LEGISLATIVE HOBBY NEWS: ARIZONA SIGNS INTO LAW BILL TO PROTECT RESTORERS FROM PROSECUTION - News from SEMA ACTION NETWORK

Victory in Arizona! Governor Doug Ducey signed into law SAN-supported legislation (H.B. 2480) to allow full restoration of pre-1981 vehicles, including temporary removal of the vehicle identification number (VIN) when necessary. Existing law will change to allow for the removal and reinstallation of a VIN if the vehicle was manufactured before 1981 and if the removal and reinstallation is reasonably necessary for repair or restoration. The new law allows enthusiasts to protect their right to thoroughly restore a vehicle into an award-winning condition without fear of being prosecuted for tampering with a VIN.

Prior to the new law, enthusiasts who intentionally removed or altered a VIN, regardless of reason or vehicle model year, were guilty of a felony. Additionally, the new law recognizes that the collection and restoration of historic and classic cars is an important part of preserving the technological achievements and cultural heritage of the United States. It will go into effect July 22nd.

A Rare Studebaker Profile 1963 Studebaker Zip Van

S tudebaker won a 1963 contract to produce 3,391 examples of the Zip Van which was very popular, so an additional 847 orders were placed and the total rose to 4,238. Studebaker provided the engineering and chassis, while the unitized body was fabricated by Met-Pro, Inc. of Lansdale, Penn. Met-Pro established the Bede Manufacturing Company to handle the Zip Van project. Studebaker named them after something new called the ZIP Code (Zone Improvement Plan) that the Postal Service came out with. The Zip Vans featured a sliding door for the driver, no door on the left side, and all examples were right-hand drive. In the back, the door opened up-and-down in similar fashion to a garage door.

Inside there were two gas pedals. One pedal was for the driver when they were sitting while the other was to be used when they were standing. Features included a heater and an adjustable seat. The gauge cluster was the one used in Stude-

baker's Transtar pickup. Powering the Zip Van was a 170 cubic-inch overhead 'Skybolt' six that offered 112 horsepower passing power through a Borg-Warner 3-speed automatic and onto a Dana 44 Twin-Traction limited-slip equipped rear axle. It had a wheelbase of 85 inches and a length of 143 inches. Zip Vans had easy viewing with large windows. The huge flat front dash was perfect for sorting trays of mail and large air panel below the windshield let air cross flow to upper rear vents that open. They had large rear bumper guards for loading docks and a safety back up buzzer.

The driver seat folds up as back rest for stand-up driving while using a lower gas pedal by sliding your right foot sideways. The front suspension, steering gear, engine, and radiator are all mounted on a cradle that can be easily be rolled out from underneath for service. The Postal Service could quickly swap in another one to keep it on the road while doing any repairs. The Studebaker Mechanicals are easily available being mostly based on the ½ ton truck using the





Studebaker Champ 6-cylinder engine, automatic transmission, rear end, steering components, and the Transtar instrument cluster.

The Zip Van paint scheme used by the U.S. Post office was red, white and blue. Rain, or Snow, nor dark of night stopped the hard -working Zip Vans and later they were repurposed as Ice Cream Trucks, Handyman Work Trucks, Shop Vans, Catering Food Trucks, mini Campers etc.

Even at Studebaker meets these are rarely seen and it will draw a crowd at any car show!

HOW ABOUT THE ZIP-VAN?

Studebaker's Postal Truck Offers Possibilities

T HE SPECIAL characteristics of suburbia, as suffered by mail carriers who must remain forever undaunted by rain, or snow, or dark of night, were recognized by Studebaker Corporation engineers in designing a new postal service truck called the Zip-Van. The South Bend automaker will build 4238 of them by June under a \$9 million government contract.

PANEL BODY is unitized but rear-wheel drive necessitates a higher floor.



Of major interest is the quickchange engine package, designed to simplify service and sharply reduce maintenance and repair costs. The complete engine and drive package, attached to a sub-frame welded to the basic unitized panel body, uses the Champ truck's 170-cu. in. 6-cyl. engine, 3-speed automatic transmission, radiator, front axle and springs, brakes

and wheels. While such a layout lends itself admirably to front-wheel-drive, Studebaker engineers decided instead to retain the more conventional reardrive arrangement.

The Zip-Van is mounted on an 85in. wheelbase, using a sit-stand panel body supplied by Met-Pro, Inc., of Lansdale, Pa., which has an overall length of 145 in. Track is 57.06 in. in front, 56.75 in. at the rear. Right-hand drive is used, just as Studebaker has supplied for years in special heavyduty cars which it has built for rural mail carriers.

Matched to the gross vehicle weight of 4350 lb., the engine is rated at 107 bhp at 4400 rpm. Torque is 150 lb.-ft. at 2000 rpm and compression ratio is 8.0:1, permitting use of regular fuel. Large staggered valves and a ram-type intake manifold with large inlet passages in the head and carburetor throat are incorporated for improved multistop operation. The camshaft has a special long ramp, low acceleration grind which reduces valve noise and permits the use of lighter weight valve springs. Drum brakes measure 11 by 2.5-in.
