. They are also easier to install and maintain, and cheaper to repair than a turbocharger. The biggest disadvantage to a supercharger of this type is low boost pressure at the bottom of the rpm scale. Root and twin-screw on the other hand provide low end performance. Here are some numbers to remember when considering a centrifugal supercharger. It will consume 20% of an engine's total power, but can generate as much as 46% additional power. Turbocharging may work better on a small engine with the mentioned loss in power. Lastly, your engine must be in good mechanical condition before the addition of a supercharger.


Supercharger development began in the late 1800s. However, the first use on a car was on a race car in 1908 that supposedly went 100 mph. The first factory production car was by Mercedes in 1921. After buying the Dusenburg Company in 1925, E.L. Cord introduced the supercharged Model SJ in 1928. Noteworthy for the Cord produced cars are the exhaust pipes that stick out through the sides of the hood that permitted space for the supercharger. The '30s are earmarked by the Graham Paige, a manufacturer that sold more cars with superchargers than any other manufacturer and the introduction of Robert Paxton McCulloch's first supercharger for use on the Ford flathead V8.

There are a couple of points I would like to bring to light at this point. The first is the superchargers on these early cars were placed between the engine and the carburetor(s), compressing the gas/air mixture. The second, with onset of WWII, the importance of the supercharger in airplane performance. Two planes worth noting are the British Spit-

fire and the iconic P-38 Lightening, both of which could fly very fast and at high altitudes (Spitfire 47.000 ft.).

Following the War, in 1946 McCulloch moved from its initial factory location in Milwaukee, Wis. (home of Brooks Stevens) to Los Angeles where it became the mainstay in aftermarket supercharging in the strong southern California hotrod marketplace. It was a bolt-on, belt driven unit that could be used for any automotive application. The McCulloch Model VS57 was developed, the same supercharger used on the 1957 Studebaker Golden Hawk and last Packard automobiles. In 1953 the VS57 was presented to the public at a huge press release (See photo). In 1954 Kaiser grabbed it to improve shrinking sales and it was planned for use on Packard's concept car, the Panther. In 1955 the VS57 was offered as a dealer add on option for the Studebaker Speedster in Los Angeles. A noteworthy appointment at McCulloch during this time was Sherwood Egbert as vice president. By the end of its run, there were 46,000 VS57 superchargers sold.

In 1957 the Granatelli brothers moved from Chicago to Los Angeles. With their speed-shop experience they were very interested in the McCulloch supercharger. In 1958 they were able to buy Paxton Products from McCulloch and develop a new generation of supercharger, the SN60 (Short Nose) that debuted in 1959. After numerous racing successes the Grana-

tellis and Paxton were purchased by Studebaker. Thereafter, Sherwood Egbert became president of Studebaker. About this time Andy split from his brothers and became President of STP, also owned by Studebaker. An improved Paxton SN62 and STP gave Studebaker a boost in the performance community, but it was too little too late as most buyers were looking for big block power.

In 1974 Paxton split from Studebaker and quit manufacturing the SN62, probably due to new emission standards. Interest in the supercharger never waned. In 1979 manufacture began again making new variants of the older generations. Today a Paxton Supercharger is still available through Vortex Engineering located in Oxnard, Calif.

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


