

GCSC CELEBRATES 50 YEARS!

O22 marks the 50th anniversary of the Grand Canyon State Chapter, Studebaker Drivers Club (SDC). In 1972, the SDC was itself a young organization and several Arizonans were enthusiastic members. It was only a matter of time before a group of them would arrange to assemble Arizona's Studebaker fans at a state-wide gathering. One such effort was coordinated by Ike Quigley and Gene Nagle. On February 5, 1972 they sent out the following letter.

To Arizona Studebaker Enthusiasts,

Several of us in the Phoenix area have wanted for some time to have a get-together that would give us all a chance to talk over common interests and common problems. There are at least 30 of us in the Phoenix area and well over 40 in the state including both members and nonmembers of the Studebaker Drivers Club.

None of us would own and care for a so-called "orphan" car if we didn't feel that Studebakers are something special; it's just a lot easier to buy a Chevy. For over 100 years Studebaker built distinctive vehicles, and, thanks to Avanti Motor Corporation, one is still being made. It is a tradition unmatched by any of the present look-alike makes and one worthy of our interest and efforts of preservation.

Studebaker Drivers Club, for those unfamiliar, is an international organization with over 3,000 members that keeps Studebaker owners in touch with each other for swapping cars, parts and information. The Club publishes a monthly Bulletin, where members can have free want-ads, and a guarterly magazine with technical and historical information.

We have set up a luncheon meeting at the Ambers Restaurant on Grand Avenue in Glendale (5376 Grand, just west of 51st Ave.) for Saturday, March 4 at 1:30 PM. We will have a special room, and the prices are reasonable for good food (or coffee and dessert). We sure hope to see you and (and your Studebaker) there, and by all means tell any one else you know who might be interested.

Families are welcome, as are sales literature or pictures you may have. If you cannot make it, we would like to hear from you by mail or phone, since we'll plan another meet, maybe a rally, or picnic for later on. In the tradition of the driver's car, we remain,

have a background in photography, so I thought I'd share a few tips and see if other owners want to give it a try.

- 1) Shooting at "Magic Hour" is a trick of the trade. Take your car to a scenic backdrop when the sun is about to set, but still splashing light on your "set".
- 2) Find a "set" with visual interest. Fields work great, forlorn roads too, when it is safe to do so. One of my favorites are the many recreations of vintage filling stations you see around.
- 3) Don't shoot everything standing up. Crouch down and make that car look long and low!

4) Try framing the car in different ways- wide, close up, even shots of body ornaments and chrome. Take you car out tomorrow at magic hour and give it a try! These days, a camera phone is all you need.

runs on coal, but he does not know if it has a steam engine, or if it uses a gasification process.

An e-mail from a reader indicates that the truck was not steam powered. Rather, it used coal gas as fuel for the engine. Bituminous coal was roasted in a chamber, and then the gasses were extracted into the engine.


